He said the insurance money from the destroyed building will just about cover the If an award were made to a pri-If an award were made to a private contractor, the total cost would "probably be more than \$125,000," Mr. Zeller estimated.

The comptroller, who has worked closely with State Prison Warden Ralph H. Walker on the matter, believes this will be the first time prison labor will be used for any large construction.

first time prison labor will be used for any large construction.

Today's action stems from legislation approved by the 1947 General Assembly. It provides that the comptroller "may employ such employes or inmates and purchase or furnish the necessary materials for the construction, erection, alteration, repair or enlargement on any such state buildings or premises."

This can be done "without the necessity of bids."

Called "Rehabilitation" Measure
In addition to "saving taxpayers' money," Comptroller Zeller said, it will serve as a valuable "rehabilitation" measure.


