### Senators Laud Marshall Plan

### Baldwin and McMahon On Same Side Regarding European Aid

Waterbury, Feb. 21.—Raymond E. Baldwin and Helen McMahon, two politicians who usually are in disagreement, found themselves on the same side of the issue last night.

The two Connecticut U. S. senators, Baldwin a Republican and McMahon a Democrat, told an audience at a meeting sponsored by the Chamber of Commerce that the Marshall plan is good.

While Baldwin's endorsement was not as wholehearted as McMahon's, he said the plan would do until unless something better comes along.

"Until those who oppose this approach can put before us a plan that has in it a better, surer, cheaper way of maintaining the peace and the prosperity we want for our children, I see no alternative other than to support this plan as an effective and promising way to our sacrifices and effort can make a difference."

Baldwin spoke caustically of those who have called the Marshall plan a "no fly" policy. He listed Senator Vandenberg, Governor Dewey of New York, former Governor Stanley of Minnesota, John Foster Dulles, Christian Herter, Alex Smith and Warren Austin as Republicans who worked hard to make the plan a success.

McMahon, who hailed the Marshall plan as a certain road to world peace in a speech at New Britain last night, devoted most of his talk here to a discussion of the role in the end of the war left the United States, "Destiny to Lead Free Nations."

"It is apparently America's destiny to lead all the free nations," he said. "While this is not the plan we had in mind, we must not let ourselves be misled by the people of the United States can accomplish it."

McMahon, who was chairman of the special Senate Committee on Atomic Energy until Republicans took over control of Congress, declared that the plan would be an effective way of controlling weapons of war can be worked out.
