To Complete Job On Bliss Street

As a result of the expression of opinion by Bliss street residents last night when the Board of Selectmen held a public hearing on a petition to surface that street, it was later voted in executive session to have the job completed.

The residents had petitioned the Board to have the street resurfaced with a hard-surface road, which is a development of the Sterling Construction company in which John R. Allen has an interest. Last night about ten residents were present.

Residents explained that when they bought their property they understood that full improvement of the street was included in their purchase price under a verbal agreement.

Later, they found, the road work had not been done. However, Allen has deposited \$500 to be applied on the job, and this sum, it was stated last night by the town engineer, will be sufficient for grading and completion.

Residents expressed themselves as content not to have curbs and walks.

It was explained by Chairman of the Board Cecil England that while the Bliss street area had been accepted as a layout under which development could progress, the street itself has not yet been accepted by the town and will not be until it is in condition to meet requirements as to improvements.

Walks and curbs, it was explained, might be installed later by an assessment of two-thirds of the cost against abutting property owners while the other third would be borne by the town.

In executive session, Board members warned that purchasers of property should understand town ratings thoroughly before they commit themselves to land on which there still might be much expense for improvements.

Federal Profit Seen on Levy

Morano Advocates Abolition of Unemployment Insurance Tax

Hartford, April 2.—Ten years of the Federal unemployment insurance tax have given the United States Treasury a profit of about \$21,000,000 from Connecticut, according to Albert P. Morano, Fourth district unemployment commissioner.

Morano, who served as secretary to Rep. Carey Boothby Lane (R., Conn.), during her term at Washington, made the disclosure in a prepared statement filed at a general assembly labor committee hearing yesterday and advocated abolition of the Federal levy as a means of reducing the jobless tax burden on manufacturers. He urged the Connecticut legislature to adopt a resolution asking Congress to remove the tax.

Asserting that the levy was collected to finance the administration of jobless insurance, Morano, in his statement, continued:

Federal Profit Seen on Levy

Morano Advocates Abolition of Unemployment Insurance Tax

Manford, April 2.—Ten years of the Federal unemployment insurance tax have given the United States Treasury a profit of about \$21,000,000 from Connecticut, according to Albert P. Morano, Fourth district unemployment commissioner.

Morano, who served as secretary to Rep. Clare Boothe Luce (R., Conn.) during her terms at Washington, made the disclosure in a prepared statement filed at a General Assembly Labor committee hearing yesterday and advocated abolition of the Federal levy as a means of reducing the joint tax burden on manufacturers. Rising Costs Of Sidewalks

Selectmen Hear That Much of New Walks Must Be Rebuilt

The mounting costs of sidewalk repair work in town suggested the attention of the Board of Selectmen last night when Chairman Cecil England brought in a report from the town engineer which indicated that much of the developing sidewalk construction in town will have to be rebuilt.

The report was based on a partial survey of such areas as Hyde street, Victoria road, Proctor road and the older section of Monroe street.

According to the report, almost the entire sidewalk in some places has been damaged, such deterioration being made possible by poor and sub-standard construction. In the past, it was said, sidewalk inspection at the time of building had been a rather perfunctory matter, with proper results.

England in stressing the importance of proper inspection said that the town now is spending \$10,000 annually for repairs, and at the present rate of replacement, "never will catch up on the job."

He suggested that abutting property owners be assessed to pay two-thirds of the cost of repairs. Such repairs, he said, must be kept up to date to save the town.
