State in Forefront On Highway Safety

Engineering, Education and Enforcement Key-Notes of Traffic Safety Campaign

By Carl J. Lusk

Hartford, Feb. 11—(AP)—Three states are standing for engineering, education and enforcement—key-words of a traffic safety campaign which is a little more than a decade in the making in the state in the forefront in the fight to make the highways safe.

In 1941, a total of 222 people lost their lives in Connecticut traffic accidents. That was just 222 more than the Connecticut Highway Safety commission likes to see. But it was half as many as reported in 1935, the year the first highway traffic record was made in the state. The 1935 record showed that 445 lives were lost.

"Appalling Problem" Poised The 1935 record—443 killed and nearly 14,000 injured—posed an "appalling problem," said the commission.

The first thing he did was to name a fact finding commission. He led its 21 members to determine the reasons for such a record and to do something about it.

From that beginning has grown a campaign which has spread its message of safety so widely and so forcibly that there's hardly a motorist in Connecticut who can escape its influence.

Officially, the campaign got underway in 1937, the year that Watson was elected governor. The commission became the Connecticut Highway Safety Commission.

Since that time, here's what has happened in Connecticut: a decrease of 50 per cent in the number of traffic deaths; a 25 per cent drop in the number of people injured in 1947.

"The 1937 Legislature gave the educational phase of the battle a lift by requiring safety education in all schools. Used to carry the message of safety, posters, lectures, and motion pictures.

Some schools combine theory with practice by actually teaching the youngsters how to drive.

Experience has taught the police where and when violations are most apt to occur. For those places and those times they have what they call "selective enforcement."

William M. Greene, director of the State Safety Commission, says: "The main problem is to sell the public, to gain public acceptance of regulations, to convince the public that safety is an individual matter."

Crowds See Gandhi Train

Thousands Pack Railway Stations; Toss Garlands and Money

Denies 1,900 Moslems Killed in Kashmir

Manchester, Pakistan, Feb. 11—(AP)—The Pakistan Defense Ministry denies that 1,900 Moslems were killed by Indian troops in Kashmir, and said Moslem guerrilla tactics would make such a total impossible.

The Indian Defense Ministry said in a communique issued Monday in New Delhi the Moslems had been killed by troops in a battle near Muzaffargarh. The town is 70 miles southwest of Srinagar, Kashmir capital.

Headquarters of the so-called Azad (Free) Kashmir government here credited last night Moslem troops had been withdrawn from the Muzaffargarh area after a battle. They said the Indian casualty report was "unbelievable."

Guerrilla fighting does not include pitched battles, a Pakistan officer said, hence a mass slaying of 1,900 could not result.

The train of third class coaches was jammed at the station, and where Gandhi's ashes repose in an urn. Garlands and money were tossed into the open window of the special coach holding the urn.

Tomorrow at noon the ashes will be immersed at Triveni Sangam, near Allahabad. There the Ganges, Jumna and Sarawati—most sacred rivers to Hindus—meet.

As the train swung into the open countryside, it picked up speed, passing little groups of Indians who had gathered by the tracks to see it pass.

During a stop at Aligarh in the morning, the train was delayed by a heavy snowfall.

676,000 Veterans Use All Idle Pay

Washington, Feb. 11.—(AP)—One million out of every 22 has drawn his full \$1,046 of unemployment checks under the GI bill.

Reporting this today, the Veterans Administration said more than 2,300,000 veterans, or about 85 per cent of the World War II total, have collected at least one check.

About 8 per cent of them, or 676,000, have used up all they had coming.

Payments are of two kinds:

1. To employed veterans, a maximum of \$35 a week for 48 weeks.
2. To self-employed veterans, usually farmers, a maximum of \$100 a month for 10 3-5 months.

Through the end of last November, total payments under the program were \$2,800,000,000. This included \$900,000,000 for the first 11 months of 1947.
