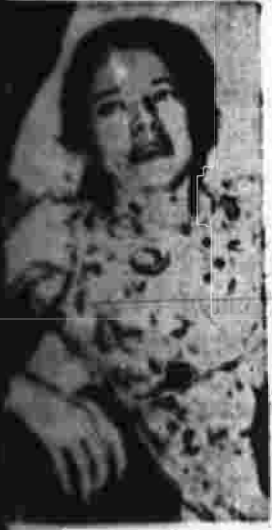

## Elliott Challenges Publicity Man John W. Meyer to Say That Meyer Ever 'Procured' Any Party Girls for Him; Says He Was At White House Instead of Statler Hotel

Washington, Aug. 5.—(AP)—Elliott Roosevelt, angrily demanding that a Senate committee "clean up my moral record," challenged Publicity Man John W. Meyer today to say that Meyer ever "procured" any party girls for him.

**Challenges Item on Vouchers**  
 Testifying before the Senate War Investigating committee, the second son of the late wartime president challenged in particular an item on Meyer's expense vouchers with the Howard Hughes aircraft company listing "Girls at hotel, late, \$50."

"The records of the White House are available, and they will show I was at the White House and I was not at the Statler hotel late," he shouted.

The committee is inquiring into \$40,000,000 of wartime contracts given Hughes. It received last week the expense accounts of Meyer, publicity man for Hughes. These showed some \$169,000 purportedly spent during war years in entertaining various people, including some high government officials. There were payments to young women listed for entertaining Meyer's guests.

The accounts showed over \$5,000 spent on entertainment for Roosevelt and his friends.

**\$76 Dinner Listed**  
 On the night Roosevelt said he was at the White House, Meyer had listed a \$76 dinner with Roosevelt, then an Army Air Forces colonel, and a \$50 charge for girls.

"These could have been two girls I had dinner with," Meyer said. "Their names aren't here. If their names were here, it would help."

Later he said "it may have been Colonel Eldson" at the hotel with him, referring to Col. Harry Eldson, who was a member of a Roosevelt-headed mission which recommended that the government buy Hughes' photo reconnaissance plane.

(A \$22,000,000 contract for this plane was let after Roosevelt's recommendation. Earlier, Army Air Corps experts had ruled

Aug. 5 — (AP) — An Hungarian arrested in U. S. custody today after being freed from three political prisoners the aid of an American official while his captors were transferring him from one to another.

The official identified the man as Stephen Thuransky, a farmer near Columbus and a naturalized American. Thuransky's escape took place in the Marko Thuran area where Thuransky made a break through the lines. Thuransky is reported to have knocked out his three guards, while a second, who was shot by Thuransky, was wounded and fell into the rear of an American legation car.

The official said Thuransky escaped the car and fled to a house. An official who had been seen by the prisoner, pushed Thuransky into the car behind him and drove away.

The official said the three men were "just stood guard" when he made his escape.
