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Bonus Checks Move Faster

As Many as 1,100 Being Mailed Daily; Double Prior Figure

Hartford, Aug. 15.—The state bonus machine, despite a number of obstacles, is now turning out as many as 1,100 checks a day.

This figure, announced today by Gov. Ernest Noyes, bonus division director, is a 100 per cent increase over several weeks ago.

Calculations disclose that if a speed of 1,100 checks is maintained daily, most of the state's 240,000 veterans will have their mid-1946 bonus checks by the end of the summer 1948. Bonus officials, however, refuse to make any prediction.

"We're getting them out just as fast as possible," says Colonel Noyes.

The two major factors holding down production are lack of efficient machine equipment and demands made by veterans for return of their original discharge papers.

The latter makes it necessary for a number of employees to be assigned in leaving through all applications.

Local National Guardsmen Help Fight Fire at Camp

Camp Edwards, Mass., Aug. 13 (Special) — Manchester National Guardsmen were among those who helped fight a fire last night at Camp Edwards. The blaze, started by artillery tractor fire earlier in the afternoon, burned several hundred acres of forest near the base range before it was extinguished.

Volunteers were rushed to the site of the fire, which was already being fought by Camp Edwards personnel. Fire fighting equipment was hauled out and after several hours, the smoke-covered Guardsmen had stopped the progress of the blaze. 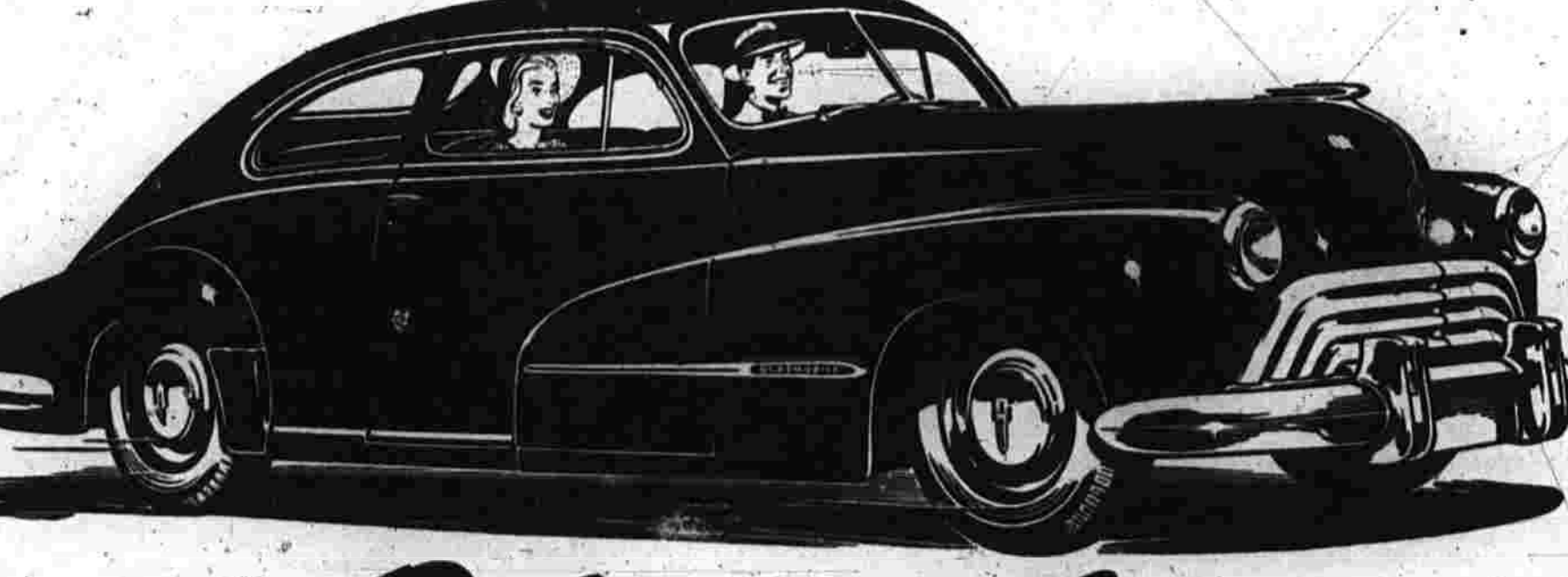

Business Area Is Oiled Today Work Started Early and Advanced Quickly as Street Is Deserted

Oiling of Main street from the Center south to Hartford road, got under way this morning at 8 o'clock. At that time a force of men arrived and started putting up barriers in the middle of the street from the Center to Park street, directing traffic from both ways onto the west side of the street.

Men then started to work with sweep brooms sweeping the street and shortly after seven o'clock the first application of oil was made. This was covered at once with fine screened sand, which was necessary to take care of the area, and this was followed some time with an application of sand.

About 8:30 two automobile trucks started dragging brushes along the highway. Work was started on the west side. At 10:30 the highway was completely closed to traffic. Work was then started on the east side.

Weather conditions were ideal, and today being a Mercantile holiday there were few autos or pedestrians on the streets. The store closed, there was not the usual number of people drifting into Main street buildings.

Work was later started from Park street to the terminus and this being narrow it is expected that the entire work will be completed by nightfall.

Time Aids The Dutch While, yesterday, the UN Security Council was voting over the objections of the Netherlands, Britain, Belgium and France, to give representatives of the Indonesian Republic the privilege of stating their case before the Security Council, there were reports from both sides in Indonesia of repeated violations of the military truce in Indonesia.

Hollywood Ending Predicted The theatre owners of Britain, announcing that they cannot get along without Hollywood's production, were thinking of numbers rather than of quality. British theatres show some 450 films a week. The number of British film industry can produce only about 80. Although it may be true enough that one British film is usually worth at least five Hollywood products, they can't understand it that they do not have the same disposition eye for American acts that our foreign exhibitors do have. We Americans know how we feel, and therefore we do not understand that many of our acts must inevitably give an impression abroad which is exactly opposite to the way we individually Americans do feel. People abroad, unfortunately for our reputation, look at where we are on the world map. They see the remarkable extension of American military power which has taken place since the war.

They look at our new possessions in the Pacific. They look at our retention of a base in the Azores and in Greenland, still without the formal consent of the countries involved. They look at our flourishing atomic bomb. They look at the grandiose strength of the greatest navy the world has ever known. They look at our continual preparations for war. They look at things like our military mission in Iran. They see our great bomber parade over their heads. They see us well on the way toward the abandonment of that feature of American life which used to be in the eyes of Europe, our most precious advantage and freedom—our refusal to adopt military conscription.

Seeing all these things, and adding them up, and not knowing what is in the hearts of individual Americans, they come to one automatic conclusion, which is that the United States is feasting its oats as a world power, and has arrived at that stage in its own historic development when it is ready to undertake world domination.

Well, for that matter, some of us Americans are altogether too sure that what we feel in our own hearts is going to be America's policy in the world. Some of us are too indifferent to the contrast between what is in our own hearts and minds and what our President, State Department, and War and Navy departments are doing through this post-war era, our words have been words of peace, but our acts have been something else again. Knowing that we ourselves, as individuals, do not want any policy of aggression or aggrandizement, we have assumed that the words of our leaders are somehow intended to be for their acts. But too many people abroad do not think so. And, instead of nursing them for their stupidity or their prejudice, it would be very well for Americans to review their own acts in relationship to their own words and feelings, and see if we cannot practice peace as clearly as we preach it.
