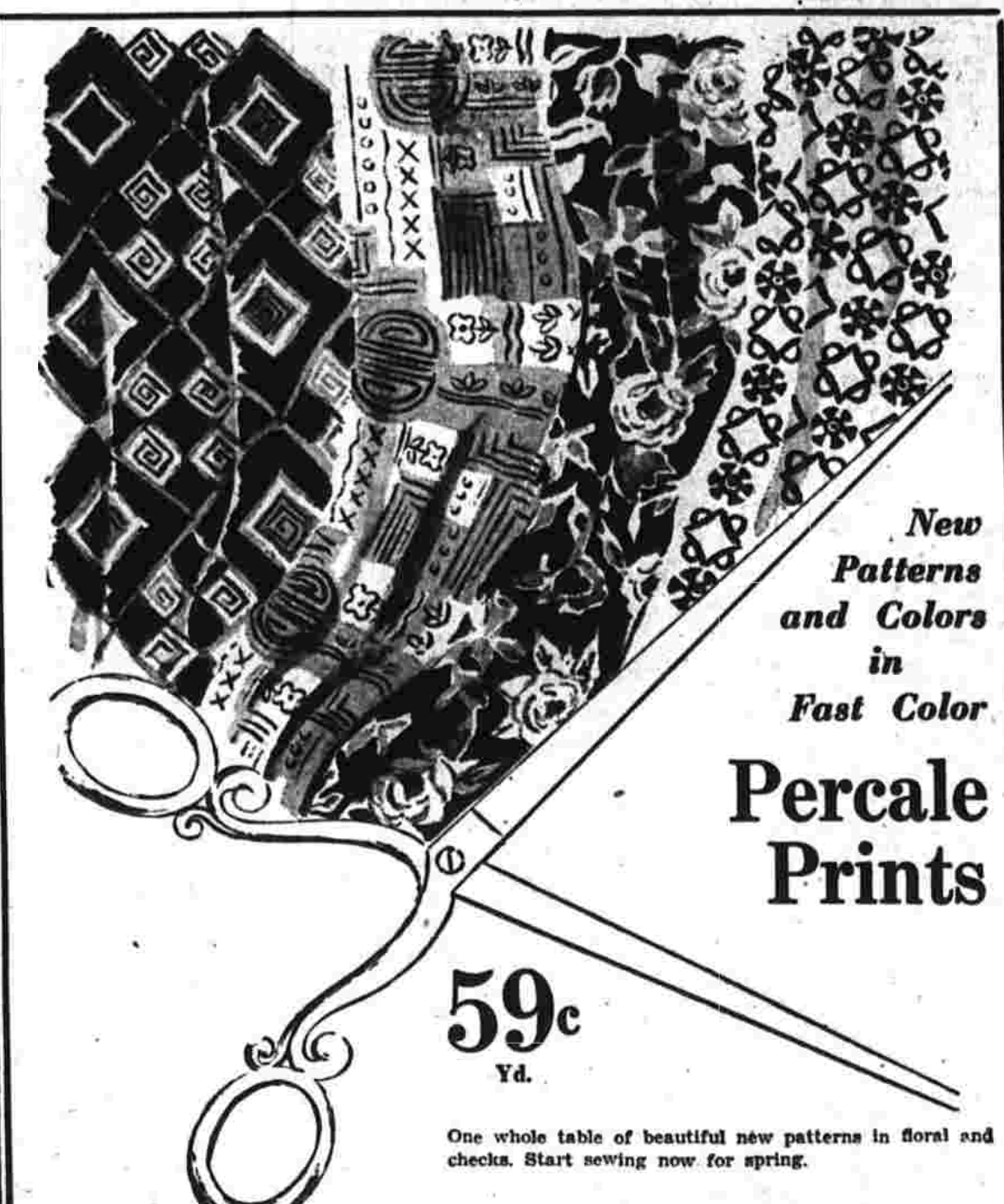

### Russian Protest Called Improper

Thoran, Iran, Feb. 5—(U. S. Associated Press)—A recent Russian note protesting American activities in Iran was "an improper interference in the internal affairs of Iran."

In a statement issued in a far-western part of Iran by the Iranian Press association last night, the protesting envoy declared the Russian protest "offensive to the dignity and independence of Iran" and an equal member of the United Nations.

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### Prosecutor Urges Death for Giehev

Sofia, Bulgaria, Feb. 4—(Delayed)—The Bulgarian state prosecutor tonight demanded the death penalty for Dimitar Giehev, former Agrarian party leader and a deputy of the national Agrarian Assembly.

Petkov, peasant leader and foe of Communism, was hanged Sept. 23 on charges of plotting against Bulgaria's Communist-controlled government.

The indictment of Giehev stirred the diplomatic colony of Sofia, and was expected to arouse protests in the United States and Great Britain. Both protested the execution of Petkov.

Some regarded the indictment as a government step to eradicate the vestiges of opposition and make Bulgaria a Communist state. One of the chief charges against Giehev was that he spread false rumors that Bulgarian farm products were being exported to the Soviet Union without payment.
