Early this month, we suggested that two items of British policy could bear watching, as important indicators of the extent to which the British are prepared to go in going to be speeded and solidified. And we wondered how, if Europe were now to be split probably into two warring camps, the British could dare go through such a goodwill gesture toward the common enemy.

### Air Fatalities Increase High

#### January-June Passenger Rate More Than Doubled This Year

Washington, July 24.—The January-June passenger fatality rate for scheduled domestic airlines more than doubled this year, preliminary Civil Aeronautics board figures show today.

The tentative calculations to date show that 35 passengers died in every 100,000 passenger-miles flown. (One passenger carried one mile represents one passenger-mile).

During the same period of 1946 the rate was 23 deaths, although for the full year it was only 12.

Described as conservative, the figures available to a reporter, a Civil Aeronautics board spokesman, said that the preliminary data indicate that the fatality rate may be lower than the actual rate.

The CAB record shows that 150 revenue-paying passengers died in four air crashes up to July 1. In the same period a year ago passenger deaths totaled 52, also in four crashes.
