Aside from the very interesting relationship between the Republican state organization and the so-called Republican insurgents, the Communist influence is now operating in Czechoslovakia is the only country to which the Russian system might represent some improvement. These leaders, in whatever they may choose to do, should be backed by an intelligent, hard-headed, but intentions good, people who have always been able to withhold something from foreign domination.

Czechoslovakia, after this war, remembered that it had been the western democracies who had betrayed her to Hitler, and instinctively welcomed friendship with Russia. So, for one thing, Russia is threatening to substitute an unwilling and sullen subordinate for a natural friend.

That there are not in this community over 500 or 600 people who are really interested in a proposition which offers them outstanding cultural opportunity at the very economical rate the Civic Music Association system makes possible.
