Addition of the airline transport. pilot rating will open up some advanced instrument and radio courses not offered before under the GI Bill. Most of the other rethe GI Bill. Most of the other requirements for this new rating already have been included in other flight courses available to veterans.

Veterans will be permitted to enroll in the new course only if they have had enough flight training so they will actually qualify for the airline transport pilot rating after they have successfully completed the course.

VA does not pay for flight training unless the course leads di-

VA does not pay for flight training unless the course leads directly to a CAA rating. Like all flight training under the GI Bill, the airline transport pilot course must be handled by contract between VA and flight training schools. Because this is less than a 30-week course, VA can pay only up to \$500 of the tuition and supply cost, and the veteran must pay ply cost, and the veteran must pay the rest. VA pays subsistence allowance if the veteran is eligible. For purposes of the allowance, an hour of flying time is counted as
