India Fears War May Come From Kashmir Fighting

Tells United Nations Security Council Full-Scale Warfare May Develop Unless UN Takes Measures to Halt Area Battles

Lake Success, Jan. 15.—(P)—India told the United Nations Security Council today that a full-scale war with Pakistan may develop unless the U.N. takes measures to halt fighting in Kashmir. Delivering the opening speech in support of India's charges against Pakistan, the Moslem-dominated, Minister Gopalaswami Ayyangar contended that "there is at this very moment a small war going on in Kashmir."

Later Gandhi, holding his night by prayer meeting, referred to this report and told followers, "It is of the highest importance that the action for stopping the fighting... should be taken with specific expedition, not only for the sake of the honor but also for the purpose of avoiding the risk of a full-scale war between India and Pakistan which the compelling necessities of military action might bring about."

Specific Points Raised Ayyangar specifically asked the council to persuade Pakistan to: 1—Prevent Pakistan government from participating in or assisting the invasion of Kashmir; 2—Duty to the Indian nationals to desert from taking any part in the fighting; 3—Duty to the Indians to access to and use of its territory for operations against Kashmir; 4—Other kinds of aid that might tend to prolong the fighting; 5—To also complain about "the atmosphere of hostility and enmity."

The welcome and beneficial nature of the potential yield and source of yield for a state income tax in Connecticut, made by the Connecticut Public Expenditure Council, estimates what seems roughly obvious during the 1947 session of the Legislature, which was that only one of the income tax proposals then introduced was a serious and conscientious effort to offer an honest alternative to the impending sales tax.

The official income tax proposal, 95 per cent of the state's 800,000 federal income tax payers would have been completely exempted from the proposed state income tax. All those with incomes under \$3,000 would have paid nothing. Five-sevenths of the yield of the tax would have come from some 2,000 Connecticut residents who have incomes of \$20,000 or over.

Despite all this, the yield of the Democratic income tax plan, now being called, would be \$7,000,000, as compared to an estimated state need of \$28,000,000.

The Democratic proposal, 95 per cent of the state's 800,000 federal income tax payers would have been completely exempted from the proposed state income tax. All those with incomes under \$3,000 would have paid nothing. Five-sevenths of the yield of the tax would have come from some 2,000 Connecticut residents who have incomes of \$20,000 or over.

"Fuzzy" Ago To One

Some times three to five Times listed one of the nation's college presidents who favor peace time conscription, or universal military training as it is now being called, and regretted that there are still some few educators who held a different opinion. Those stray educators who did not favor conscription were alleged, guilty of "fuzzy thinking."

Sooner or later, in this free country, facts are likely to take the place of such editorial propaganda, and the facts about the action at the Cincinnati meeting of the Association of American Colleges are only reported in Wednesday's New York Times itself.

Here took place the first attempt of those noted educators who have come out in favor of conscription to enlist the support of their profession as a whole. Here was the first attempt to create the impression that a vast majority of the heads of America's institutions of higher learning have lost their capacity to appreciate the unique greatness and privileges of life in America.

The attempt was a spectacular failure.

The leading advocate of conscription present, Dr. Harold D. Dodds, president of Princeton, boldly argued that "America must engage for a time in power politics." Toward that end, he praised the idea that America's "power should be channeled through a compulsory system which would fit them for their role in this nation's power politics."

In opposition to Dr. Dodds, there were some of the New York Times "fuzzy thinkers" present. They argued that for America to adopt conscription would be for America to enter the same militaristic regimentation which was the cause of the enemies we have just defeated. They argued that this country's adoption of conscription would also be this country's open declaration of the inevitability of war. They argued that to maintain their only through conscription can we make better and healthier American citizens is an admission of the bankruptcy of our American civilization.

Strangely enough, when it came to a vote, the "fuzzy thinkers" carried the day. They carried the vote against any form of compulsory military training. They carried it by a tally of 218 to 86, or by a margin of three to one.

The most important thing about this vote is not that it offers conclusive opposition to conscription, although any such opposition is important in that it increases the chances that this country may avoid the greatest self-betrayal in its history.

What is most important about this vote is that it offers to this country a restoration of faith in and respect for the one profession we can least afford to lose to our present trend of policy born of hysteria. If it could ever have been assumed, as the New York Times did assume, that the educational profession was now ready to turn its back on the one profession from which this country has derived the greatest of all American assets and privileges, then the fate of this country would have been dark indeed, and the barbaric deeds of its civilization would have seemed certain and inescapable.

We are not quite through with the New York Times. This newspaper deserves routine credit for printing the facts about the Cincinnati meeting. But it was entirely typical of the perhaps unconscious assessment the Amer-

The Douglas Speech

On Dec. 30th, in Chicago, Supreme Court Justice William O. Douglas delivered, on the occasion of the 100th anniversary of the pioneer liberal, Governor John Peter Altgeld of Illinois, an address which has since won nationwide attention.

It might have won attention exclusively on its merits. It was an able, intelligent address, which admitted that it might be over-dramatic and perhaps of the availing, in this country, but which ended up on a firm, idealistic ground with which there could be little real quarrel. At the end, talking about civil liberties in this country today, Justice Douglas delivered the following timely warning:

"A people who proclaim their civil liberties but extend their only to preferred groups start down the path to totalitarianism. They emulate either the dictator or the tyrant. In doing this they cease a basic distinction between our system of government and totalitarianism."

Unfortunately, it was not the content of Justice Douglas' speech alone which has been winning it national attention. In fact, we suspect that the explanation for its becoming a speech of some note is the fact that it is being hailed as a sign of the eligibility, and perhaps of the availability, of Justice Douglas for a political nomination—that of vice president on the Democratic ticket.

Justice Douglas fills a certain political bill—the Democratic party's need for a "sound" liberal to counteract the appeal of the "crackpot" liberal, Wallace.
