**State Editors Do Predicting**

Tell What They Think Will Happen During The Next 12 Months

New Haven, Dec. 29.—(AP)—Seven Connecticut editors and a Yale Law school professor, who also write for national magazines, were considerably more in agreement about what will happen in the next year than they were about coming events on the domestic scene.

Most of them, in a prophesying session at the Connecticut Forum of the A. P., considered it unlikely that the year 1948 would bring war to the world, but there was quite a divergence of opinion as to who would be elected president, and who would be the G. O. P. candidates.

The news for a day were Charles C. Hennery of the Hartford Times, Herbert Bracker of the Hartford Courant, and H. J. Thompson of the Torrington Register, Herbert Crapo of the Litchfield Register, E. E. McCullough of the Stamford Advocate, Curtis Johnson of the Danbury News Era, Phil Dudley of the Shore Line Times, Guilford, and Fred Hodell of the Yale Law School, and the Hartford Times, Time, Fortune and the Progressive.

Of those discussing the possibility of war, Bracker, McCullough and Dudley said there would be some news in a very early part of the year, but they would prevent it, Russia is not ready for it, Crapo predicted no major war, but said there would be any peace, instead, aggression would be much more likely to occur in 1949. Thompson qualified with a "maybe" his prediction of war with Russia at the year's end. One of the few flat predictions about the national political scene came from Hodell who said the Republican ticket would be Taft for president and Stassen, or Governor Warren of California, or Senator Wallace of Connecticut for vice president, and that Taft would win. The Democrats' only chance, he said, would be to nominate his former law school classmate, Supreme Court Justice William O. Douglas, for president.

Edwin H. Eidenhower's name cropped up time and again in the discussion. Hodell said the Republicans would nominate Taft, whom he labeled a Conservative, because they would feel that his "crisp" would feel that his

Stamford, Dec. 29.—(AP)—Mrs. W. Archibald Welden, mother of the missing Paula Welden, said today that the girl's parents were "definitely not her daughter."

Charles S. C., Dec. 29.—(AP)—A 19-year-old blonde who looks like Paula Welden, missing Bennington College sophomore, is being held here.

She was taken into custody yesterday after a tourist camp operator reported to police she resembled Paula Welden, who she disappeared from the Vermont college last year.

Using the names of Mary Welden and Mary Garrett, the girl in the missing Paula Welden and told investigators about her home in Bennington.

Fits the Description

County Police Lieutenant Julian T. Williams told reporters he believed her story, but said "she fits the description of Paula Welden almost perfectly."

She is being held until Vermont authorities have a chance to look at her.

The camp operator said she left and returned several days later to register as "Mary Garrett."

Paula Welden, daughter of a Stamford, Conn., engineer, disappeared Dec. 1, 1946 without leaving a trace. She was wearing hiking clothes when last seen leaving the Bennington college campus on a Sunday afternoon, and headed toward the mountains.

Her parents have clung to a belief she is still alive—possibly the victim of kidnaping.

**One Dead, 50 Hurt In Train Wreck**

Corvaca, Tex., Dec. 29.—(AP)—One person was fatally hurt and 50 others injured in the derailment of four cars on the stock Sam Houston Burlington Zephy last night.

Remitt Austin Hollman, Dallas, Tex., was in a Corvaca hospital at 11:50 p. m.—nearly six hours after three chair cars and a diner lunge left the tracks on a 75-foot trestle.

Only two of an estimated 50 persons injured when the heavily loaded train derailed were considered in a serious condition today.

The streamlined train had made a regular scheduled stop here at 6:10 p. m. A few minutes later while traveling at a speed estimated at less than 20 miles an hour the four cars overturned into a dry ditch.

A broken rail was believed to have been the cause of the accident, sheriff Dave Castles reported.

The engine and two of the cars crossed the trestle safely before the first plunged into the ditch. The rest remained upright.

Most of the passengers, W. F. Colbaugh, Houston, Tex., said he heard "something that sounded like a flat tire and the car began to shake."

He was in one of the cars that remained upright.

The train was enroute from Fort Worth to Houston, Texas, when it derailed.

Most of the persons listed as injured received minor bruises and cuts.

Hospital attendants said many were just "shaken up."

On Jan. 7 another ship is scheduled to arrive with food.

**Declares Russia Not Set for War**

Washington, Dec. 29.—(AP)—Francis B. Sayre, president of the United States Political Science Association in which he delivered Sherman tanks and explosives for the allied drive up the peninsula.

