Molloy Heads Leniency Plea

Judge Imposes Comparative Light Terms As Men Now Friends

Hartford, Jan. 23.—(AP)—Nesbitt Little, 26, and William Richardson, 27, received comparatively light sentences from Superior Court Judge Thomas J. Molloy when they testified that they had become warm friends after Little shot Richardson.

State's Attorney H. Neade Alcorn told the court yesterday that the pair became involved in an argument at a club last October and that Little fired four shots from a pistol. One of the bullets struck Richardson in the abdomen. Another hit Little's foot, and he still is on crutches.

Richardson Asks Leniency

Before the case was called in court, Alcorn said, Richardson came to him for leniency for Little, reporting he and his erstwhile assailant had become close friends since the shooting.

Judge Molloy, sparing the defendant from a prison term, sentenced Little to jail for one year for assault with a dangerous weapon and carrying a pistol without a permit. Richardson, who is scheduled to undergo an operation a few months hence for removal of the bullet which is lodged near his hip, was sentenced to jail for three months for breach of the peace.

Mine Operators Seek Injunction

Paintsville, Ky., Jan. 23.—(AP)—Operators of 40 non-union coal mines in Johnson county petitioned yesterday for an injunction to prevent picketing which has closed their workings, leaving 1,000 to 1,200 workers idle.

Simultaneously, 1,100 United Mine Workers returned to their diggings, ending a one-day work stoppage which one spokesman had called a "wild holiday."

The unionists, truck mine operators charged, had assisted in picketing at the unorganized coal mine loading ramps, checking off production. Pickets patrolled the loading ramps yesterday, but in smaller numbers than Wednesday.

No picketing violence was reported, but one operator who said he did not identify some of the truckers was threatened.

Thomas E. Rose, chief of the Wildlife Protection division in the State Department of Fisheries and Game, said several found deer carcasses had been found in various sections of the state.

Two Utilities Companies Also to Share in State Allotment

Hartford, Jan. 23.—(AP)—Two New Haven hospitals, the Connecticut Light and Power company and the Stamford Gas company will share in an allotment of 75,000 barrels of industrial fuel oil for which Governor McCoskey yesterday signed a requisition on Navy stores at Melville, R. I.

The allotment represents about half of the oil loaned to the state by the Navy.

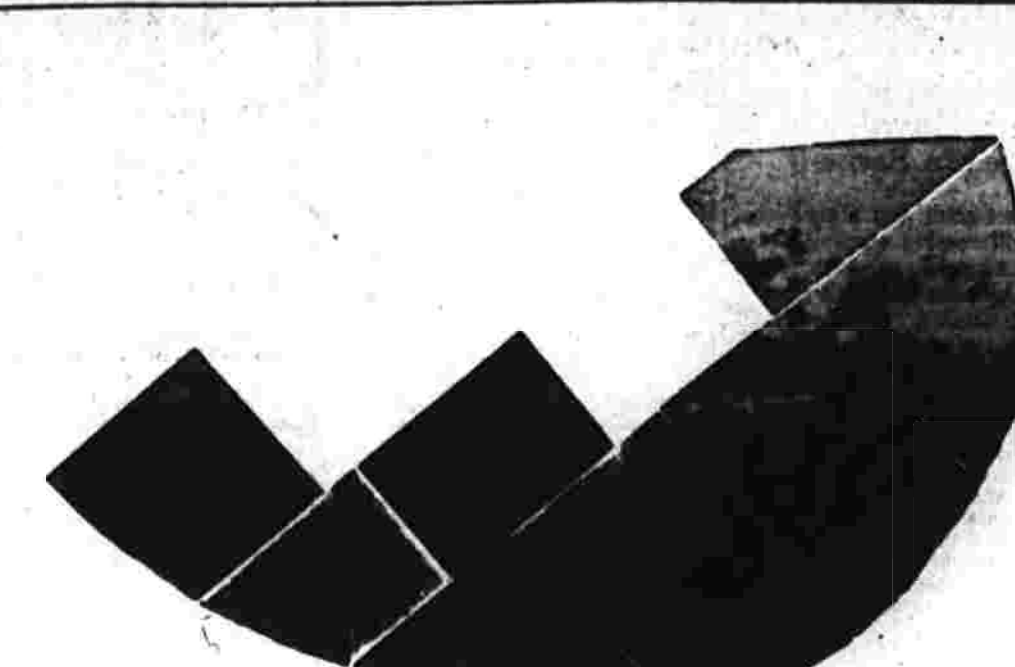

The total number of births in Manchester during 1947 hit an all-time high, Town Clerk Samuel J. Turington reported today. The compilation of vital statistics made by Town Clerk Turington shows that last year 1,067 were born here and 161 infants were taken care of in other towns. This leaves Manchester with 906 births to local residents.

Against the declining population increase figures on children deaths last year totaled only 230, with 30 of them being reported in Turington reports.
