The California plan is among several under consideration by Connecticut legislative leaders.

Whoooping Crane Again Flies North

Northfield, Minn., May 8.—The majestic whooping crane, a state bird of the marshes, now nearly extinct, is again on the wing northward to its secret nesting grounds.

Despite a systematic search last year by a Minnesota biologist who covered thousands of miles in Canada by airplane in addition to receiving assistance on the ground by Royal Canadian Mounted police and other observers, the whooping crane kept its nesting place a secret.

But Dr. Olin Sewall Pottinger, Jr., associate professor of zoology at Carleton college, Northfield, leader of the extensive search last year, said the long-necked bird with the resonant voice, did establish a home somewhere in the far north last year.

Small Sailing Vessel Sought

Branford, May 8.—A Coast Guard patrol boat from Port Trombul today resumed search for an unidentified small sailing vessel reported to have sent up distress signals last night from the vicinity of Eauxclair island in Long Island sound.

Hartford, May 8.—The Connecticut General Assembly Judiciary committee has approved a bill which would increase the maximum monthly benefit from \$40 to \$45 and the daily hospitalization payment from \$4 to \$6 under the old age assistance law program.

Also endorsed by the group yesterday was a proposal to establish a state-administered adult production system for all courts. Under terms of the measure, a five-man probation board would be created that would require \$17,000.

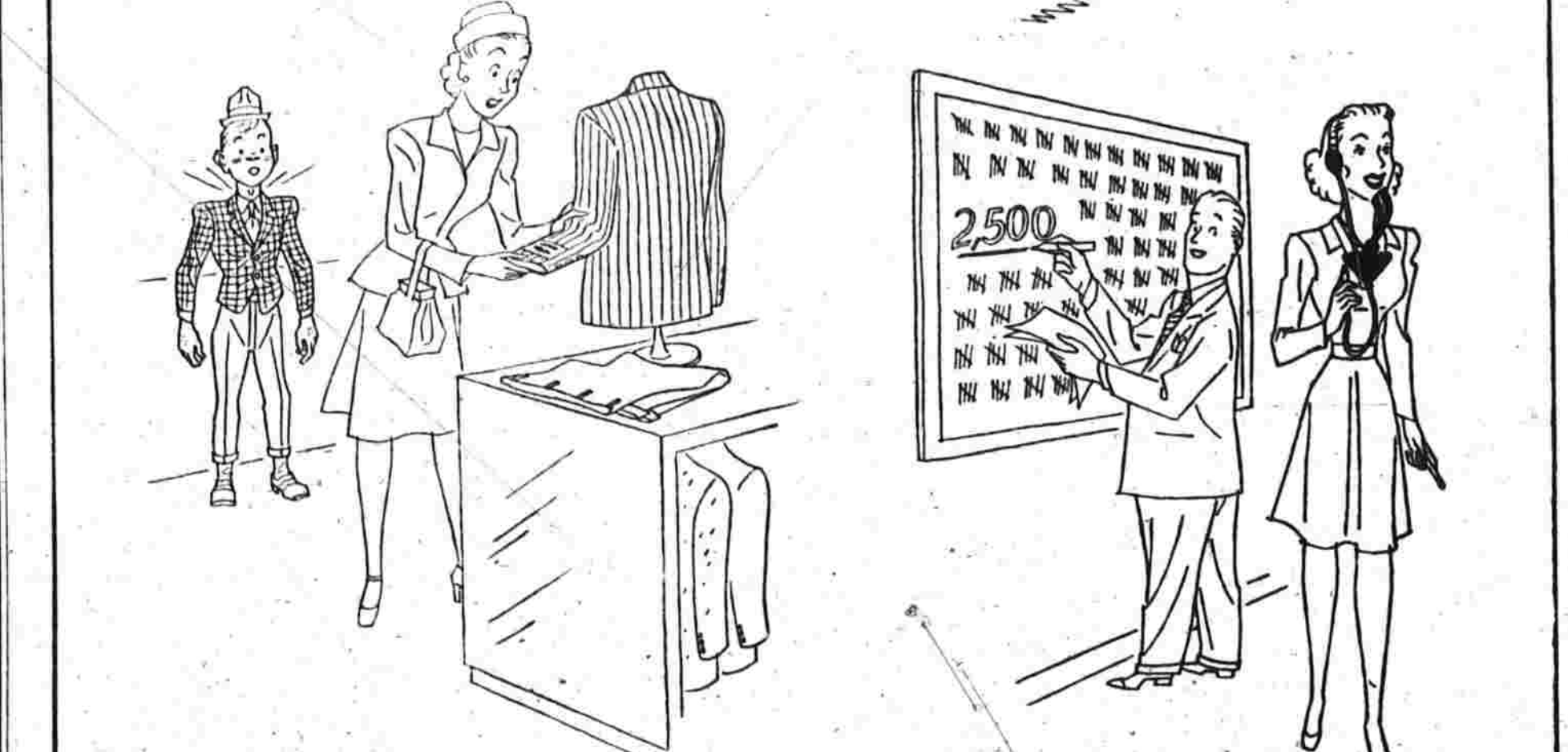

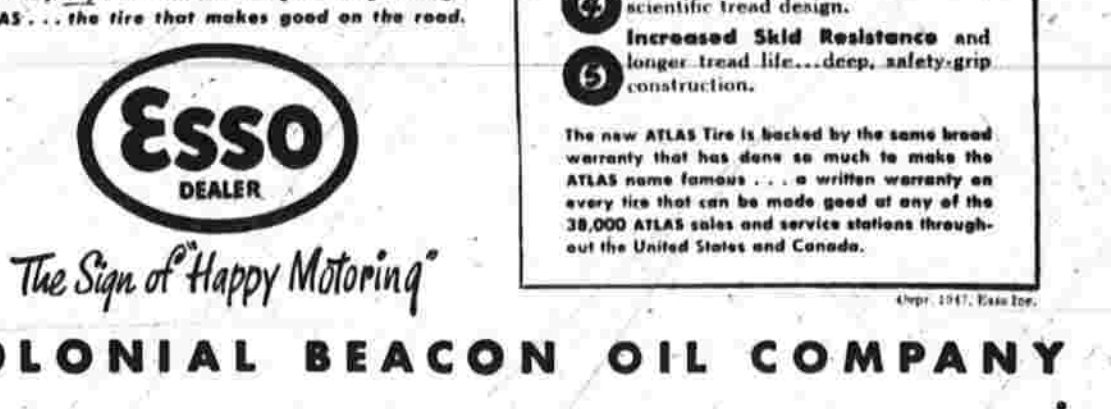

Vets' Center Files Report

Steady Increase in Number of Persons Using Its Facilities
Walter T. Ford, assistant director of the Veterans' Service Center, released this morning the report of the Center for the month of April. It shows that a total of 656 contacts were made.
