France Signs Pact With U. S. to Get Aid This Winter

Congress Grants Sum of \$22 Millions to Assist Italy and Austria Also; Public Ceremony Is Held in Paris as Documents Are Sealed

Paris, Jan. 2.—(AP)—France signed a treaty with the United States today accepting conditions offered by the U. S. Congress in granting \$22,000,000 winter aid to France, Italy and Austria. U. S. Ambassador Jefferson Caffery and French Foreign Minister Georges Bidault signed the document in the clock room of the foreign ministry in a session open to the public and heralded by an unusual amount of publicity. Caffery said the grant was "the response of the American people to this emergency situation."

France will receive up to \$328,000,000 of the allotment voted to tide over the three countries until such a time as the Marshall plan for European recovery becomes effective. The Marshall plan, contemplating American grants of \$17,000,000,000 over four years to western European countries, still must be approved by the U. S. Congress.

The treaty stipulates that, unless otherwise agreed between the two governments, France would: Use the aid credits to obtain commodities exclusively from the United States, with the exception of petroleum, which she should seek outside it.

Deposit a special fund for the franc equivalent, at the exchange rate of the international monetary fund, of the value of each item credited.

Place this fund at American disposal for any franc expenses in administering the aid.

Have permission until June 30 to draw on the fund "for effective retirement of the national debt of France or for irrevocable withdrawal of currency from circulation" or other stabilization measures agreed by both parties.

Not re-export any goods received.

Tot Describes Dad's Death

Mother Critically Injured by Man Riding in Their Auto

Hot Sulphur Springs, Colo., Jan. 2.—(AP)—A 25-year-old mother describing herself as Don Tucker of Fort, Ind., admitted in a signed statement last night the fatal shooting a few hours earlier of Robert Hutchins, 20, and the wounding of his wife, Shirley, 20. A blast of gunfire struck the young couple in their automobile 25 miles south of Denver under circumstances still not explained to the satisfaction of authorities.

Mrs. Hutchins' critical condition has prevented her being questioned extensively by detectives.

Her four-year-old son Larry, uninjured in the shooting, told a simple story how "the man shot daddy" and indicated the man had been a hitch-hiker picked up along the highway.

Youngster's Story

The four-year-old related they saw a man standing in the road. "He waved his arm like this," said Larry, motioning his arm up and down.

"The man got into the car and we rode for a long time. He shot daddy."

"It was daddy's gun. Daddy had two guns."

Asked why the man shot his father, Larry answered:

"He told him to turn around and he didn't. He shot him. Momma was crying and talking and he shot her. He lifted her like this and put her in the back seat."

"Yes I cried. He told me to shut up and I did. I didn't cry any more but I told him I over talk if I wanted to. He drove the car real fast and I was scared and held onto the edge of the seat. He drove real fast."

"The man pulled daddy out of the car and dragged him beside the car. He got blood all over him and he took off his coat and threw it away."

"I didn't like the man. He was mean to daddy. He shot daddy and momma. That's why I cried."

Tucker's statement was given to Sheriff Chester McQuerry said Tucker told this story in a signed statement.

He had worked for a Los Angeles company but left there hurriedly after stealing and cashing some company checks.

Tucker became acquainted in a tavern with Hutchins and arrangements were made for Tucker to

14 Persons Are Killed As Two Trains Collide

Former U. S. Envoy to Spain and Argentina Among the Victims; 12 Persons Are Injured

Otterville, Mo., Jan. 2.—(AP)—Alexander W. Weddell, former ambassador to Spain and Argentina, and 13 other holiday travelers were killed in the New Year's Day collision of two passenger trains near this central Missouri town.

Approximately 12 persons were injured, five of whom required hospitalization.

The dead also included Mrs. Alexander W. Weddell and Frank M. Ryan identified as a Hollywood movie director.

The collision occurred during a heavy snow storm while the Missouri Pacific's "The Missouriian" was traveling from St. Louis to Kansas City in two sections.

The engine of the second section rammed into the rear Pullman of the first train, crushing the car so completely that torches were used to cut the wreckage apart and remove the dead.

All of those killed were occupants of the rear Pullman.

The Weddells were en route from their Richmond, Va., home to Tucson, Ariz.

Held Many Posts

Weddell, 71, had served in many diplomatic posts throughout the world. He began his state department career in 1907 when he became secretary to the minister to Denmark. He became ambassador to Argentina in 1933 and served until 1939, then asked President Roosevelt for the post in Spain.

Romania Requesting Visas for Former King To Enter Switzerland

Bucharest, Romania, Jan. 2.—(AP)—The Romanian government asked today for 35 visas for former King Mihai, Queen Mother Helen and their retinue to enter Switzerland. Diplomatic passports were requested for Mihai, who abdicated Tuesday, and his mother.

A spokesman for the Communist-dominated "Popular Democratic Republic" which succeeded the monarchy, said the requests may reach Swiss federal offices in Bern tomorrow, but that a reply is not expected before late Monday or Tuesday, because Swiss offices close at noon on Saturday.

To Meet Princess

(A rendezvous with Princess Anne of Parma-Bourbon appeared likely in Switzerland. The pretty princess said in Copenhagen yesterday it "was love at first sight" at her meeting with Mihai in London in November and that "wherever he goes, I will follow him."

A Budapest dispatch said Mihai had been granted a Hungarian transit visa.)

It was not certain that Switzerland would grant all the 35 visas. Authoritative sources said the Swiss government is concerned with finding out about financial means of Mihai, Helen and all members of their party.

Premier Petru Groza told reporters Wednesday that Mihai would be given a certain allowance for crown lands. It was understood at the time that an initial payment of \$5,000,000 would be paid at once.

