Advise Veterans On Treatments

A veteran making application to the Veterans Administration for out-patient dental treatment can request that the treatment be rendered by a dentist of his own choice, according to an announcement today from the Hartford Regional Office.

If the dental treatment requested by the veteran is authorized by the VA, the veteran will be referred to the dentist he named in his application if that dentist is a participating VA fee-basis dentist, and if it would be impractical to have the veteran treated in a VA dental clinic. If, however, the dentist named by the veteran is not a fee-basis dentist, the veteran will either be called into a VA dental clinic, or referred to a VA fee-basis dentist in his own community.

Veterans are cautioned that the VA will not pay for any dental treatment which was rendered by a private dentist prior to VA approval. The VA, however, will pay a dentist for emergency dental treatment of a veteran if such treatment is reported by the dentist to the VA in Hartford within five days, and the veteran is found eligible to receive that treatment.

Bristol Blaze Loss \$10,000

Overheated Hot Air Duct Apparently Cause Of Fire Today

Bristol, Jan. 17.—(AP)—Damage estimated by Fire Chief George C. Graham at between \$7,500 and \$10,000 was caused by an early morning blaze today at the Atwood Chevrolet company at 9 Meadow street.

Stating that the fire apparently was caused by an overheated hot air duct the fire chief reported that an exact estimate of the damage was not possible until the value of a quantity of auto parts and accessories can be determined. An automobile inside the building was also considerably damaged.

The building itself in a one-story structure in front facing on a one and one-half story affair in the rear. It is located only a stone's throw from central fire headquarters which is on the opposite side of Meadow street.

Four Companies Dispatched
A box alarm was received at headquarters at 2:43 a. m. and immediately four companies were dispatched to the scene of the blaze. Chief Graham was summoned from his home and took charge. Within an hour firemen had the fire under control and a half hour after that three of the four companies returned to their houses. The fourth company remained at the scene until 7 o'clock.

Chief Graham said that the proximity of the fire to central headquarters helped a great deal in getting the blaze under control.

Manchester Nine Records Easy Win on Main Street

Spring baseball training is some ten weeks distant yet a Manchester "nine" performed on Main street yesterday with a vigor and zeal that bespoke mid-season form. The line-up was All-American too, as it included a manufacturer, three retail tradesmen, two factory workers, a financier, a real estate agent and a public utility representative.

The final score was all in their favor as they had no opposition from the Manchester storekeepers whose grounds they were invading. Hit after hit was made by the group and not a single strike-out was recorded against them as they continued their march from the Center to the High school. The reason for their victory is noteworthy—they were soliciting funds for the Manchester Polo Drive.

Their efforts netted the Polo fund \$137 from merchants contributions, plus more than 100 containers strategically placed. These it is hoped will garner scores of dimes and dollars as Manchesterites "hit the line with a dollar or a dime."

The "team" was composed of Bob Spencer, local drive captain, Harold Durginton, Carl Reimer, Stephen Frey, Robert Heck, David Hovey, William Rubnow, Elton Johnson and Leon Holmes.

General Sales Tax Supported

Private Research Organ- ization Sees Levy as Most Dependable

Hartford, Jan. 16.—(AP)—A bulletin of the Connecticut Public Expenditure council, one of a series issued by the private research organization which is exploring Connecticut's financial problems, said today that the general sales tax was "the largest and most dependable" source of revenue for states.

The council ruled out income or real estate taxes as state revenue raisers with the assertion that: "By reason of present practices as well as its fluctuating yield, the individual income tax is regarded as peculiarly suitable for Federal purposes, while real estate taxes fall most logically within the sphere of local government."

Comparing Possible Yield
By comparing the possible yield in Connecticut with the yields in five other states which have a per capita income roughly comparable to Connecticut, the council estimated that a general sales tax in this state would yield between \$27,000,000 and \$29,500,000 per year.

