Thus Hartford, the insurance city of the world, already the home of 47 insurance companies, becomes the headquarters of a 48th company.

Polyholders Meet Today Mr. Fisher, in an exclusive interview given to The Hartford Times, said direction of Mutual Assurance Company was into the hands of the Hartford group at a meeting of polyholders at the American Bank in Norwich at 2 p. m. today.

At that time he said, the company will accept insurance policies in the name of the Hartford people. Simultaneously, insurance policies in the name of a group of Norwich people will be cancelled, thereby leaving the affairs of the company under direction of the Hartford group.

In addition to Mr. Fisher, the Hartford group includes: John W. Carleton Jr., co-manager of the Hartford branch of the New York investment banking firm of Eastman Dillon & Co. S. Hugh Field, also co-manager in the local office of Eastman Dillon & Co.

Within a short time, they will meet in the capacity of the company's new board of directors and establish headquarters at 251 Tremont street.

Fisher To Be President Mr. Fisher then will be elected president, Mr. Carleton, treasurer; Mr. Field, secretary, and Attorney Adams, general counsel.

Eventually, five other men will join these four on the company's board of directors.

Five Alarms Within Hour

Mrs. Gerald E. Alling, wife of the building's caretaker, was overcome by smoke at the sixth floor landing, she fell down two flights of stairs, recovered, groped her way from the fourth floor to the second, and there was met by a fireman who brought her to the ground.

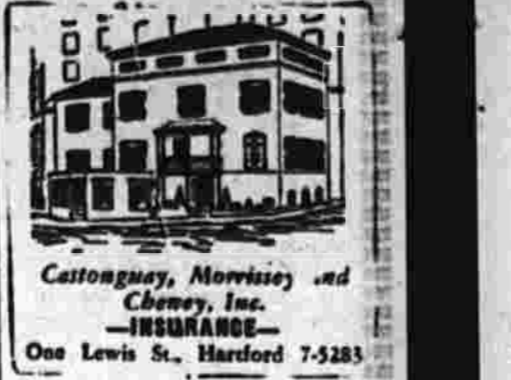
