Connecticut Yankee

The tributes paid a public figure after he is beyond normal hearing of them are not sentimental charity but truth. We are sometimes hypocritical mourners, and given to laudatory extravaganzas no excesses they might better be left completely unaided.

But all the fine things said about Benjamin E. Harwood, former chairman of the Republican State Central Committee, have been true. None of them, in fact, has been quite true enough.

For here was one of the rare and heartening characters who do so much to preserve some balance and proportion in the game of politics.

It was frequently said of Mr. Harwood that he actually had no business in politics. By that it was meant that he was too fine and refined a character to play the political game in traditional fashion, that he looked that faint with the knif, that gusto for the intrigue, that willingness to exchange sincerely for shallow strategy, which so often serves a part of successful participation in politics.

That criticism of him also implied another truth about him — that he was too selfless ever to be open to the kind of personal gain or aggrandizement which is the natural goal of most of the political fraternity. He did not want, from politics, what the politicians want. He was, therefore, a strange number, unloved to the game.

But he was in politics, nonetheless. Fortunately, every one who people like Mr. Harwood do come to politics. And if they do not achieve normal political success, they might be done internationally, as he begins by a simple pledge not to use atomic bombs in war. Why, we reasoned, should we, the only nation to possess the bomb, be the prestige and threat power of our monopoly by agreeing not to use the bomb anyway?

Against this background, the question Mr. Einstein now poses is this: what shall we do when the basis of our previous policy, our own sense of honor, is shattered?

Shall we, when other nations have developed the bomb, regret our own previous refusal to join with all nations in outlawing the bomb as a weapon of war? Shall we, when we have lost what we have mistakenly thought to be our own bargaining power, still insist on our plan of control or none at all? Or shall we be willing to give up what we have, and forms and measures of control we can get by international agreement?

And if we are going to be willing to take what we can get then, when we have lost our bargaining power, how wise have we really been in over-playing our monopoly bargaining power now?

No Risk Being Early Now. Somewhere, we are quite sure, there exists that individual who is completely unruffled by the warnings of the calendar. He or she smiles with superior and tolerant calm at the approach of the normal frenzy of the rest of humanity. For he or she had had Christmas shopping done, and packages all securely wrapped, so long ago that only a reference to notebook can recall what was bought for whom.

For our part, we are sure it is a very fine thing thus to have the business of Christmas giving so efficiently managed. The giver is calm and serene. The gift so selected with a touch of flourish and haste is sure to be eminently practical, and valuable to the giver. It is interesting to think that no blood vessels will be ruptured on either side of such a well-plotted Christmas transaction.

But such good examples notwithstanding, we, the great majority, will now proceed to wallow in our own flustered inefficiency, to operate against long shopping lines and high-priced lists, to make purchases which are wise and mediocre and downright foolish, all being somewhat a matter of chance, to treat our own self-created emergencies as great crises and our eventual emergence from them as personal triumph against great odds.

We, the great majority, are the ones who will engage in dogfights over the last article in a given line, wind up sending Cousin Sam what Cousin Jane sent us last year, and make our climactic purchase some costly piece of foolishness which will mock our own home for years to come. Our checks will be flustered and our eyes excited, as against the calm demeanor of our August and September shopper, and altogether we will have a miserable and thrilling time.

Be that as it may, we are now safe. It is now too late to do our Christmas shopping early. The press will be bad enough and busy enough if we start now. Our reputation for being late is secure. To the stores, men! Three weeks is a little time!