The 23 states now employing a sales tax, with yearly yield ranging from \$2,372,000 in Wyoming to \$125,393,000 in California, are: Alabama, Arizona, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Louisiana, Michigan, Mississippi, Missouri, New Mexico, North Carolina, North Dakota, Ohio, Oklahoma, South Dakota, Utah, Washington, West Virginia and Wyoming.

Various Ways Tax Employed
Commenting on the various ways in which these states employ the sales tax, the council's bulletin said: "States tax retail sales only. One state taxes sales of manufacturers as well as

retailers, and another taxes both wholesale and retail sales. Three states tax all sales of tangible personal property, including such things as natural resources, as well as utility sales and transportation charges. Two states tax not only sales of all tangible personal property, but also income from personal services, rent, and other income derived from business activities.

"Most states regard the tax as one on the privilege of engaging in business or selling. They, therefore, impose it as an occupation tax and levy it on gross receipts or gross sales. If levied on gross sales, payment of the tax in full on installment sales must be made at the time of sale. Seven states make such payment mandatory, while five states extend payment on credit sales.

"There is some variation in the rates employed by various states, but a 3 per cent rate is the most widely used."

Bombers Seeking Missing Trawler

Boston, Jan. 17.—(AP)—Eight Navy and Coast Guard bombers took off into clear skies today—the first "fliable" weather in three days—to search for the Boston trawler Belle missing with a crew of 17.

Grim hope that the new 113-foot steel fishing vessel had survived the stormy sea of the past week was held by water front veterans though no word has been heard since she sent a distress call eight days ago.

Capt. Peter Linehan reported then the Belle, disabled by engine trouble, was wallowing in heavy seas and icing.

Three of the planes joining in the search for Quonset, R. I., Naval air station were radar-equipped. Airmen said, however, that visibility was so good that the naked eye would be sufficient to spot the Belle.

Favors Abolishing Executive Council

Boston, Jan. 17.—(AP)—The Republican front of the Massachusetts Senate favors abolition of the Executive council and elimination of the initiative petition.

Senator Donald L. Nicholson of Wareham told the Suffolk County Republican club last night that placing complete responsibility for appointments on governors probably would "lead to better appointments."

This would eliminate "bargaining" with councillors who rule on all appointments, he said.

The initiative petition, Nicholson contended, had been used largely by "some minority group that wants something special done for it."

Plan for 'Unification' Not Merger Proposal

Army and Navy Would Remain Separate; Independent Air Force Would Be Established

By James Marlow

Washington, Jan. 17 — (AP) — President Truman's plan for "unification" of the armed forces is not a plan to merge them and make them one.

The Army and Navy would remain separate, which is what the Navy wanted. The plan would do this:

1. Set up an independent land Air Force. It's now part of the Army.

2. Help the Army, Navy and Air Force work together.

3. Maybe—this isn't clear in the plan—help the government save money in buying supplies for the Army, Navy and Air Force.

Before the plan becomes a fact, Congress must pass a law approving it or changing it.

That will take time and probably there'll be a lot of wrangling in the Capitol before such a law is passed, if it's passed.

This is how the president's plan would help the Army, Navy and Air Force work together:

The big boss over the three branches of the service would be a secretary of national defense.

It would be his job to make the Army, Navy and Air Force work as a team.

Each Would Have Own Boss

But—under him—the Army, Navy and Air Force each would have its own boss, called the secretary of the Army, secretary of the Navy, and secretary of the Air Force.

Those three secretaries—after telling the big boss secretary what they were up to—could carry their ideas to the president.

So if anyone of the three—say the secretary of the Navy—thought his outfit was getting an unfair deal, he could run to the president.

But all three branches of the service would be able to sit down together and work out their problems for the good of the country.

Would Set Up War Council

They'd do it by setting up a War Council with these members:

1. The secretary of national defense as chairman.

2. The secretaries of the Army, Navy and Air Force.

3. The three military commanders of the Army, Navy and Air Force.

This war council would lay down

the general policies for all three branches of the service to follow.

