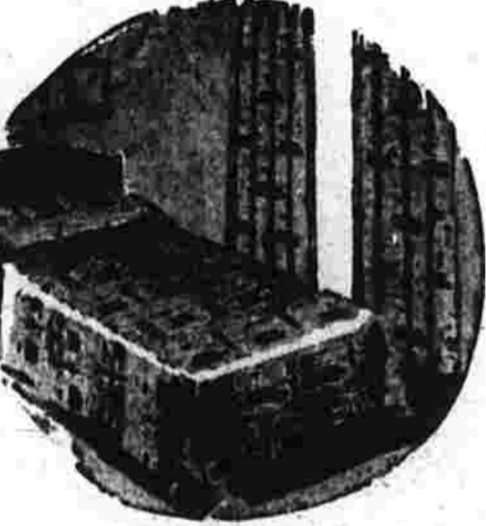

The Doctor Says:

 The blood flows down in order to fight the germs and as this raises the pressure, tissue fluid is not absorbed into the blood. Excess tissue fluid is also absorbed into the blood, and this is a common symptom of many diseases, and there is a special treatment for each form.

This results in an accumulation of fluid in the tissues which would normally flow through the kidney into the urine.

Too Little Will Waste All
 In the attempts on the part of some members of the Senate to make a trimming in the \$507,000,000 emergency aid appropriation designed to help tide Italy through the winter until the long-range Marshall Plan can begin to take effect, we have a sample of the way in which to accompany this bill through its progress toward enactment and financing by both Houses in Congress. Our good Congressmen are instinctively afraid of the "sucker's role." They are very sure that if the administration does more than is really needed, and some of these Congressmen are not necessarily against aid to Europe in itself. They are not necessarily trying, as are some of their fellows, to cut off entire foreign aid programs through amendments and cuts and restrictions. They are seriously concerned with seeing that the American taxpayer is not called upon to pay more than is absolutely essential for the purposes of our foreign aid policy.
 Ordinarily, their instinct would be good legislative instinct, good public service.
 This is, however, one of the very few instances in history where too tight a purse-string would be a total error in policy. The great danger to our handling of this foreign aid program, both in its emergency phase and in its long-term Marshall Plan phase, is that it will not be big enough. That danger far overshadows what would be the normal danger in such expenditure of American money—the danger that we might provide too much.
 Penny is actually where this policy is concerned, worse than wastefulness.
 That is so because wastefulness should at least be on the safe side of the ledger, guaranteeing that we would be doing more than we need to do.
 That is so because penny would cancel out the success and value of whatever we do expend.
 We have held of the arm of a drowning man. We are arguing in Congress, over how hard we shall pull on that arm.
 It may be that we decide to pull harder than we need to, in which case we flop the drowning man out on the bank, at the expense of greater exertion on our part than was really necessary. But then, at least, the man will be saved from drowning.
 And it may be, on the other hand, that we decide to pull just hard enough to get the man's nose up out of water. If we stop there, we will be leaving his mouth still under water, and he will eventually drown or starve to death, only with more of a struggle than if we had left him alone completely. In that event, what we do expend will have been wasted completely. The man drowns anyway.
 The worst error we can permit, then, is that of underestimating the amount of success Europe needs. To underestimate that amount by even a shade might be equal to complete failure in our program, leaving us open to the disintimation of those who are trying to help, leaving us open to the scorn of Russia, leaving us open to the charge of having insufficiently sacrificed upon ourselves at home to constructive purpose.
 The sure way to get nothing for our aid to Europe is to make it too little.
 No one can know that the amounts the administration itself is asking are equal to the task. It

 In the Economic Commission meeting, the issue was whether or not a representative of the Indonesian Republic should be allowed to appear before the Commission to present this case in favor of membership on the Commission for his government.
 The United States joined The Netherlands, France, and Britain in voting against giving the Indonesian Republic the right of membership.
 Here, as from the beginning of the Indonesian issue, America's diplomatic dice were loaded against the cause of Indonesian freedom. It is something most Americans have great difficulty understanding.

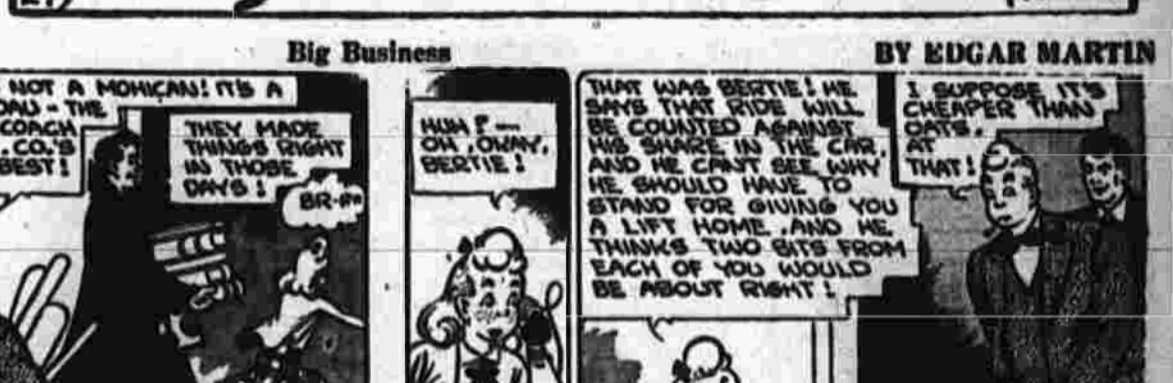
