Warnings Given of 'Civil War' in Turbulent Debate in Assembly

Rome, Nov. 14.—Italy's powerful left, seething with suppressed anger since Premier Alcide De Gasperi kicked it out of the cabinet last May, was openly and adamantly on the warpath today, sounding warnings of 'civil war' during turbulent Communist Assembly debate last night over prolonged violence sweeping the entire peninsula.

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Rent Ceilings Plan Favored

Continuation Expected To Be Voted by Newly Formed Committee

Hartford, Nov. 14.—(AP)—Continuation of rent ceilings on the 125,000 rental units in the Hartford area is expected to be voted by the newly formed defense committee when it meets tonight with Area Housing Director James T. Sullivan, it was learned today.

Because of the continued seriousness of the housing shortage here, it is understood the committee will recommend to National Housing "Expedient" Type Woods that existing Federal rent controls remain in effect.

At the same time, the advisory group headed by Attorney Milton W. Haveric is expected to call for public hearings before it reaches a decision on whether to recommend a blanket rent increase for the Hartford area.

The committee's office has asked for a decision on the two questions before 11 a. m.

Under the new Federal rent law, the Advisory Committee had decided whether rent controls should be lifted, whether the existing ceilings should be raised or left alone, and to advise whether individual landlords should receive upward rent adjustments under the hardship provisions of the law.

The local Advisory board was named by Governor Wadsworth and is expected to be formed by the national housing expedient.

In New London Monday evening, the Rent Advisory board voted to recommend continuation of Federal rent ceilings.

Demands Full Investigation

In the House of Commons, Winston Churchill, the opposition leader, disclosed that he had demanded a full investigation of a select committee of the incident which led to Dalton's resignation. Some observers saw in this the possibility of a full-blown revolt to oust the Attlee cabinet.

Dalton's resignation marked the first break in Labor's five year rule since the death of Ramsay MacDonald. Dalton, Foreign Secretary Ernest Bevin and Lord President of the Council, Aneurin Bevan, were seen as the main pillars of the government since Labor came to power in 1945.

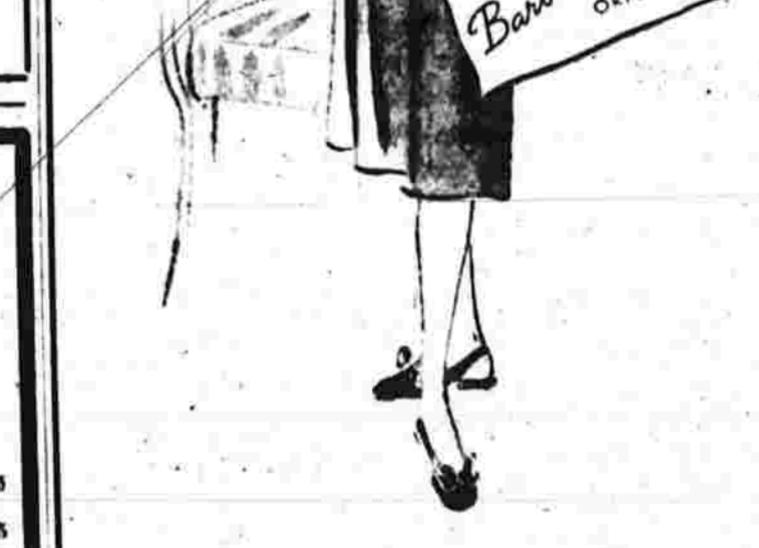

Boy's Estate Can Sue Dairy

Hartford, Nov. 14.—(AP)—A Superior court jury today had paved the way for the estate of 13-year-old Andrew J. Anderson of New Britain to sue a Newtonington dairy company for \$20,000 damages for the boy's death in a fall from one of the company's trucks.

Under the jury's finding, if accepted by the court, the boy's estate will be permitted to sue the firm. Otherwise, the case would have come under the workmen's compensation act, which would have limited by statute to \$20 in burial fees.

The suit was brought by John F. Anderson, of New Britain, father of the boy, who was killed May 26, 1946, in a fall from a truck owned by the Spring Brook Farm Dairy, Inc. and being driven at the time by James W. Danaher of East Hartford, at that time the driver and now the husband of the boy's sister.

Filed for Assistance

On May 18, 1946, the boy was driving a truck to assist in a truck by Danaher, who also paid him two dollars for assistance. A truck accident was in effect the day the boy was killed. The estate charged that the boy's death was caused by the negligence of the dairy company.

Council for the boy's estate in the case against the dairy acted as counsel for the dairy in a suit which was brought by the United States Federal grand jury in Springfield, which charged that the boy's death was caused by the negligence of the dairy company.

Judge Roberts read decision on a motion by the dairy's counsel to have the jury's finding set aside.

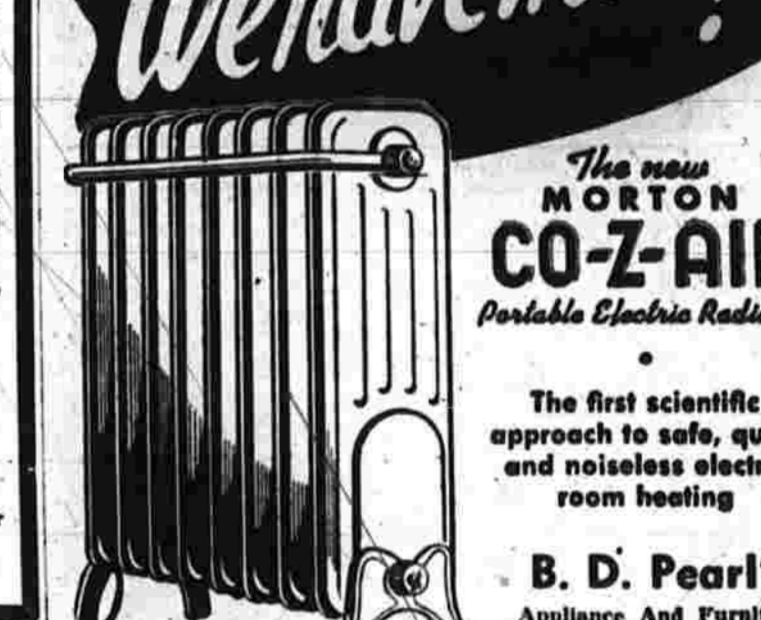