But in this war council the secretary of national defense would make the decisions. In short, he'd have final say-so.

Also working right under the secretary of national defense would be the joint chiefs of staff. Which means:

1. The military head of the Army, military head of the Navy, and military head of the Air Force.

2. Chief of staff to the president of the United States. (Mr. Truman's chief of staff is Admiral William D. Leahy.)

It would be the job of the joint chiefs of staff to do the planning for use of the armed forces, the strategy.

The boss of the joint chiefs of staff would be—as noted—the secretary of national defense.

Once the joint chiefs of staff had decided what to do, the job of doing it would fall upon a group called a "full-time joint staff."

This staff would consist of about 100 officers, one-third of them from the Army, one-third from the Navy, one-third from the Air Force.

Although the Air Force would be separated from the Army, the Army could keep some few necessary planes of its own.

The present heads of the Army and Navy—the secretary of war and the secretary of the Navy—are members of the president's cabinet.

Under the president's plan, would the secretary of national defense and the secretaries of Army, Navy and Air Force be cabinet members?

Congress would decide that when—and if—it decides to make the plan law.

Seeks Precise Data on Tube

'Split-Anode Magnetron' Developed to 'Jam' Enemy Radar
 New Haven, Jan. 17.—(AP)—Yale announced today that one of its scientists, heading a project which the U. S. Navy Office of Research asked the university to undertake, was seeking more precise information about a vacuum tube which was developed during the war as a defense against enemy radar.
 The tube, called a "split-anode magnetron," provides a source of high frequency energy, and was developed originally by the Radio Research Laboratory of Cambridge, Mass., for use in "jamming" enemy radar systems, the Yale announcement said.
Aim of Project
 What the Yale project under the direction of Herbert J. Reich, professor of electrical engineering, seeks to do is determine more precisely the operating characteristics of magnetron tubes and improve their performance in practical circuits.
 Yale said it was expected that the research would add to the understanding of other magnetron tubes used in radar equipment and of other vacuum tubes utilized in the generation of higher frequency radio waves.
 The "split-anode magnetron," Yale said, disseminates microwaves of frequencies ranging from 100 to 1,000 megacycles compared with the lower frequencies of 450 to 1,500 kilocycles in the ordinary radio broadcast band.

State Police Head Hickey Sends Message to Polio Chairman

State Police Commissioner Edward J. Hickey, chairman of the state-wide March of Dimes Drive, in a message yesterday to W. Robert Spencer, local chairman, pointed out that the campaign right at the outset is faced with the task of overcoming a deficit of more than \$100,000. In past years, money has been raised that was for the March of Dimes in Connecticut, he said, but this year the "large outdoor picture chains have instructed local managers of their divisions to make collections for the 1947 drive."

"That means our campaign revenue in Connecticut will be less than last year's and we have no other means of offsetting this loss. Fortunately, the infantile paralysis campaign is not dependent on large gifts or substantial donations. It is a campaign of small gifts and from a great number of people. It is a campaign that we can win by asking the people to give us a dime, let us make it a quarter, instead of a dollar, let us give it with two."

This money is spent in a great many ways to help the polio patient. It pays for doctors and nurses. It pays for long and costly treatments while the patient is in the hospital. It pays for the patient to leave the hospital if payment for the monthly clinics where medical staffs carefully check the progress of recovery. It pays for braces and shoes and crutches, and wheel chairs. It does everything that is humanly possible. First of all to check the case, then to prevent any trace of residual paralysis. The fact is that the money will do as it has done in the past—bit by bit with its dollars and dimes until your \$1,000 gift is reached and passed."

Rent Increase Seen Possible

Higher Tax Rate in Hartford Could Be Passed Along

Hartford, Jan. 17.—The tax rate increase from 32 mills to 40 mills predicted by Mayor N. Allen, could result in a maximum rent increase for Hartford tenants of 9 per cent under OPA controls according to Arva Rent Director James R. Sullivan.
