### Parisian Wage-Earners' Dilemma Is How to Balance 70% Inflation With Government's 5% Price Cut

Paris—Housewife Germaine Gateau looked at her almost-empty cupboard and said:

"This past year has been the worst since the occupation."

There was neither bitterness nor regret in her statement, which was that of a woman who has seen the worst since the occupation.

For while there were more of everything in the markets of Paris, and prices have been lowered 5 per cent by government decree, there is less in the hands of the little income people than before because prices are about 50 per cent higher than a year ago.

The Gateau family is a good example of the struggle. The small income class faces, not to keep alive, but to keep afloat.

Husband Rene, 29, is a waiter in one of the large Paris hotels catering to American clientele. He works nine hours a day, six days a week, for a basic salary of \$35 a month. His share of the 15 per cent service charge, plus a \$10 monthly allowance for one meal a day and minus \$3.25 for social insurance and other taxes brings his monthly pay check up to \$66, sometimes a few dollars more.

By comparative French standards, this is not by any means a low mark for the average monthly wage in the Paris department of calculation, but it is not by the government at \$37.50.

And because Rene is married and has three children, the government gives the Gateau a \$47 allowance each month. This allowance, the "Code de Famille," has been handed out by the government as a sort of baby bonus since 1939. It is based on a percentage of the average wage for each department. There is no bonus for one child, but the bonus begins with the second child and increases with each additional child.
