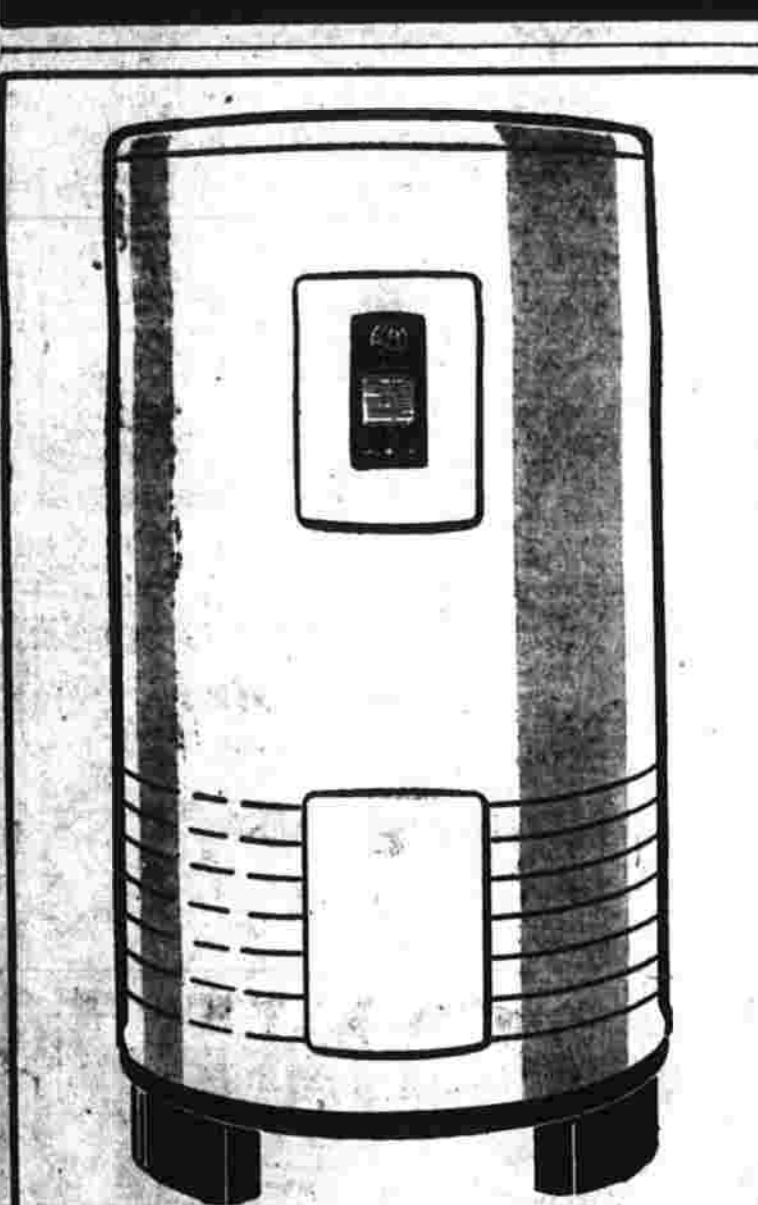

He could not order any segregation.

Mrs. Johnston called the farap symbols of party leaders' efforts to get minority votes through 'civil rights' proposals that led to a breach of southern soil.

McGrath showed deep concern over the Wallace threat in his radio address. He said he thinks Wallace himself is "sterner" enough, but added:

"The fact that the loudest applause for Henry Wallace comes from Communists, Communist fellow travelers and reactionary Republicans causes me to believe that the bulk of Henry Wallace's support is coming from those whose basic allegiance is not to the American way of life.

"Change To Disrupt Activities"

"I hope that Henry Wallace will realize that unscrupulous forces who look to Moscow for inspiration and guidance see in his candidacy a chance to disrupt the normal activities of our two party system and bring about the chaos and confusion of splinter parties that has sent so many nations of the rope into governmental collapse.

"I hope that Henry Wallace will repudiate the supporters of his cause whose only real hope is that they can defeat the Democratic party's program of practical liberalism in 1948 and turn the government over to reactionaries and isolationists.

"Earlier in the day McGrath had said the Democratic party will make a 'grave mistake if it does not learn a lesson' from the New York election. He added:

"It is evident that the fight against Communism on the left and fascism on the right cannot be won unless every Democrat resolves to get out and vote.

Good News for Republicans

Harold E. Stassen, candidate for the G. O. P. presidential nomination, called the victory of the Wallace man in the Bronx Democratic stronghold good news for the Republicans.

