### May Move To Dallas

### Chance Vought Division of United Aircraft Tells Employees

Hartford, Nov. 28.—The Chance Vought Division of United Aircraft Corporation, told its 7,000 employees today it has taken action which eventually may result in the division moving operations from its present quarters at Stratford to Dallas, Texas.

Officials of the corporation, however, were quick to announce the contemplated action in no way affects operations at East Hartford where some 18,000 persons are employed.

Informed of "Real Facts" a bulletin signed by R. B. DeLoach, Chance Vought general manager, informed Stratford employees of the "real facts" concerning possible transfer to the Texas location.

The Navy Department some time ago submitted a prospectus to all airplane companies dealing with the availability of the former North American Aviation Company plant in Dallas, the bulletin said.

Because of the many advantages of the plant layout, climate and suitability for testing jet planes in Texas, an exploratory proposal was submitted to the Navy by Chance Vought. Other aircraft companies, it was pointed out, also understood to have submitted similar proposals on the Dallas works.

At the present time, the bulletin continued, no decision has been reached in the matter either by Chance Vought or the Navy. In the event the division takes over the plant it is expected that from 15 to 20 months would be required to complete the move to Dallas.

Chance Vought currently is developing the XP-52, a high speed jet fighter plane, for the Navy. The Dallas plant would be used solely for production of jet planes.
