Rotary Club Gathers Food For the Needy Peoples Across the Atlantic

Rotarians are reminded there will be a collection of food at this evening's meeting for shipment to Europe. For the past three months the local club has been collecting from the members, canned and packaged goods as one of its international service projects. The food collected which consists of canned meats, fruits and milk, dried fruits, dessert powders, candies and other items such as soap and shortening, are shipped once a month to one of several Rotary clubs in devastated sections of Europe. Usually the food goes to Rotary clubs which have just recently re-established contact with the Rotary International office in Chicago and have suspended meetings during the war.