"It indicates, Stassen said at Spokane, Wash., that working men and women who used to vote for Roosevelt are leaving the Democratic party.

"However, Senator Aiken (R-Vt) said the American Labor party victory showed "disaffection with both the old parties." He declared:

"Many voters are disgusted with the lack of good government as the part of the Democratic administration and the lack of progressive ideas on the part of Republican party leaders.

"Aiken often differs with the G.O.P. leadership.

Senator Lucas (D-Ill), assistant Democratic leader in the Senate, told reporters the result did not mean much.

Urges Money For Training

Grace Advocates Closer Supervision Over Education of Veterans

Hartford, Feb. 19—(AP)—"Give the Veterans administration sufficient funds to prevent a national scandal in education of veterans, especially in the on-the-job training program," Education Committee member Alfonso G. Grace urged today.

"There must be closer supervision by training and education of funds or veterans' education may become one of the biggest racketeers in the country," Connecticut's education chief wrote to the state members of the state's delegation in Congress.

"I am concerned," he wrote, "because of the excellence of our program in Connecticut and the fact that there has been the closest supervision. There are, however," says Dr. Grace, "educational practices which should be investigated and there must be sufficient personnel."

Should Restrict Courses

"There should be," Dr. Grace added, "rigid restriction of the courses that can be included in the on-the-job training program. Everything from dancing to check writing is a wasteful and expensive waste of money which places Federal money in two pockets—one who serves in the armed services and perhaps has earned it, the other who offers the instruction. Each on-the-job training course should be carefully outlined, a course of study required, the number of veterans students limited per instructor, and both standards and supervision should be supplied."

"Most of what now prevails," Dr. Grace wrote, "is not educational, but more or less personal correspondence work at a high rate."

"The Veterans administration should be supplied with a sufficient budget in order that it in turn may allocate on the basis of contracts to state Departments of Education and educational institutions the necessary funds for the careful supervision of instruction and the maintenance of standards. Hungary Signs Russian Pact

Forges Last Link of Chain Against 'Rival Imperialist States'

Moscow, Feb. 19—(AP)—Russia has forged the last link in a chain of treaties intended as a barrier against the "imperialist states," Foreign Minister V. M. Molotov announced last night.

Molotov spoke after the signing of a Soviet-Hungarian friendship and mutual assistance treaty.

Russia now has, he said, "pacts of friendship and mutual assistance with all states on its western frontier—from the Black sea to the Baltic.

"We Soviet people see in this an important success in the realization of Prime Minister Stalin's foreign policy, directed toward the strengthening of friendship with all neighboring states and consolidating a general peace," he stated.

He said the treaties were concluded in "conformity with the aims and principles of the United Nations organization."

Replying to Molotov, Lajos Dimogy, Hungarian premier, said his people now enjoy, for the first time in history, "the opportunity of cooperating with a great power."

