He is co-sponsor of the Bill-Taft-Smith bill. The committee opened its hearing with 13 bills before it. McCarthy's is No. 14.

The "closed shop" means every employee must belong to a particular union in order to work in a plant with a closed shop contract. Under the "union shop" a non-union man can be hired but he must join the union within a certain time.

Under "maintenance of membership," no one is compelled to join a union, but those who are members must remain in it.

In "preferential hiring," union men get first call for job vacancies.

McCarthy's bill says nothing about preferential hiring. It would allow maintenance of membership contracts at the start of each new contract to be mandatory to permit union men to resign if they wish without losing their jobs.

Also, the union expelled a man for anything but failure to pay dues, he could continue working at the plant. This would also be true in the union shop bill, closed shop under McCarthy's bill.

Hospital and Blue Cross

One result of the meeting of trustees of Manchester Memorial Hospital on the Blue Cross action Tuesday night can be applied. That is their statement that "Manchester Hospital is just as willing and anxious to effect an settlement and work out a solution as any one else... All of us want to preserve the hospital as such a statement is to be welcomed, both because it strikes the friendly and constructive note which should be present on both sides of this controversy between two non-profit organizations, and because it seems to leave the door at least ajar for that final compromise which will satisfy both institutions and which will leave a door open for adjustment and compromise toward the opposite of constructive policy, and a reduction of ill will, rather than good will toward the Blue Cross. And it will be entirely out of place, for the Blue Cross, properly functioning, has been and can be again the greatest friend the trustees of Manchester Memorial Hospital have in Connecticut. If it should be injured by the present controversy, that would be a sorry day from many angles, including that of the hospital and the general public, and if the cancellation of Manchester Memorial Hospital's membership in the Blue Cross through on April 1, that will be no cause for rejoicing on the part of any sincere citizen.

If there have been, in the present situation, some individual sentiments which have been sentiments of animosity against the Blue Cross, or if there has been, on the part of some, too eager an assumption that such a non-profit institution as the Blue Cross, dedicated to the welfare of the average American, cannot work out practically, it is good to know that these sentiments are not reflected in the official stand of the hospital trustees.

That being clear, the substance of the trustees' position now is that they invite the Blue Cross to make a very modest increase of ten cents a month in its premium rates to all its 650,000 members in Connecticut.

This long-range proposal from the hospital to the Blue Cross now stands alongside the Blue Cross' original proposal to the hospital, which is that the hospital undertake an audit to determine whether or not the special charges are out of line with other hospitals and whether or not the Manchester situation should not be remedied by an increase in the hospital's basic bed and room charges to all its patients, accompanied and balanced by a reduction in special service charges.

Looking at both proposals from a very critical point of view, it can be said that, on one hand, the Blue Cross is proposing that Manchester Hospital increase its basic rates to all its patients in order to adjust Manchester Billings to the Connecticut average. The Blue Cross is scheduled to pay \$1.00 per month for each patient, which is less than the average of other hospitals in the state.

And it can be said, on the other hand, that Manchester Memorial Hospital is proposing that the Blue Cross increase its premium rates to 650,000 members all over Connecticut so that the Blue Cross can afford to pay Manchester Memorial Hospital special service rates which Blue Cross considers above the Connecticut average.

This is, perhaps, a typical bargaining stalemate which, given good faith on both sides, can be worked out to a common sense compromise. At least we hope it will work out that way.

Meanwhile, it must be noted that the Manchester trustees, although offering a counter-proposal to the Blue Cross, have not, in their statements to date, taken up the specific question which, from

Wooling the Bear

Britain's effort to pay itself recently loses from American foreign policy and head over heels, but significantly in the direction of Russia, thus attaining a friendly middle position between America and Russia, has met with some ironic results. The new British policy was evidenced in the visit of General Montgomery to Moscow, and in reports that the British Cabinet, in an extensive review of British foreign policy, had definitely decided to orient itself in the direction of more cordiality with Russia. This British policy had no sooner shown its head, however, than Pravda, the Russian newspaper, dug back into a speech Foreign Secretary Bevin made on Dec. 22nd and came up with a rather surprising and extreme interpretation of what he said in the course of an effort to give reassurance on the matter of Britain's sincere friendship toward Russia. While pledging loyalty to the twenty-year alliance between Britain and Russia, Bevin also added, as something of a necessary afterthought, a statement to the effect that of course "Britain does not tie herself to anybody except in regard to her obligations" under the United Nations Charter.

What Pravda did was to lift this phrase out of its context and deliberately interpret it to mean a denunciation of the Anglo-Soviet treaty.

This artificially contrived bit of unpleasantness so upset the British that they took the unusual expedient of replying to the newspaper article by a formal diplomatic message to Stalin himself. The British note protested against Pravda's journalistic tactics, and said it was British policy to extend and strengthen the Anglo-Soviet treaty and not to abandon it.

Now the first Russian answer to this note has come, not from Stalin, but from Pravda again. And Pravda is still insisting that what Bevin really did was to denounce the Anglo-Soviet treaty.

By this time, it is becoming clear to the British that, if anybody is engaged in the process of denouncing the Anglo-Soviet treaty, it is not Bevin or Britain, but Russia. And this accords to the Russian response to recent British efforts for increased cordiality between the two nations. Who that Russian bear and he turns on you with snarls. And for what particular purpose, we are assured, does he snarl at the moment?

There is, however, a general observation that can be made. It is that all treaties such as this one between Britain and Russia, by which the two nations pledge themselves for twenty years to joint defense against any new attack on either from Germany, or such as the newly proposed treaty between Britain and France for the same essential purpose, should be considered as outmoded and superseded by the existence of the United Nations Charter and the United Nations organization. If the United Nations Charter means anything, such special alliances are not necessary.
