Foreign office sources stead-fastly refused to admit Dairen was a subject of international negotia-tions with Russia, pointing out that the question was fully cover-ed by the Chinese-Russian treaty.

Chinese quarters in Shanghal, being unofficial, were less reticent. They openly expressed fear that Russian troops might pull out of Dairen suddenly, leaving the Chi-nese Communists in control. They believed Chinese officials are making every effort to induce Moscow to avoid such a course.
