Shifts Tactics On Sales Levy

Associated Retailers to Seek Continuance Until Goal is Reached

Stamford, Jan. 7.—The Associated Retailers of Connecticut, Inc., outpatient organized opposition of the Connecticut sales and use tax, has reversed its tactics aimed at immediate repeal of the tax and will seek, instead, continuance of the levy until the attainment goal of \$2,000,000 is reached.

Must Refund Tax On Gifts Changed

Hartford, Jan. 7.—Here's good news for those wishing to exchange Christmas gifts and get credit for the sales tax paid, without letting the donor know about it.

According to Tax Commissioner Walter W. Walker, you are entitled in such cases, to receive credit for the sales tax paid on the original purchase, even though bought by another person for presentation to you.

If a refund or exchange is granted, even though the article is a gift, the tax must also be refunded or given credit for since it was clearly the intention of the original purchaser to make the complete payment," the commissioner ruled.

In other words, the tax has become a part of the total price.

The commissioner said a few instances have been reported to him where retailers, probably unfamiliar with such rules, neglected to give the person returning the gift credit for the tax paid. If a person, not willing to take up the matter with the original purchaser, would then let the issue slide.

The State Board of Conciliation also moved to end the wage dispute by summoning the Boston AFL local and truck owners to a meeting tomorrow.

Superior Judge Frank J. Donahue yesterday dismissed for lack of jurisdiction a union petition asking the court to order the walkout relating to the movement of goods shipped beyond Massachusetts's borders.

The drivers are seeking \$65 for a 48-hour week as compared with a 55.15 week of 48 hours under a contract which expired Jan. 1.

Some Russians Note Christmas

Moscow, Jan. 7.—(AP)—This is Christmas day in Russia, and although it is not a national holiday many believers still observe it.

Worshippers thronged Moscow's Cathedral of the Resurrection and other Orthodox churches throughout the Soviet union last night for Christmas eve services.

The crowds were somewhat smaller than in past years, however, because of the bitter cold—18 below in Moscow.

According to the calendar of the Eastern church, which was the one in official use in Russia until the revolution, this is Dec. 25, and observed as the birthday of Christ by the churches.

Since the revolution, however, the Soviet union has made Jan. 3 the day of parties, family reunions and gift-giving, complete with Christmas trees and Grandfather Frost, the Russian Santa Claus.

12 Communities Shaken by Quake

Dover-Foxcroft, Me., Jan. 7.—(AP)—An earthquake, described by a famous seismologist as a "creaking-stair" quake, shook a dozen communities within 40 miles of this town again yesterday.

The quake in disturbance 10 days ago which covered practically the same area, there was no reported damage.

Explaining the Maine quake in a radio speech last night, Father Joseph J. Lynch, director of Fordham university's quake observatory, said as stairs sometimes creak sporadically in the night recovering from the strain of people walking up and down, so the crust of the earth cracks from time to time as it recovers from the strain of the ice age and similar disturbances.

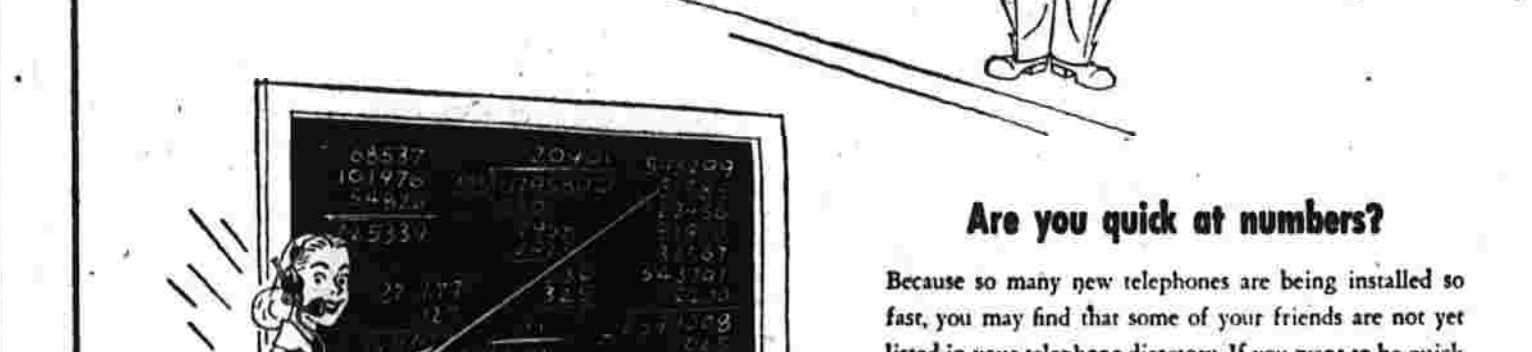
