A figure far beyond the highest anticipations of recovery by the employees, Foster said, expressing belief that in many cases the courts will find the amount claimed "entirely unreasonable."

War department officials said yesterday that Army cost-plus contracts might entail a loss up to \$300,000,000 if back pay claims prove successful.

Foster said it was "staggering" to conceive of the task which would be required to audit and reviewing payroll records and supporting data for thousands of employees for several years, and determining where the employees worked each pay period in relation to expense, time clocks, etc., is staggering in conception," he said.

Expense might equal claims. The expense in some cases might be as much as the amount of the claim, Foster added.

Treasury General Joseph O'Connell told reporters that employees having to pay post-war pay would be without tax on these wages at the time they pay them.

Furthermore, he said, employees receiving such payments generally will count them income for the year in which they are actually received rather than as prior year earnings.

"This, employees also will get a better break on tax liability since individual income taxes were lowered beginning with 1946, with the amount of the reduction varying according to income and circumstances."

Secretary Snyder's ruling was made in response to a request by company which was not identified.

Senators today asked Secretary of State George Marshall to give his views on the present conditions, in non-political conditions. Fulbright said he thought the statement should "remove a lot of nervousness on the part of Republicans."

"They want to cooperate and help the country, but they do not want to build up a formidable presidential opponent," Fulbright asserted.

"Reserves Powerful Competitor" Secretary Taylor (D-Iowa), declared that Marshall's pronouncement "certainly does not detract from Truman's chances" for re-nomination in 1948. "It removes a powerful competitor."

While Washington officials and Republicans generally appear as interested as members of the Foreign Relations committee, they are not as wide ranging as the Foreign Relations committee. Marshall himself has stated that he intends to do something about it, but he has himself thought the nature of his new program during the months of February, March and April in preparation for the organizing of the local group, Father Joseph Murphy, Michael Benevento, Maurice Sheridan and the team captain as a committee to prepare a program for the February meeting. The Manchester Memorial Hospital

The Cross Section Of Public Opinion Regarding The Current Issue Between The Blue Cross And The Hospital As Brought Out In The Columns Of This Paper And Elsewhere In Public Discussion Is A Healthy And Stimulating Sign Of Public Interest.

The Blue Cross Contract with its members requires Blue Cross to furnish certain specified services. In January, 1946, Blue Cross encountered difficulties.

The Insurance Commissioner in a letter to Blue Cross dated January 4, 1946, stated: "The results as shown in your November, 1945, report convinced me that this condition can no longer continue, and in my opinion the trend is sufficiently established to require immediate correction. . . . It is essential to an immediate adjustment of the rate and benefit. . . . Please let me impress upon you the necessity for immediate action."

Thereafter the Blue Cross asked the hospital to assist it by assuming the loss resulting from the difference between the Blue Cross payments and the hospital's regular charges.

The hospital agreed to this on a temporary basis. After a fair trial the hospital decided that it could not continue these losses.

As an example the loss in handling the first 100 Blue Cross cases was \$1,645.25.

The Trustees of the Manchester Memorial Hospital would like to take up the Blue Cross contract again when it can afford to do so, but until losses due to the lack of ceilings on the "Special Services" furnished in the contract are stopped or until payments by Blue Cross will cover these costs in full.

WE CAN ASSURE ALL BLUE CROSS MEMBERS THAT THE SEPTEMBER 1st CONTRACT WITH THEM WILL REMAIN IN EFFECT UNTIL APRIL 1, WITH FULL BENEFITS.

If the Blue Cross contract is terminated on April 1, Blue Cross members can still receive benefits if they are hospitalized in Manchester. Their benefits will average about \$7.50 per day instead of about \$8.60 per day paid to the hospital under the present contract and any cost over this amount will be assumed by the patients.
