



### Public Works Jobs Climb

#### All Areas Except New England Increase in Nine Months of 1947

Washington, Jan. 5.—(AP)—All areas of the nation except New England have registered an increase in public works contracts awarded during the first nine months of 1947, as compared with the same period in 1946.

The Federal Works agency said in a report yesterday that the total value of the awards was \$1,301,000,000 compared with \$1,176,000,000 for the first nine months of 1946.

The Pacific state reported an increase of 66 per cent, while the South Atlantic states were up 60 per cent.

New England declined 11 per cent.

All Regions Build Schools

Modest gains for new highway work were recorded in all sections but New England and the mountain states. New England also failed to show any gain in awards for sewer and water facility construction.

### To Wed Senator New Members Are Received

#### Pastor Simpson of Center Church Preaches Sermon for Occasion

At both services yesterday at the Center Congregational church, Rev. Clifford O. Simpson, pastor, received new members into fellowship. Following the reception, he led the congregation in the celebration of Holy Communion.

For the meditation theme he used the text, "When Paul saw them, he thanked God and took courage." In his sermon Mr. Simpson likened some modernists to the soldiers in the war who got the "barbed-wire sickness." No matter what was done for them by way of occupational therapy, libraries, or games, these soldiers would not get over the fact that the barbed wire hemmed them in and all that took place within the prison was trivial and useless.

"Without God modern man is stuck with the barbed wire sickness because there is nothing but the barbed wire but death and darkness and life seems futile and useless."

In the world today the most hopeful ones are the young, strong hope in God, as the Bible says, "But Paul also had courage today, for he had seen that the Lord was with him, and he was not hindered. His friends came and held his hands, and he went on." Mr. Simpson said that he thanked God and took courage.

"We too can thank God and take courage for the people that we know. They are several areas," Mr. Simpson went on to say, "where we can thank God and take courage today, in the field of mental hygiene, in the field of inter-church activity, in the economic outlook for America and in the field of international affairs. Today is not just a repetition of history gone by, when we say 'This is the spirit abroad in the world, the spirit that does the work of the United Nations represent a frank and bold attempt to do what the world has never done before. It is a spirit that is not only a victor, assuming not only the task of feeding and clothing people, but trying to rebuild its economic life."

In conclusion, Mr. Simpson spoke intimately of some of the wonderful examples of Christendom that he had found within the church, of a lump and spirit of self-sacrificing nature, of burden-bearing and seeking to help and care and crises in men, and when he saw them, he thanked God and took courage.

### TNT Shipment Being Probed

#### Former King Mihail of Rumania Investigated

New York, Jan. 5.—(AP)—An explanation why crates labeled "TNT" were being loaded or shipped to Palestine, contained explosives, was being sought by Federal and local authorities.

The "TNT," or trinitro-toluene, was discovered Saturday when a crate burst open during the loading of the American Export Lines freighter *Exeter* at Jersey City pier.

When a second crate also proved to contain TNT, police and customs officers searched the *Exeter* for other crates. They found two crates bound for London and one for New York. The crates were impounded and removed by barge to a safe-anthracite warehouse.

Police said 86 crates were being loaded on the *Exeter* for New York. TNT—enough to devastate a 100 square-mile area.

No charges or arrests have been announced during the ensuing investigation.

Customs officials said explosives are not permitted to be shipped to Palestine. The State department said it had no information, however, that any TNT was classified as a military material.

A few hours after the shipment was made, the *Exeter* returned to the Bronx warehouse and reported finding cartridge-making equipment, a large quantity of TNT, and other crates which were being loaded on the *Exeter* for New York. TNT—enough to devastate a 100 square-mile area.

### Chiang Makes Purge Threat

#### Says Kuomintang Must Rid Itself of Any Disloyal Elements

Nanking, Jan. 5.—(AP)—Chiang Kai-shek today threatened a purge of dissidents in the Kuomintang (government party). Addressing the Kuomintang's Central Executive committee, Chiang said the party must rid itself of disloyal elements and those swerving from their responsibility as so as to strengthen the government in its battle with the Chinese Communists.

He expressed disappointment that a number of party members were not taking the necessary steps to strengthen the government in its battle with the Chinese Communists.

A competent source told The Associated Press that the National Assembly apparently resulted from a growing dissatisfaction with Chiang's policies in elections voted by liberal members and the so-called "right party" candidates.

Chiang said the party's most important job this year is the reorganization of the government. He said the party must rid itself of disloyal elements. Those falling to re-register will be dropped automatically from membership.

The generalissimo reiterated the government's intention to crush the Communists within a year and to bring about a united front with the National Assembly. He warned the party of heavy responsibility ahead.

The revolutionary spirit which marked the party's early days, he said, must not be revived. He said, "We must not let the strength of our party be sapped by a few black horses who lost their heads in the prize of newspaper and other news items."
