# Orford Village Homes Sales to Start Nov. 15

About 200 Families Affected; May Have Year of Grace to Find New Home, It Is Reported

Eight to report again on developments in Orford Village today. The survey of opinion within the coming year unless legal blocking action can be devised according to Charles Hurlbert, village resident.

Mr. Hurlbert stated he would prefer to state that his information comes from "an authoritative source" rather than say it is "rumor".

Hurlbert is a member of the local project steering committee. The committee is the joint project steering committee of tenants living in all of the federal developments in this area.

Have Year of Grace

No longer, under FIA rules, will project residents get first choice in the purchase of homes. Their only protection now—and this may be altered if it is reported—is a grace period of one year from the time of sale in which to find themselves a new home. That at this time, they are spared the embarrassment of being pulled from their homes, but tenant committee members have no faith in this ruling. The previous purchase rules have not been junked.

At the present time, veterans living in the project have priority in purchase. That means that any part of the country may buy. After that come those others who make their homes in the project.

Call it ill-advised

Although this rule is unfair and ill-advised, project residents and some town officials have held that it goes beyond the limits of just consideration of those situated in the village. Mr. Hurlbert stated this morning that he feels that only the efforts of the residents themselves, through legal action, can save them their homes or the right to purchase them later.

He said it is his personal view that further appeal to the state senators and congressmen will bring little result, and that the officials are giving mostly lip service to the project residents and not actually coming through with assistance.

It is his impression, Hurlbert stated, that the residents must fully prepare themselves for a legal action that may include the obtaining of an injunction to halt the sale.

The sale of units in the Plainville project is progressing daily, he said, and he believes that Manchester village must "fight their battle in Plainville" to bring matters to a head there before sales action is taken here.

# Self Interest Ruling World

Sense of Community Has Been Lost, Says Rev. W. Ralph Ward

In his sermon at South Methodist church yesterday morning, Rev. W. Ralph Ward, Jr., preaching upon the theme "A Simple Answer to Desperate Need," called upon the Congress of the United States at its special session to come to grips with special issues upon the ground bases of justice and mercy, and cease temporizing in terms of what is purely for the best self interest of our own people.

The sense of community has been lost in the modern world, said Mr. Ward, because each individual and each nation is thinking and acting primarily according to the standards of expediency without regard for the ethical principles which are fundamental to the Judeo-Christian religion, the main support of western culture. We have, he said, no objective standard of reference. "We are concerned about high prices of food and housing, but little or nothing is said about just prices of food and housing. We think about helping Europe in terms of food and not in terms of the desperate need of Europeans."

Should extreme crisis come we will make a sacrifice of our youth in war, but are hesitant about making the sacrifice of a few million bushels of wheat which in the long run might prevent war. In other days people thought God wanted to use the words of Micah a sacrifice of the fruit of the body for the sin of the soul, a human sacrifice, when in truth all that was required was "to do justice, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with God."

# Inflation Seen as Helping To Cut Down Joblessness

Washington, Oct. 27.—Inflation is helping to keep down joblessness, the Federal Reserve Bulletin said today.

"As long as inflationary pressures continue strongly, there is little likelihood that unemployment will increase greatly," the bulletin said. "The current labor market is fairly small."

But it also said that "pressures for wage increases are likely to continue unless living costs are stabilized or reduced, because continued advances in prices, particularly in food prices, are placing increasing pressure on the living standards of many workers."

President Truman is calling a special session of Congress for November 17 to consider aid for Europe said that while prices and the cost of living, high Labor Market Appears Firm.

The Federal Reserve bulletin declared "the labor market currently appears to be firm, on the whole." It commented that:

1. Employers hiring new workers have become more selective than earlier with regard to age, sex and previous experience of workers.

2. Expanded expansion of staffs are reported by relatively few industries and the number of additional workers needed in such places is fairly small.

3. The rate at which workers voluntarily quit jobs has declined and in July was lower than in any July since 1941.

"This suggests that workers generally are finding job opportunities less plentiful than earlier and that the restlessness felt earlier by many veterans, which took the form of frequent job changes, has been reduced," the article said.

Other Points in Analysis

Other points in the analysis included:

About 1,500,000 more persons are working or looking for work than had been anticipated on the basis of pre-war trends, but they are concentrated in the 14-19 age group and in women over 35 and men over 33.

Employment in domestic services, which declined throughout the war and early post-war period, has increased sharply since mid-1946 and is currently 250,000 higher than a year ago.
