Missing Papers Being Sought

Geneva, Switzerland, April 24.—The mystery of the missing documents which were taken up here while the United Nations Balkan Investigating committee writes its report on Greece, even though the missing documents are believed to be of little moment.

U. N. secretary personnel with the commission said last night that the documents had been taken from military supplies—842,000. This probably can be written off.

It included food, clothing and fuel from U. S. military supplies, mainly in Europe for civilians left in urgent need in the wake of armies.

Hope to Get Some Back
3. Government relief in occupied areas—\$1,450,000,000. We hope to get some back.

The money was spent out of War department funds for relief supplies in areas occupied by U. S. troops, such as Japan, Germany, Korea, Austria.

4. Export-import bank loans—\$2,611,700,000. These loans are to be repaid within 30 years.

The bank is a government agency, it makes loans to foreign countries to help build their trade and build things like steel mills which, in turn, will help our trade.

5. Surplus property—\$1,070,000,000. This is money owed us, or to be owed us, for ships sold to other countries, or authorized to be sold, by the U. S. Maritime commission.

6. Aid to the Philippines—\$695,000,000. Only \$75,000,000 of this amount—a loan to stabilize Philippine currency—is to be repaid.

The rest includes the value of surplus property, war surplus claims by Philippines civilians, and money for road repairs, and so on.

7. Aid through international organizations, such as UNRRA (the United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation administration)—\$2,617,000,000.

This is in the form of food, clothing, supplies and other things for devastated countries. Not to be repaid.

8. Post war UNRRA relief (pending)—\$500,000,000. We have UNRRA, itself, folding up now. Congress is getting ready to vote \$200,000,000 for continued relief in selected countries.

9. International bank—\$625,000,000. We've put that much into the bank. It's our share. Other member-countries of the bank have put in their share.

Billions for Civilian Aid Since War End

Some of \$15,560,700,000 Will Be Paid Back—Surplus Military Equipment Excluded

The country has poured billions of dollars into civilian aid for other nations since World War II ended.

Since the fighting stopped in the summer of 1945 this government has shipped or is getting ready to ship about \$15,560,700,000 in such aid.

This doesn't mean money, or goods worth money, that shelled out. Some will be paid back. Some won't. Much we never expected to get back.

But that \$15,560,700,000 means money spent, or money loaned, or money value of goods given, for civilian aid only.

Military Aid Included
It does not include military aid. That would make a surplus United States military equipment. That help make the total billions of dollars higher.

The civilian relief aid given here were prepared by the government. The aid is being paid back. Some will be paid back. Some won't. Much we never expected to get back.

But that \$15,560,700,000 means money spent, or money loaned, or money value of goods given, for civilian aid only.
