## 152 Persons Believed Killed by Tornado; More Than 1,000 Hurt; Damage Millions

### Connally Asserts 'World Dominion' Aim of Russians

Tells Senate Soviet Expansion Must Be Stopped Short of Greece and Turkey; Lays Down Program For Friendly Relations

**Bulletin!**  
Washington, April 10.—(AP)—Senator Connally (D., Tex.) saying Russia is out for "world dominion," urged the Senate today to approve the Greek-Turkey assistance program while Senator Pepper (D., Fla.), said he fears it may breed a war that will "destroy civilization."

Washington, April 10.—(AP)—Senator Tom Connally (D., Tex.), told the Senate today that Russian expansion must be stopped short of Greece and Turkey because the Soviets are aiming for "world dominion." The Texas senator, top Democratic member of the Foreign Relations committee, opened the Senate's third day of debate on President Truman's proposal to extend \$400,000,000 in financial and limited military aid to the two countries with a blunt declaration that Russia wants to "control the destiny of Europe."

**Delivers Prepared Address**  
"Soviet Russia, by her system of spreading creeping paralysis among smaller and weaker nations, hopes to bring about world dominion and to control the destiny of Europe," Connally said in a prepared address. "She hungers for all the land that joins me."

The former chairman of the Foreign Relations committee said it is his view that the United States must be frank with Russia and must demand frankness in return. He added:

### Atomic Group All Confirmed By Senators

Plunges Immediately into Long Range Planning for Developing Of Nuclear Power

Washington, April 10.—(AP)—The Atomic Energy commission came out of its storm cellar today and plunged immediately into long range planning for peaceful and military development of nuclear power.

The tornado which reared about the commission during 11 weeks of argument on Capitol Hill subsided last night when the Senate voted 50 to 34 to confirm David E. Lillenthal in the chairman's job he has held since last Jan. 1. Four fellow commissioners and General Manager Carroll Wilson also were confirmed without the formality of roll call.

**Operations Handicapped**  
Lillenthal's aides said commission operations had been "seriously" handicapped by uncertainty over the legal status of the commission's membership. They added that as the Senate argument dragged on over charges that Lillenthal was "soft" in his attitude toward Communism the work of the agency suffered progressively.

**Terse Victory Statement**  
Lillenthal made an oblique reference to the commission's difficulties in a terse victory statement in which he said "the important thing now is to get on with this job."

"This job," entails the outright ownership for the government of all atomic plants and materials in this country as well as sweeping authority over research and development work in all fields.

The \$14,000,000 post of director of engineering is among the more important job vacancies still to be filled.

Also the commission wants to revise the present short-term nature of most of its contracts with industrial firms and universities for operation of the chain of big (Continued on Page Twelve)

### Bill to Check Strikes Reaches Voting Stage

House Labor Committee Democrats Ready To Attack Measure Republicans Approve

Washington, April 10.—(AP)—A stiff new bill to put the brakes on strikes and unions reached the voting stage in the House Labor committee today. Traces of opposition to it still smoldered among some Republican members. Several Democrats, getting their first look at the terms, were ready to swing on it with all their power.

**Approved by Leaders**  
The bill, with a couple of changes, got the approval yesterday of Republican leaders and the policy-shaping G.O.P. Steering committee.

One change would provide a period of mediation and arbitration for settling strikes, such as the telephone row, which the bill defines as affecting the national health, welfare and safety. The (Continued on Page Five)

### Truman Urges Lower Prices

Declares Wage Increases Will Be Justified Unless Reduction Made

Washington, April 10.—(AP)—President Truman said today that unless prices come down wage increases will be justified.

The president told a news conference the Justice department is studying the question of whether manufacturing concerns can combine to lower prices without running afoul of the anti-trust laws.

Under one Supreme court decision, Mr. Truman said, it would be unlawful to combine to cut prices just as it would be to group together to raise them.

The president said this survey is being conducted as one means of getting prices down since the government's "over" prices ended last year and it would be impractical to reinstate price controls.

### Meeting Held On Reducing State Costs

McConaughy Confers at Length With Lowell and Chairmen of Special Economy Groups

State Capitol, Hartford, April 10.—(AP)—Gov. James L. McConaughy conferred at length today with Finance Commissioner James B. Lowell and the chairmen of the Special Economy Study committee on the recommendations for cutting governmental costs, recently made by the legislative group.

After a discussion lasting more than an hour, Senator Dominick Pedace (R., Norwich), Senate chairman of the committee, said the economy recommendations had been reviewed by the conferees, with particular emphasis on those relating to state personnel.

