Asks Larger Cancer Fund

Miss Marion Tinker Requests Her Request Will Be Granted

Miss Marion Tinker, chairman of the Soroptimist Club's Cancer committee has received a letter from Edwin R. Morse, of New Haven, managing director of the Connecticut Cancer Society's 1947 campaign for funds. The Connecticut Society which went away from the top in its state is a branch of the American Cancer Society. Incidentally, Connecticut was a pioneer in the movement and its citizens have contributed more than any other single state.

The letter from Mr. Morse was in reply to Tinker's appeal for a larger grant of funds with which to widen the local cancer control program. In line with other committees of the state, she replied that she would present it to the Medical Advisory committee of the state.

Raised \$3,338 Here

Mr. Morse took the opportunity of thanking the Soroptimist Club for the public service rendered again this year in raising the funds with which to fight cancer, stating that he had received a check from Sidney Ellis, industrial chairman, making a grand total of \$3,338 for the Manchester campaign, exceeding last year's quota by \$600. This was made possible by generous gifts from John Brothers, Chester Brothers, Rogers Carter, and many individual supporters.

Russian Veto Starts Hunt For Solution

Diplomats Seek to Break Down Russian Veto

partament authorities kept open hope that the Soviet Union might finally have abandoned from veto. Diplomats here noted that this was the second time within a few weeks that the Russians have acted in a way which clearly and definitely set them apart from the western democracies.

The first of the two incidents occurred at Paris when Soviet Foreign Minister Molotov flatly rejected the Marshall plan for European recovery.

The importance of the two developments taken together, some diplomats here suggested, is that the Soviets now appear to have rejected the point at which they no longer consider it necessary to make a show of striving for unity with the western democracies.

"The incidents have stimulated discussion among authorities as to whether Russia is genuinely interested in trying to make the United Nations work, and particularly the Greek case, the veto in the United Nations as a peace keeping device, or basic harm to the United Nations as a peace keeping device."

In general, the prevailing official opinion here is that Russia is vital to the United Nations for two reasons.

First, she is interested in using her membership to prevent any actions by the organization which would be contrary to the interests and objectives of the Soviet Union.

Secondly, she is interested in the various United Nations organs, especially the General Assembly and Security Council, as platforms from which to deliver Russian ideas to the rest of the world.

Judged by these conclusions, the United States would not like to see the Soviet Union's veto power to prevent an action by the Security Council which would have been contrary to Soviet interests.

Would Have Pivotal Blame

The American resolution would not only have set up a bomb which would have exploded on the occasion of the Greek veto, but it would have placed the blame for the Russian's abstention.

The United States sought the commission in the belief that its very presence would have tended to encourage the floor members of the committee to give more assistance from the satellite countries to the Greek case.

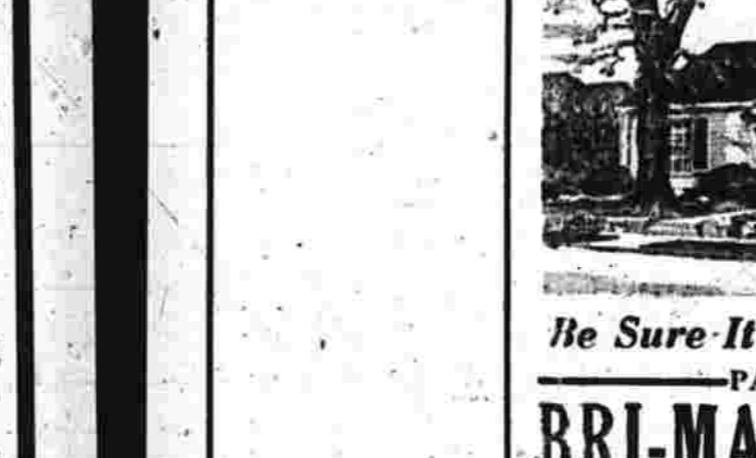

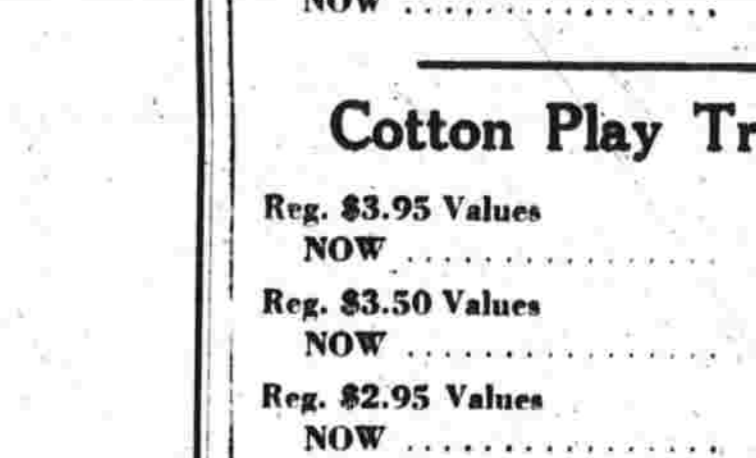
