Local Resident Sees Town First Time in Years

Yesterday was a red letter day for the life of Miss Catherine Moriarty of 14 North School street. For the first time in more than eight years she had the opportunity of seeing Manchester and all the changes that have taken place during that time in her native town.

Miss Moriarty is a cripple and gets around the house by using two crutches. She was formerly a popular clerk in Hild's store and several nephews and many friends who would have been glad to make the attempt to take her out in their cars, but for her fear of possible further injury.

However, it remained for an overseas veteran to persuade her yesterday that it could be safely accomplished. So Miss Moriarty donned a hat and coat for the first time in that long period, and with two other women friends, spent a long-to-be-remembered afternoon strolling around the different developments, stopping at homes of close friends who came to the car to greet her, and visiting St. Brigid's cemetery, where all of her immediate family are interred.

A year ago Memorial Day she and the nephews arranged to take her to Memorial hospital here immediately after the mishap, she was taken to Hartford where she is under care of specialists.

According to the police report, the car from which she fell was being operated at about 25 miles per hour by her father. The injured girl was one of two children riding in the rear with her grandmother, Mr. Steiner, his wife and baby.

Child Found in Street
Mr. Steiner stated he suddenly heard his mother scream and immediately stopped the car, the right rear door of which was open. The little girl was in the street. At the hospital she was found to have many lacerations, and X-rays are being taken to determine any further possible injury.

This is the second accident here within the past month in which children have fallen from moving cars. The previous one was fatal.

August 1 Deadline On Vet Insurance

Manchester veterans who have allowed their National Service Life Insurance to lapse are advised today that the deadline for reinstating their insurance without taking a physical examination is August 1, 1947.

Veterans "have-over" should not wait until the deadline to reinstate. Thomas Sweeney, Jr., Veterans Administration Contact Representative in charge of the Manchester office of the Veterans Administration, emphasized, "because in case of their death before they reinstate, their dependents will not be able to receive NSLI proceeds."

"By waiting until the deadline to reinstate," Sweeney said, "a veteran may save a few dollars in premium payments, but he is leaving his or her dependents unprotected during that period."

Although the odds are in the veteran's favor, we have had several cases where such a saving on the part of the veteran has been to the sorrow of his dependents.

"The best way to get back into a 'secure' technique to get veterans to reinstate their NSLI, so many unfortunate cases of veterans who have died or have been killed in accidents without having their NSLI in force have come across my desk that I would be loath to mention."

"I do not emphasize that a veteran who tries to save a few dollars by not reinstating, is assuming a risk which may result in the loss of insurance proceeds for his dependents."

Matters involving use of buildings for temporary classrooms and conversions had to be settled before, a meeting could be called to appropriate money.

 Communists were ousted; the
 Russian army was ordered to
 leave the country; and the
 negotiations and approaching
 ratification of the Balkan peace
 treaty, this day were approaching
 their final stages. Hungary might
 have been free to follow its own
 destiny and its own inclinations,
 as a free nation, dominated by no one,
