Basic Food Prices Despite Recession

Near All Time Peak

Chicago, Sept. 13.—(AP)—The nation's basic food prices, despite some recent recessions, today were near the all-time peak reached after the first World War and the debate over the high cost of living also appeared near a crescendo.

At the country's primary market yesterday there were price declines in butter, eggs, corn, oats and lamb—and consumers watched today to see if the downward trend would continue.

But eggs still were selling for \$1 a dozen in some cities; steaks were \$1 a pound and higher and butter continued to sell near and over \$1 a pound.

Consumer resistance was organized consumer resistance in many cities and government and other officials expressed their views on the cause of the cost of living and offered suggestions to combat the high prices.

### The Doctor Says:

**Penicillin Slows Trench Mouth**

Penicillin slows trench mouth in a few days, but dentists say it may be necessary before complete cure results can be expected.

A normal mouth contains many germs, including one type which, under certain conditions, overgrows the surface of the gums and produces inflammation. This condition was common in World War I, with men in the trenches, because of lack of facilities for mouth care, but it was not as prevalent in World War II.

When this infection occurs, the patient complains of fever, loss of appetite, general weakness and sore mouth. The gums are red, swollen and covered with a membrane which may extend into the throat. The patient may have a bad breath, the gums are swollen and bleed easily. The condition is usually treated with penicillin, which is given in the form of tablets or by injection. The treatment usually takes about a week, but the condition may recur if the patient does not take proper care of his mouth.

Trench mouth can develop if the teeth are decayed or covered with tartar. Small patches occur around the neck of the teeth, but in the mouths of children, but the condition clears when the teeth are cleaned.

At one time it was believed that the disease was highly contagious, but it is not likely that much trench mouth is contracted from one person to another. The condition develops from mouth neglect.

### Porter Talks On Economics

Former Price Boss Declares It Is Too Late To Do Anything

Atlanta, Ga., Sept. 12.—Paul Porter, last federal price-board under OPA, looked gloomily today at America's economic future, and said the nation would be lucky if it escaped a "hard" future.

The towering former price administrator, now in private practice as an attorney, said in an interview that the nation's little man faces ever-tougher slidding—and there's nothing much that congress can do about it.

"There are certain things that could have been done," he said, "but they were not done. The consumer has been left to the mercy of government apathy and inaction, which is far more than anything that congress can do about it."

Porter said a new kind of isolationism was developing in America. On one hand, he said, is an economy bias which would limit American aid to Europe. On the other, he continued, are those who say America is causing big trouble—although more went overseas during the war period—control. "I am afraid," he said, "that from lack of any positive program or policy, we are going to get our foreign program, with result that we will come nearer Europe to a kind of economic despair which will lead to complete Sovietization."

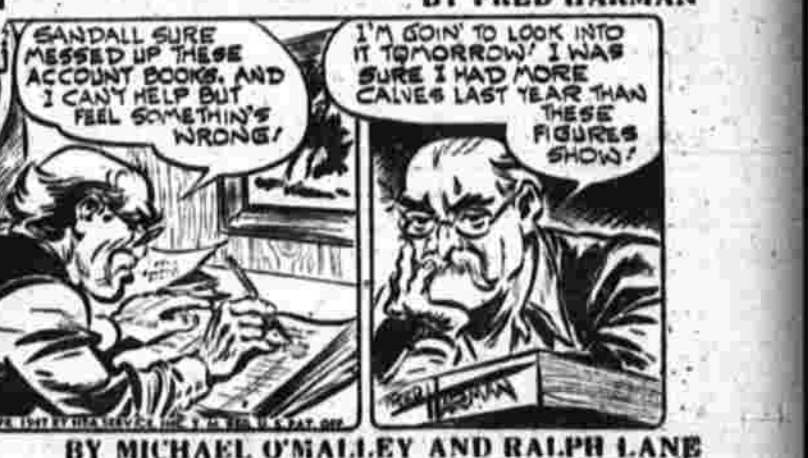
