Sicilian Beauty Married Today

Ceremony at Springfield Removes Threat of Her Deportation

Springfield, Mass., Oct. 20.—(AP)—Blonde Analia Salomone, 19-year-old Sicilian beauty, whose mail was filled with proposals of marriage after the breaking of her engagement to the war veteran who brought her to America, was married today to Carmelo J. Catanio, 23, of Enfield, Conn.

Had she not been married today, she would have faced deportation.

A 6 a. m. mass and marriage ceremony—in an almost empty church—resulted in disappointment to the crowds who thronged to Mount Carmel church two hours before the ceremony.

Mr. Catanio, who is a native of Italy, was married to Miss Salomone at 11:30 p. m. at United Congregational Church.

Miss Salomone, a native of Palermo, came to the United States last summer as the prospective bride of Michael J. Catanio, a 23-year-old Italian, who had posted a \$1,000 bond for her passage to this country.

Father Ludessi said that Miss Salomone told him last night that she had decided to marry Michael Catanio, who had been dissolved by "mutual consent."

Stay Tights Extended
News of the broken engagement immediately brought 60 proposals of marriage by mail, largely from war veterans. Syracuse luncheon officials vice extended her original 30-day stay in this country but today was the final deadline.

In the meantime, Miss Salomone at first introduced Louis Cadeo, Westfield, Mass., as "my new boyfriend." But last Thursday she and Catanio announced their intentions. They then obtained a divorce from Cadeo and a special dispensation from the Italian consul in Springfield, Mass., to allow her to marry Catanio.

Mrs. Charles Mendola, aunt with whom Analia has lived was not at the ceremony today at which two Enfield, Conn., men, Joseph Barber and Henry Jones, were witnesses. Only five other persons were in the church to join the bride and groom.

Catanio is employed as a lion fier in the Bigelow-Sanford carpet mills in Thomaston, Conn.
