Washington, March 22.—(P)—The United Mine Workers today rejected a government plan for ending the soft coal walkout. Charles Clegg, Federal conciliation chief, promptly went to the White House to report the union action.

Chicago's move apparently was the first step toward invoking the Taft-Hartley law to halt the nine-day strike which has crippled railroad and steel mill operations. Clegg, a former president of the press secretary, told reporters Chicago reported to John M. Stearns, assistant president Truman and veteran labor advisor.

Windsor Locks, March 22.—The Board of Trustees of the Windsor Locks Methodist church has recommended that the church be sold and the proceeds be put up for a school.

The church was built in 1860 to house a flourishing congregation which eventually included about 150 families. Now its active membership is estimated by Joseph Swindell, member of the board, at about 10 persons.

The trustees' recommendation has been sent to the Rev. Marion J. Greger of New Haven, district supervisor of the New York-New England conference of the church. It will be acted on at the next meeting of the conference, included in the recommendation is a proposal for sale of the parsonage which stands on the same property.

Death Clinic Congregation

Mr. Swindell said today that the congregation was once active but lost its strength through the death of many of its members and the gradual migration of their children and grandchildren out of town. The reason for the exodus he could not say, but as he put it: "The Protestants aren't very numerous here now."

The few remaining members of the church will be allotted to other Methodist churches in the area. Mr. Greger said today.

There has been no resident pastor for the past 20 years or so. Mr. Swindell said. The last pastor died in Windsor Locks and was never permanently succeeded.

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Salesman Held For Murder

Former California Socialist Dies as Result of Illegal Operation

Sydney, March 22.—An Sydney automobile salesman was held in \$2,500 bail today on a charge that he murdered Mrs. June Francis Thomas, 27, former California socialist, by means of an illegal operation.

Police said Mrs. Thomas, a former San Francisco peninsula debutante, died of septicaemia (blood poisoning) at Crown Street Women's hospital yesterday.

The automobile salesman, Harry Turnbull, 39, was charged with having used an instrument upon Mrs. Thomas in a room at the home of a friend, Mrs. Mary Thomas, who lives at 100 North Street. The charge further accused Turnbull of "voluntarily and maliciously" murdering the woman.

Magistrate Not Yet Fixed

Magistrate D. P. Goode asked the court today to commit Turnbull to prison for two weeks for failing to appear in court. He said the date for coroner inquest had not yet been fixed.

Mrs. Thomas was 27 years old when she was married to Mr. Harry Thomas, a former California socialist, in 1924. They had three children. Mrs. Thomas was a member of the Communist Party and was active in its activities. She was a member of the Women's Club of Sydney.

Mrs. Thomas was found dead in her room at the home of a friend, Mrs. Mary Thomas, who lives at 100 North Street. She was found by a neighbor who called the police. She was taken to the hospital and died the following day.

Police are investigating the case and have not yet determined the cause of death. They are looking for a motive for the murder.
