Big Power Shovel Begins Work on Project; Officials Are Present

With Chairman Joseph Hanna of the Manchester Housing Authority present, Alexander Jarvis's large power shovel officially started the Vethaven housing project this morning. Bulldozers scraped back the layer of topsoil from the course of the streets.

Work was done near the station-house on the Middle Turnpike approach to the project. It was stated to bring the new roadways to grade. Some will be used as fill.

One of the newest types of power shovel, a unit which cost \$22,000, is being used. Mounted on a truck chassis, it is able to be self-propelled on the highways. It is one of 14 shovel rigs which form the Vethaven housing project.

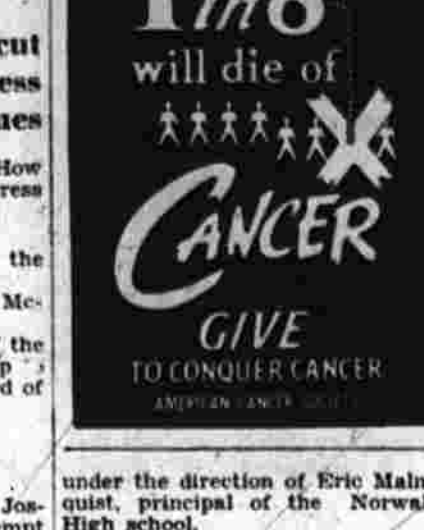