His Known Income

(Mihai's known income at the time of abdication was about \$414,000 a year from government grants, royal forests, farm estates and privately owned timber tract.)

In case of Mihai and his mother, the Swiss were represented as wishing to make certain that funds are guaranteed for their living expenses. This, of course, depends on what transfer facilities the Romanian government is prepared to grant.

Switzerland also was said to be inquisitive about the exact business each member of the former king's party has in Switzerland, whether they are bona fide members of the entourage.

New York Area Is Hit By Severe Ice Storm

Breaks in Power Reported in Hundreds of Places as Lines Are Pared by Ice Covering

New York, Jan. 2.—(AP)—A heavy ice storm fastened an icy grip on the New York Metropolitan area today and storm-harried residents were warned a new storm with high winds and freezing temperatures would strike before nightfall.

The Weather Bureau said one or two inches of snow would fall later today with strong winds and lowering temperatures. Ice already had caused hundreds of breaks in power lines, leaving thousands of homes and business places without light, heat or cooking facilities in the nation's most densely populated area.

"Several inches" of snow were forecast by the Weather Bureau within a 50-mile radius south and a 150-mile radius north of the snow-burdened area.

Sleet Blanket Covers State

Highway Crews Just Finish One Job When They Start Another

A dismal mixture of sleet and snow was the New Year's weather greeting to Connecticut. It fell on the 12 to 24 inches of snow already blanketing the state as the old year's parting weather gift.

With sleet making automobile windshields opaque and road surfaces more slippery than they already were, driving became even more hazardous.

Wary members of state and municipal highway maintenance crews, just finishing the task of plowing away the snow from the heavy storm of a week ago today, were out again with sand trucks, reducing the hazard of curves, hills and other more treacherous spots.

No Serious Accidents

No serious accidents were reported as a result of the storm. The snow-sleet mixture held off until almost New Year's Eve revelers had wended their way home, and then began falling yesterday morning.

Early today the New Haven Weather Bureau said the snow and sleet measured one and a quarter inches and had changed, at that time, to "very light freezing rain" over most of the state.

Child Is Slain Near Her Home

Cleveland, Jan. 2.—(AP)—The knife-pierced body of a blonde, eight-year-old cast aside girl who disappeared while on an errand for her father, was found last night on a neighbor's porch, less than a block from her home.

Detective Lieut. Peter Kelle identified the victim as Sheila Ann Tukey, daughter of a 34-year-old machine grinder. Kelle said that what appeared to be stab wounds from both a knife and an ice pick were found on Sheila's back and head.

He said that Sheila's clothes were torn and stained and that blood from her face was smeared on her hands and a nearby window. The body also bore severe bruises, Kelle reported.

The girl's death today was ruled a homicide by Coroner S. R. Gerber. He said she had been stabbed

Most Damaging of Disturbances This Winter's Path Runs from Texas-Oklahoma Border to New England; All Power Lines Down in Hundreds of Communities; Train Services Stalled

This winter's most damaging storm laid a treacherous sheath of ice and snow from the Oklahoma-Texas border to New England today, dealing a stiff blow to communications, travel and essential city services. Hundreds of communities across the northern half of the country were without electric power or telephone service. Trains were running generally behind schedule, airplanes were grounded in several areas and highway travel slowed to a snail's pace.

Damage will run well into the millions, on the basis of preliminary estimates.

Turned into Sleet

The storm started as rain, turned to sleet and was followed by snow. The west got the brunt of the storm's fury on New Year's Eve, with the Midwest feeling it on New Year's Day. The storm center moved into New England today.

As a heavy ice storm fastened its grip on the snow-harried east, forecasters warned high winds and more snow would strike before nightfall.

Shakes in Power

In New York City, which is still digging out from last Friday's record 33.5-inch snowfall, ice caused hundreds of breaks in power lines. Thousands of homes and business places were without light, heating or cooking facilities. Thousands of commuters stayed home.

A thick coat of ice blanketed streets and thoroughfares, completely halting the operations of the Lackawanna railroad's three electrified branches running from Hoboken to Newark, Gladstone and Montclair in New Jersey. The branches carry some 36,000 daily commuters.

In New Jersey, hundreds of wires were down and numerous residential communities without power. An official of the Jersey Central Power and Light Company said the condition was the "worst in my experience."

The pelting sleet and "snow" brought New England its third severe storm in 10 days. Forecasters predicted a snowfall of eight to 12 inches by midnight. Some places already were covered by earlier snows ranging up to two feet.

Tornado Rips Through States

Twenty Persons Killed, 250 Injured, Hundreds Are Made Homeless

Shreveport, La., Jan. 2.—(AP)—Bitterly cold but clearing weather gripped Dixie today as five tornado-ripped southern states set about burying 30 victims, patching up scores of injured, and sheltering hundreds of homeless.

The tornadoes struck just as the Old Year was dying and the New Year was coming in. They hit first in Louisiana, Arkansas and Tennessee, then in Mississippi and Alabama.

The confirmed death toll by states was Louisiana 15, Tennessee 2, Arkansas 2 and Mississippi 1. No casualties were reported in Alabama.

A Red Cross survey last night listed 250 persons injured, 343 homes destroyed and 290 damaged. An emergency fund of \$100,000 was set aside by the Red Cross to provide emergency relief and assist in rehabilitation work.

Town Worst Hit

Worst hit of all the communities was Cotton Valley, La., where 12 persons were killed and property damage was estimated by a local contractor, G. E. Speed, at \$1,000,000.

Mayor Sam Coyle of the little town of 1,800 said the place was twisted into so much scrap lumber and estimated that 200 persons
