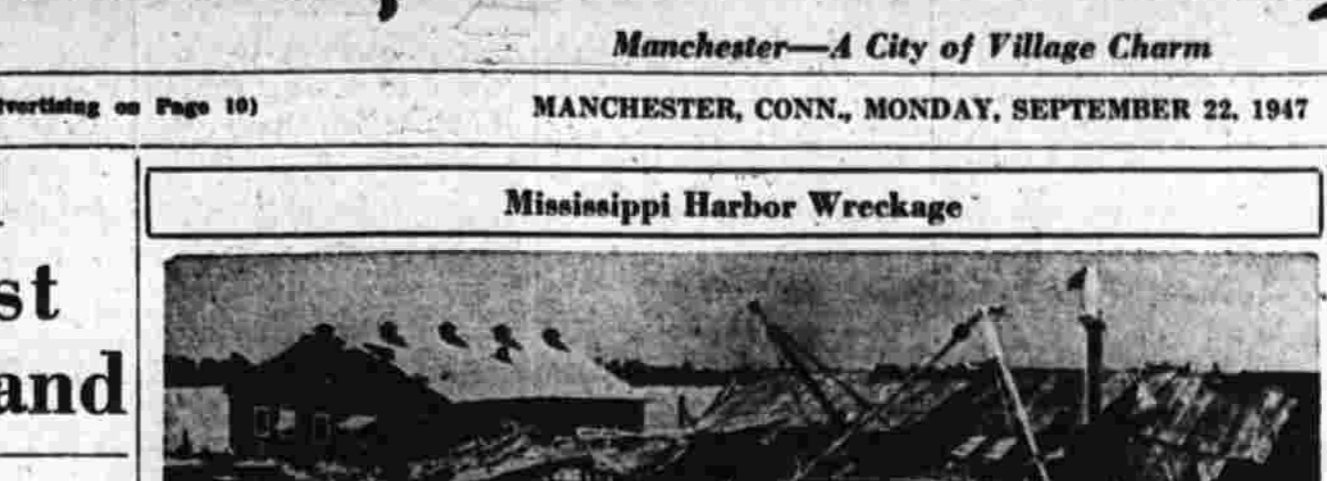

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Claim Woman Assaulted Tot

Neighbors Testify Child Was Beaten by Housekeeper; Found Guilty

Frances Sevora, housekeeper at 19 Ensign street and former resident of Hartford, was found guilty this morning of the charge of assault and battery of a four-year-old child and was sentenced by Judge Raymond B. Bowers to serve sixty days in jail.

Neighbors of Miss Sevora, who is employed by Clifton Iahel, filed a complaint with Chief Samuel Gordon on September 13, stating that Miss Sevora had inflicted several scratches on the face, neck and arms of the child whose screams had attracted their attention.

Doctor Alfred Sundquist was summoned by Chief Gordon to examine the child, Alexander Iahel, and in his testimony, Dr. Sundquist stated that he found the child to be severely marked about the face and neck with what appeared to be scratches, and that on the right shoulder blade there was a bruise that he pronounced was caused by human teeth.

Each Child From Iahel Mrs. Emily Franchia, of 172 McKee street, one of the complainants, stated that she found the child in the questions and answers stated that on several occasions she had heard Miss Sevora screaming threats at Alexander Iahel and that on one occasion she had removed the child from the Iahel home in order to treat some scratches which had been inflicted on him.

Other witnesses for the prosecution, Raymond Marston, and Mrs. Estelle Olson, 13 Oak Grove street, and Alexander's sister, supported the above.

Throughout the above questioning, the attorney for the defense, Nathaniel Bergman, of Hartford, attempted to prove that only because a witness was introduced into evidence and that in fact there was no direct evidence against the accused.

Mr. Bergman called Miss Deibel to the stand and questioned her closely, but she denied she had ever struck or scratched the child and stated that she had on occasion administered spankings but only as punishment and never in anger. In cross examination by the prosecutor, John M. Sevora, Deibel contradicted herself, Judge Bowers attempted to clarify some of her statements, but finally gave up this practice and allowed the trial to continue.

Mr. Bergman next called Clifton Iahel to the stand and in his testimony stated that he had no reason whatever to believe that Miss Sevora was guilty of punishing his child in the manner described but rather that the child had told him that the bruises and scratches had been inflicted in an argument with "some boys on the corner." Ronald Iahel, 15, an older brother of Alexander, was also called and supported the testimony of his brother.

At the conclusion of the trial, after much examination and cross-examination, both the prosecution and the defense rested without closing statements. Judge Bowers found the defendant guilty and gave her a suspended jail sentence and a fine of \$100. It was the opinion of Prosecutor John M. Sevora that a suspended jail sentence and a fine of \$100 was in order and in announcing sentence Judge Bowers placed the penalty at sixty days with the fine suspended. He said that he had been petitioned by Judge Bowers to request and set the bond at \$500.

national bank for reconstruction and development to meet payments on machinery and other capital expenditures. This total \$183,000,000 as the number of dollars to be supplied. This was a figure which included trade deficits with both the United States and other American nations—but a conference spokesman said the total dollar deficit would have to be underwritten by the United States.

Possibility of Surplus However, the report speculated on the possibility of a surplus in dollars from trading with countries outside the western hemisphere which do not participate in the Marshall plan. It said that surplus might reach \$2,100,000,000 in the four years. This surplus, it became available, might reduce the United States deficit to \$18,000,000,000. The Paris meeting was in response to Marshall's proposal that European nations get together, decide what they could do themselves to restore their war-torn economy, and help the world. Marshall's proposal, advanced last June, invited the United States to do what it could to help them.

Long-Range Program This program, however, is a long-range one. A more immediate problem is how Europe is to get the food and fuel to take care of the approaching winter. This is the question with which President Truman and his top aides are now wrestling. Marshall has indicated strongly that he called into session to deal with it. Mr. Truman's attitude is reported to be that he is not convinced a special session is needed.
