Import Curbs Cause Uproar

Protests from Consumers and Producers Piling Up in Canada

Ottawa, Nov. 24.—Protests from consumers and producers alike continued to swamp Canadian officials today in the wake of the government's decision to ease an American dollar shortage by cutting imports.

Prices of goods have soared—rocketing as high as \$600 in the case of some motor cars—as a result of the government's "austerity" program announced last week restricting imports ranging from automobiles and jewelry to fresh fruits and vegetables.

The government hopes to save upwards of \$300,000,000 on foreign exchange and make the national economy more nearly self-sufficient.

Back to Present Cases: Meat and poultry processors, importers and consumers sought appointment to present their cases to government officials as effects of the new curbs were felt throughout the dominion.

Assault Charges Noted: A Vancouver union official warned that restrictions on imports of fresh fruit and vegetables from the U.S. might create a "bad situation" in British Columbia mines and logging camps this winter.

In Toronto there was a run on fruits and vegetables. The reported seizure of banned goods from returning Canadian visitors to the U. S. Canadians are permitted to spend up to \$300 a year in the states, but can't bring home toys, typewriters, electric radios, electric razors and many other items included in the ban.

Freeze Restricting Controls: The Canadian Congress of Labor Urged the government to enact price controls in order to lessen farmers' own shipping losses of many Canadian.



White and Negro Audience in Virginia Cheers Three Minutes

South Lake City, Nov. 24.—(AP)—Mrs. Clara Booth Luce last night called Secretary of State Marshall for being what she termed "vague" in his Tuesday night Chicago address.

The former Connecticut congressman in an address before a capacity audience at the Hotel Utah said Marshall did not give the "basic issues" between Communism and democracy.

In discussing Marshall's talk and assailing Communism, Mrs. Luce departed from her announced theme. She had been scheduled to address the meeting, held under the auspices of the Salt Lake City Convention League, on her conversion to the Catholic faith.

"If our secretary of state doesn't know what the basic dispute is between Communism and democracy it is a great tragedy," she said. "I think he knows what the basic issue is and I can't understand why he doesn't tell us what he knows. The basic issue is human freedom."

"Communism adds a new dimension to human slavery," she asserted. "It conditions and educates a man to believe that he must exercise his free will to seek slavery because he is not free."

Personal Meeting "Vital" Earlier, in a speech at Hampton, Va., Wallace said a personal meeting between President Truman and President Stalin is "absolutely vital" in an effort to settle differences between the United States and Russia.
