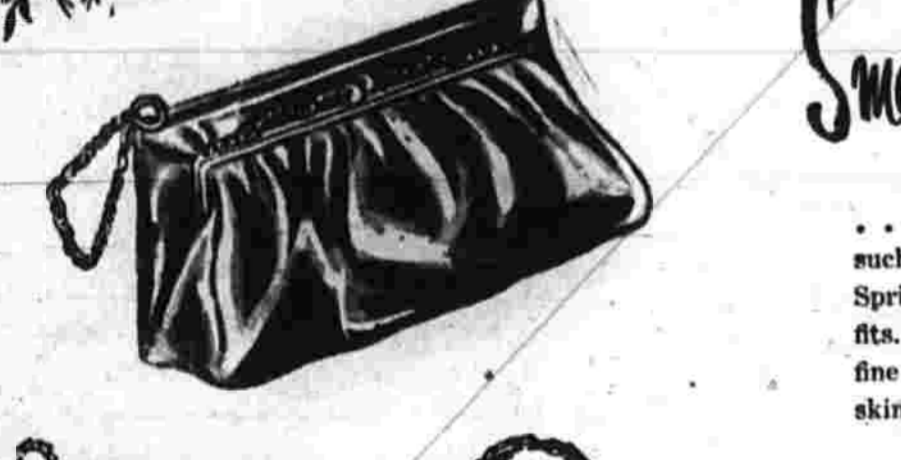

The five Communist cabinet members voted with the government for the motion of confidence and the 340 million franc appropriation (\$385,000,000) for continued military operations in Indo-China.

Just About Ready to Start Local Project When Legality of Finance Is Questioned

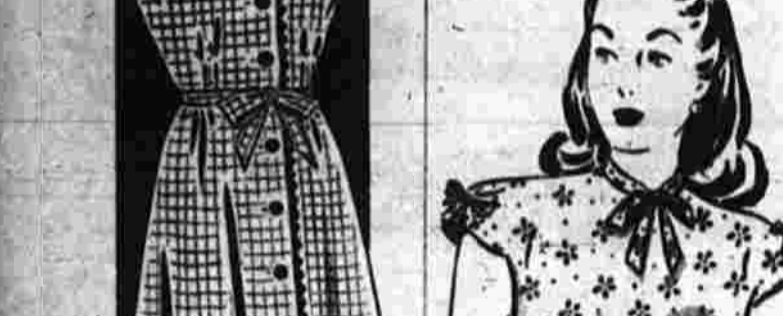

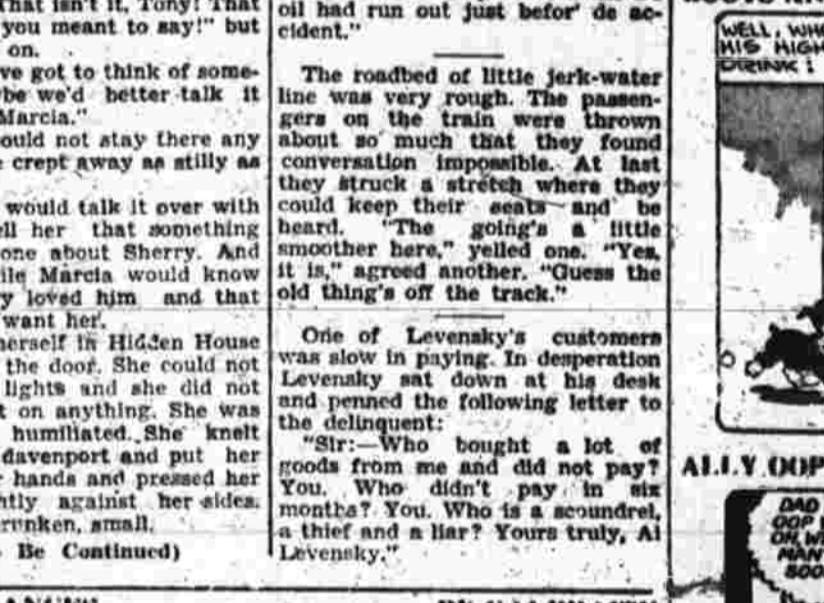
