Rough Stuff Tactics Hit

Lavery Attacks Calling Of State Police in Hershey Plant Strike

New Haven, Dec. 6.—(AP)—Pres. Edward J. Lavery of the state CIO charged state police today with using "rough tactics" in connection with Hershey Malt Products company strike in Andover and Derby.

In a report prepared for the opening of the two-day CIO state convention, Lavery called the four-month old dispute "one of the toughest strikes in Connecticut labor history." He also termed the Hershey management "one of the most anti-labor employers it has ever been my bitter experience to encounter."

Referring to the Thanksgiving day demonstration at the strike scene which resulted in a call for state police and several arrests, Lavery asserted:

"... our enthusiasm for such demonstrations has not been diminished by the rough tactics of thought on the part of an employer that we can be intimidated by a show of armed force by a state agency he has another thing coming."

"Show Labor's Unity"
"CIO unions from all over the state have been picketing at the Hershey plant as a means of showing labor's unity in this struggle and of demonstrating labor's rights. We will continue to be united, we will continue to picket, we will continue to demonstrate."

Lavery's report, in which he announced that he will not seek reelection, came in the midst of reports that the convention delegates would be asked to approve a resolution condemning the use of state police in the Hershey strike.

It preceded by several hours the appearance at a convention speaker of Gov. James L. McConaughy, to whom CIO officials addressed a request earlier this week that state police be removed from the strike scene.

The chief executive made no comment on the request after a two-hour conference in his office with the CIO delegation.

Union Recognition Issues
The strike, involving about 850 workers, centers principally over recognition of the CIO union as a bargaining agent.

Besides the Hershey strike, convention leaders reported, other labor proposals high on the agenda are the Hart-Hartley labor law and the state sales tax. Resolutions demanding abolition of both were expected to come up for action.

Proposals for increased political activity also were in the official convention agenda.

Lavery's report emphasized "the really great accomplishments we can chalk up to our credit in the legislative field."

He said:

"While states all over the country are putting vicious anti-labor legislation on their books in this year's session of their legislatures, we in Connecticut successfully fought off every single piece of special anti-labor legislation that was introduced."

Outstanding Successes
With Lavery's announcement that his present term—his second—would be his last, Mitchell Sverdoff of New Haven was mentioned as his possible successor. The latter is an international representative of the United Automobile Workers and close ally of Walter P. Reuther, UAW president.

Officers will be nominated today with the elections taking place tomorrow.

Later among the speakers for tomorrow are two men prominently mentioned for the Democratic gubernatorial nomination, Chester Bowles and Thomas Dodd.