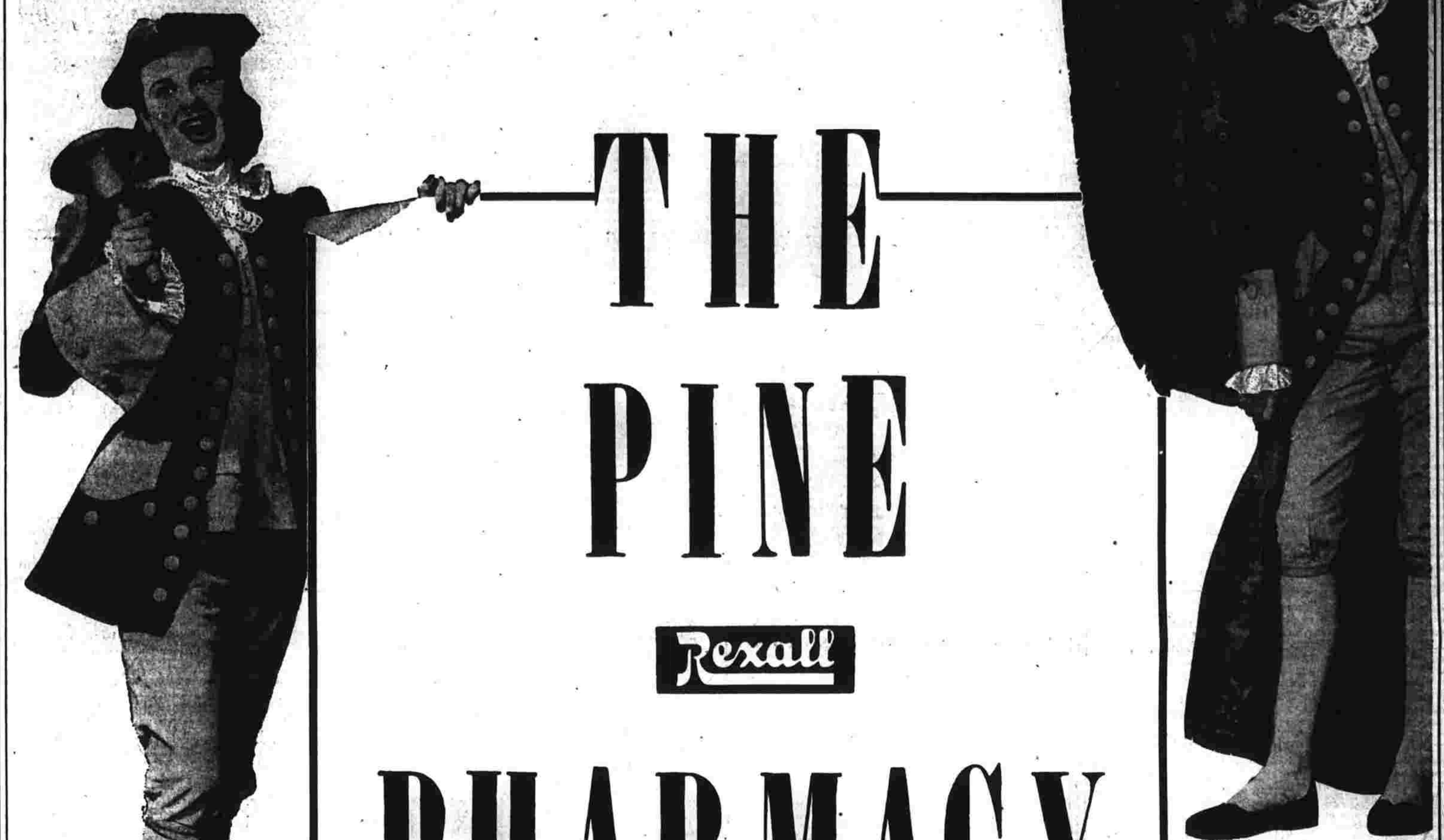

Prison Escape Attempt Fails

Nine Foiled in Effort to Blast Way Out in Georgia; One Wounded
Fairburn, Ga., Feb. 19.—Nine prisoners were foiled in an attempt to blast their way out of a stone wall here with dynamite, warden M. F. Tyree reported last night.
One prisoner was wounded by gunfire, said the warden. He said the escape attempt was made at 6:30 a. m. Wednesday.
Tyree said the wounded man was Cornelius Thomas, Negro, serving 65 years for robbery.
The warden said the explosion in a concrete barracks housing about 100 Negro prisoners blew out 10 windows, shook the prison courtyard and hurled fragments of the door 150 feet.
The prisoners had been working in a stone quarry. Tyree said, he believed they had shaken the dynamite dust into their shoes. The dust passed as dirt upon inspection, he said.
One of the men, Tyree continued, was believed to have smuggled the dynamite cap into the barracks in his mouth. Only a short fuse was used.
Charges sealed in With Soap
The charge, amounting to about six sticks of dynamite, was placed against the door cracks and sealed in with soap, Tyree continued.
He said the prisoners were preparing to answer a breakfast roll call when the explosion occurred. Tyree said he and a yard officer rushed out with shotguns, splashed Thomas running and winged him. They held the others at bay until help arrived.
Tyree said the blast involved only nine prisoners and named as the ringleaders Orange, Jones, serving 15 years for burglary and robbery; James Rutledge, serving five years for robbery, and Willie L. Clark, serving life for murder. He did not identify the other six.

Judge Invokes Old Testament

Macon, Ga., Feb. 19.—The Old Testament was invoked by a superior court judge to send a 42-year-old Georgian to jail for incestuous relations with his teenage stepdaughter.
Judge O. Woodward pleaded guilty to a charge of incest yesterday. Superior Judge G. Woodard sentenced the defendant to 10 years in prison. The relationship between the stepfather and the pregnant 14-year-old girl was established under Georgia law "within the Levitical degree of affinity."
Leticia 18 is said "thou shalt not uncover the nakedness of a woman and her daughter. . . it is wickedness."
Solicitor General Charles H. Garrett described the affair as "a regular sort of tobacco road case."
