Survivors Say Tanker Radio Man Is Hero

later were transferred to the Gordon. Wisher told of the nightmarish experience trying to transmit distress call.

"Two terrific consequences—"At 12:15 a. m. on March 12, there were two terrific consequences as if we had been rammed," he related. "I was thrown from my bunk and my head hit a bolt-head."

"I heard Captain Mahoney (Capt. Richard Mahoney of Corpus Christi, Tex.) yell 'Get up, Spark! The ship's parted! Try to get out an SOS!'"

The radio man stumbled to the radio room and turned on an emergency light. He found the antenna had been carried away with the stern section. His regular radio was useless.

Three attempts to transmit with an emergency transmitter failed. "What little equipment he had was damaged by the concussion of the water accumulating in the radio shack."

"There was one more chance—a small emergency transmitter for a lifeboat. Wisher went on. "It was on a rack in the radio room. But the batteries were too far gone. We had to figure out something else."

Sanford Rogers, the chief steward of West Point, Mo., carried the transmitter up to the chart room. Wisher said, "and that was room full with our command of the ship tacking and rolling and the deck slippery with water and oil from the broken tanks."

In the chart room, where Rogers succeeded in attaching it to the "Christmas tree" as they call the wartime arrangement of convoy signal lights they still carried.

Cared To Conserve Power
 By 4 a. m. Wisher sent out his first SOS, and kept it up intermittently all day and night, careful to conserve his scanty power supply.

Then the miracle occurred.

Wisher said, "We hadn't known whether our SOS calls had been heard. But a big plane suddenly appeared, circled overhead and dropped a couple of flares. And about two hours later, General Gordon and the freighter St. John's Victory showed up."

"Twenty-two men still were adrift on the stern section. These were taken off by a Navy vessel which was proceeding toward Honolulu, some 1,100 miles to the southeast. But a lifeboat with 12 or 13 men aboard has not been seen since. Supervisors arriving here felt these men perished."

"I don't think there is a chance of their being alive, not in those treacherous seas," agreed Capt. Henry Rose, Jr., of Riverside, Calif., also an assistant engineer, said "the break sounded like metal crumpling."

Rose, who was just going off engine room watch, said he tried to contact the bridge, located on the bow.

"When the bridge failed to answer my call, I went on deck to see what had happened. When I saw the bow was gone, I was pretty worried."

Ernest said he "took precautions to keep the engines running."

"I was scared," he said. "I didn't know what had happened."

In retrospect, Edmond J. Lombard, wiper, Newport, R. I., took a humorous view of the situation.

"When the ship broke I was having my beauty sleep," he recalled. "I jumped out of my rack (bunk). I got into my life-jacket. I was awfully scared, so I went up on deck to see what happened. I thought we had collided with another ship because I saw the bow about five yards away from the stern."

"It was kind of cold out on deck, so I ran down to my room to put on a pair of pants."

At this point, the bow of his work through the speaker at Hawaiian Sea Frontier headquarters gave way to chuckles.

There was no radio on the stern, but the sight of the floating bow reassured the victims that perhaps an SOS had been radioed.

Signal Wills Flare
 A flare appeared next day and the stern section crewmen signalled with a flare.

Lieut. A. L. Stelman, Linwood, N. J., skipper of the PCF 902, said the weather had moderated when he arrived and that a boat from the Navy command ship El Dorado was able to transfer the survivors to the 902, which is bringing them to Honolulu.

The 902 was due here today with the survivors.

The tug Lipan put a line aboard the deserted stern section yesterday and started the slow haul to Pearl Harbor, where it will be examined to determine the cause of the split. The bow section was sunk earlier.

The cruiser Tuxcon and 15 destroyers are due in the area more than 1,000 miles northwest of Hawaii today to search for the 12 or 13 men who disappeared with the lifeboat.

Fort Myers, Fla., March 20.—(P)—"Ten years ago a delegation of Florida public officials and civic leaders, conscience stricken at the poverty of the Seminole Indians a century after the ending of armed conflict between the redskins and white settlers, called on the tribal chieftains.

"What can we do to help your distressed people?" they asked.

An answer was given by the proud and bitter answer of an elderly chief.

"Let us alone."

These three words symbolized for a hundred years the Seminole desire to be free of any contact with the white invaders who finally carried off to Oklahoma all members of the tribe except those who hid out in the Everglades.

There are signs, however, in the last decade that the Seminoles are gradually exchanging their primitive culture of the forest for the civilization of the restaurant juke joint.

Changing Ancient Pattern

These factors are influencing the Seminoles to change the ancient pattern of their ways:

(1) The old methods of chieftain, who had white men sworn to his Georgia Confederates, was replaced as a rule General Sherman are dying out.

(2) A conviction is spreading among the young braves that the Indians are probably here to stay and all except those accidentally drowned while staking out homesteads are being sent to the Florida land boom.

(3) The tribe has grown to 740 members and no longer can kill enough wild game to sustain it, is more available to serve as guides for white hunters in quest of the vanishing deer and turkey.

Hi-Ban Victims Identified

Only one third of the Seminoles live on the 170,000 acres set aside for their use on one side and three Federal reservations because the land can't support them all.

Needless to say, none of the acreage is on Miami Beach or Palm Beach. Some of the Seminoles reported to Oklahoma got rich on oil, but the boys who stayed here and fought for their little backwoods in the Everglades don't have much more money than the agitators.

Driscoll Will Head Group To Present Evidence of Corruption and Mismanagement in Union

Waterbury, March 20.—(P)—John J. Driscoll, chairman of the Provisional Metalworkers council, announced last night that he will head a P.M.C. committee to present evidence of corruption, mismanagement and "extremist control" in the international union of Mine, Mill and Smelter Workers.

Driscoll said that Van A. Bittner, member of the CIO committee named to probe the accusations, had informed him that reports that the hearing had been postponed were unfounded and that the first session would be held Tuesday.

Ready to Sign Contract

The P.M.C. chairman also reported that Local 281 of the P.M.C. was prepared to sign a new contract with the Manufacturers Foundry Co., on Monday. This will be the first contract signed by a secondary union with a Waterbury firm.

Meanwhile a conference was scheduled here today by NLRB.
