Some talk is of a giant new "triple alliance" among Russia, Britain and France. And the talk which came of it all of a former Secretary Byrnes' proposal for a four power pact, including the United States as well as these three nations, may be received at Moscow.

The purpose of all such treaties would be to have all these great nations join in a mutual pledge that Germany is never going to be allowed to launch an aggressive attack upon any one of these nations.

There can hardly be any quarrel with this purpose. Two world wars have now been fought in answer to just such German attacks and each of them with the pronounced purpose of making it impossible for Germany ever to do it again. So it is about time that the world did make sure that Germany isn't going to do it again.

But there can be quarrel with the methods by which the great powers are now approaching this problem.

There is now in existence an organization called the United Nations, which is pledged to prevent the development of war of aggression anywhere. The pledge of this organization to itself and to the world most certainly includes the effective ban on any new aggression on the part of Germany.

Why, then, such special treaties as these between Russia and Britain, France and Russia, France and Britain, and perhaps between the United States and all three nations? What purpose will be served? Isn't the United Nations supposed to take care of the particular danger, and if the United Nations can't be trusted to take care of such danger from a prostrate Germany, where and how can it be trusted? And if the United Nations is nothing, what hope is there for the world anyway? If the nations can't keep one big pledge to each other, how will any number of additional special pledges increase their good faith?

The answer given by the sponsors of such special treaty proposals is that the nations involved must reassure each other that they don't intend to use the Germany of the future against one another. But they pledged this before, and still did it. The answer given with relation to the advisability of having the United States join in such a treaty that will reassure the other three nations that we aren't withdrawing from the treaties of the world. But we are in the United Nations, and thereby bound to the troubles of the world, no matter where they develop. And, for that matter, history says we couldn't withdraw from them if we tried.

These are, to our mind, flimsy answers and justifications. If the nations do seem reasonable to our diplomats, as they do, then the diplomats of the world's diplomats must be hospitably and enthusiastically received in the treaty negotiations of the past. These negotiations and overlapping treaties are like the too frequent pledges of the address who knows he is never really going to reform. As we would think it wouldn't catch every Communist, it offers for the simple reason that some of our American Communists probably think they can be more effective if they avoid acting as the typical Communist would act. But it would touch most of our American Communists.

The formula offers ten categories of behavior. The person who might be placed in one or two of these categories need not be suspected. But anyone who fits into more than three or four of the ten is likely to be a Communist.

The ten categories are as follows:

"Belief that during the period from August, 1939, to June, 1941, the United States should have aided Britain and the other Allies of that time was an 'imperialist' war and a game of power politics."

"Belief that a foreign policy which coincides in all important respects with that advocated by Soviet Russia and which changes policy with changes in the U. S. S. R. line."

"Arguing that any foreign or domestic policy which does not fit into the Communist pattern is advanced for ulterior motives and not in the best interests of the United States and the world."

"Offering criticism only of the American, British, French and Chinese policies, and offering no criticism of the Soviet policy."

"Though very critical of injustices in other areas and movements, never critical of communism in the United States and the Soviet Union."

"Continually receiving publicity in such Communist publications as 'The Daily Worker' and 'The New Masses.'"

"Continually appearing as a sponsor or co-worker of such known Communist-front groups as the Committee to Win the Peace, the Civil Rights Congress, the National Negro Congress and other groups which can be classified as Communist-inspired organizations because they fall within the criteria of Communist-front groups as the Communist party with being 'facists' and 'Red-baiters' no matter whether so it is about time that the world did make sure that Germany isn't going to do it again.