Pedace said no conclusions were reached at length with state personnel. Among its conclusions were that there was "chairwarming" by some state employees, that 800 temporary or provisional positions could be abolished and that the state-merit system had failed to produce hoped-for efficiency.

**No Conclusions Reached**  
Pedace said no conclusions were reached at the conference, and that the governor had asked for a further meeting later today.

Lowell, who carried the economy report under his arm, Pedace and House Chairman Walter V. Davey (R., Winchester) met with the governor in the executive chambers while the General Assembly met in a quiet session.

Some sources said that it was likely that the coplan in the executive chambers was a preliminary to a meeting of state department heads called by the governor for next Monday to discuss what economies could be effected immediately without legislative action.

### 100 Estimated Dead at Woodward, Okla., as Approximately 100 Blocks of Buildings Destroyed; Other Texas and Oklahoma Towns in Path of Storm Also Suffer

Woodward, Okla., April 10.—(AP)—A devastating tornado swept across a 100-mile path of the rich cattle and wheat country today killing an estimated 152 persons, injuring more than 1,000 and inflicting property damage running into the millions.

The Texas State Highway patrol quoting a Red Cross estimate, reported at least 152 were believed dead with the probability more bodies were buried in the rubble.

**Woodward Hardest Hit**  
Hardest hit was Woodward, Okla., where 100 were estimated to be dead, with between 800 and 1,000 injured. Approximately 100 blocks of buildings were destroyed in this city of 5,000 population.

Other estimates included Bartlesville, Okla., 20 dead; Higgins, Tex., 24, and Glazier, Tex., 8. Earlier, two were reported dead at Gage, Okla., which would bring the total to 154.

The general course of the storm was northward from White Deer, Tex., 50 miles from Amarillo (Continued On Page Twelve)

### Flashes!

To Close Hospital By June 30  
Washington, April 10.—(AP)—The Army announced today it will close two more hospitals by June 30—the Old Farmer Convalescent hospital at Avon, Conn., and Pratt general hospital at Coral Gables, Fla. With the closing of these institutions, the Army will have 15 general Army hospitals in operation and approximately 28,000 patients. The Connecticut hospital, opened in June, 1944, has been used as a rehabilitation center for blinded patients.

Harper announced today counsel for the 12,000 striking New Jersey Bell Telephone switchboard operators had gone to Washington to recommend to the National Strike Policy committee that the operators in this state return to work immediately. Harper said, after conferring with leaders of the Traffic Telephone Workers Federation of New Jersey (the operators), that he expected to hear from the attorney—Henry Mayer—by 1 p.m. today.

**Questions Hanes' Figures**  
Washington, April 10.—(AP)—President Truman said today he does not believe John W. Hanes, former undersecretary of the Treasury, got figures from any reliable source in estimating the Treasury will have a surplus of \$3,000,000,000 to \$1,000,000,000 this fiscal year. He commented at his news conference on a letter Hanes, who was a Treasury official in the Roosevelt administration, sent to the tax-writing Senate Finance committee. Hanes' letter, made public last night, stated that if Congress goes through with proposed cuts in government spending the Treasury may take in \$9,500,000,000 to \$11,000,000,000 more than it spends in the 18 months' period ending June 30, 1948.

Tientsin, April 10.—(AP)—Masia Eschenbuhl, 31-year-old school teacher who said she killed to attract attention on the "injustice" of the Italian peace treaty, was sentenced to die for the assassination of British Brig. R. W. M. The Winton. A burst of cheers from the crowd outside courtroom greeted her statement to the Allied Military court that she would not appeal the sentence to "the oppressors of my country."

Baruch Plan Interpreted... On atomic policy, that favored touchstone of the crisis of civilization, this nation continues to fluctuate with a divided vision.

Not so favorable a response can be given to the disclosure yesterday of our own War Department's views on the future of possible international control of atomic energy.

This blueprint revealed two things about the War Department's interpretation of the Baruch plan. First, the War Department believes that the risks of atomic war would still be so great, even after full acceptance by all nations of the Baruch plan, that it concludes that we ourselves must retain definitely in accord with international agreements, our knowledge and industrial capacity to produce atomic weapons.

Second, the War Department maintains that there should be a period between the full international ratification of the Baruch plan and America's final decision of its own stockpile of atomic bombs. The War Department believes that a period of five years would be a reasonable period to elapse between the time that the United States did not shut down and control atomic progress in all other nations, but still retain for a long time its own stockpile of bombs had been exactly what critics of the Baruch plan have frequently charged. Baruch and others. But now the War Department reveals that it understands that which has not been served out as it would intend to follow it. We would be asking other nations to surrender whatever possible progress they might be making on atomic bombs while we retained our own monopoly and advantage. This is, at least, some open contradiction of what we know ourselves to be doing.