Sayre made the assertion in a speech before the American Political Science Association in which he urged the country to go ahead with the Marshall plan for European recovery regardless of a "Soviet campaign of calumny and blustering abuse."

"A rehabilitated Europe will spot the collapse of Soviet plans for world domination," Sayre told the group yesterday.

The former high commissioner to the Philippines declared that Russia's "plotting against human freedom" confronts the world with a major peril.

But he said that "inspite of her provocative words and acts in the past, Russia is not prepared to wage war with any first class nation."

He added, "It is still in Russia's interest to seek 'saving policies.'"

**Predicts Income Tax Cut in 1948**

Washington, Dec. 29.—(AP)—Democratic Senator Edwin C. Johnson of Colorado joined Republican congressional leaders today in forecasting an income tax cut during 1948.

"I think the next session will approve tax reduction even if there is another veto by the president," Johnson told a reporter. "I favor something along the line of the Kautson bill and its every certain to become a law."

The Colorado senator, a member of the Senate's tax-writing finance committee, referred to the \$5,000,000,000 (billion); tax reduction measure sponsored by Chairman Kautson (R-Minn.) of the House Ways and Means committee.

Kautson also sponsored the two bills. President Truman killed with veto earlier this year. Efforts to override failed to yield the necessary two-thirds majority of both House and Senate.

Reds, Britain In Trade Pact

Russia to Ship 750,000 Tons of Grain; Needs Machinery

London, Dec. 28.—(AP)—The Moscow radio says that under the terms of a trade pact signed Saturday in Moscow, Russia will send Britain 750,000 tons of coarse grain in addition to the 500,000 tons of animal feedstuffs previously reported.

The radio quoted a Tass News Agency dispatch as saying that Russia had guaranteed to deliver the grain between February and next September at "prices agreed upon" but not disclosed.

A spokesman for the British Board of Trade confirmed that the pact was signed, but declined to disclose its details.

Tass said that the British government had "agreed to assist in placing orders in Britain by Soviet import organizations for equipment for mechanization of the (Soviet) timber industry, for plywood factories and saw mills, as well as for electrical and other equipment."

Railroad Tracks. Tass declared that Britain had agreed to deliver to the Soviet union in the near future a first classment of rails for narrow gauge railways and to render assistance in the purchase of Soviet locomotives and other equipment.

New London, Dec. 29.—(AP)—Miss Eva Beebe, whose home in nearby Waterford was totally destroyed by fire at the height of Friday's blizzard, was on the critical list from the time she entered the hospital.

The home destroyed by the fire was the one in which Miss Beebe was born and in which the woman had lived alone for a number of years. Her only survivors are two nieces, Mrs. Clara Utley and Mrs. Myra Burdick of Hartford.

Operated in the Red. New Haven, Dec. 29.—(AP)—The New York, New Haven and Hartford railroad operated in the red last month according to the report of its management. It posted a deficit of \$131,871 after fixed and contingent charges. This compares with a deficit of \$108,119 in November, 1946, which included a federal income carry-back credit of \$200,000.

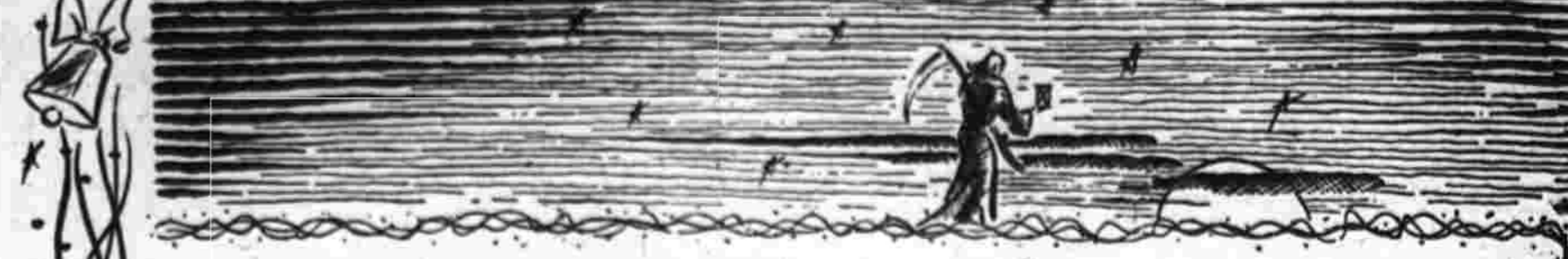
