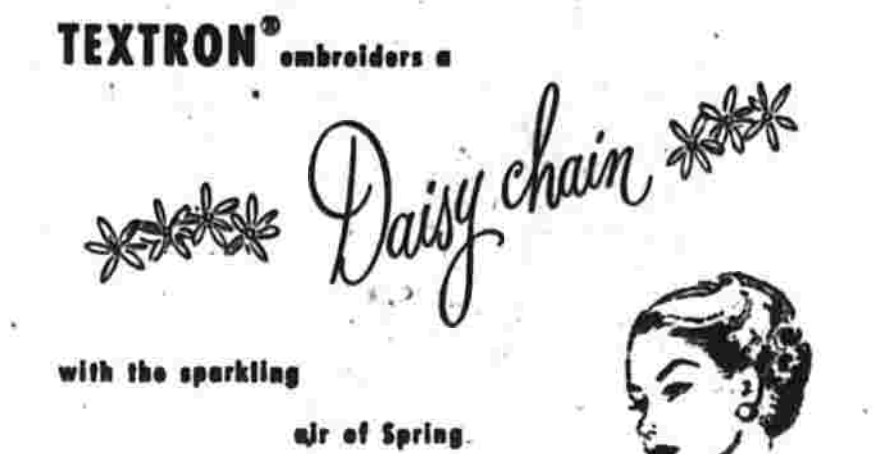

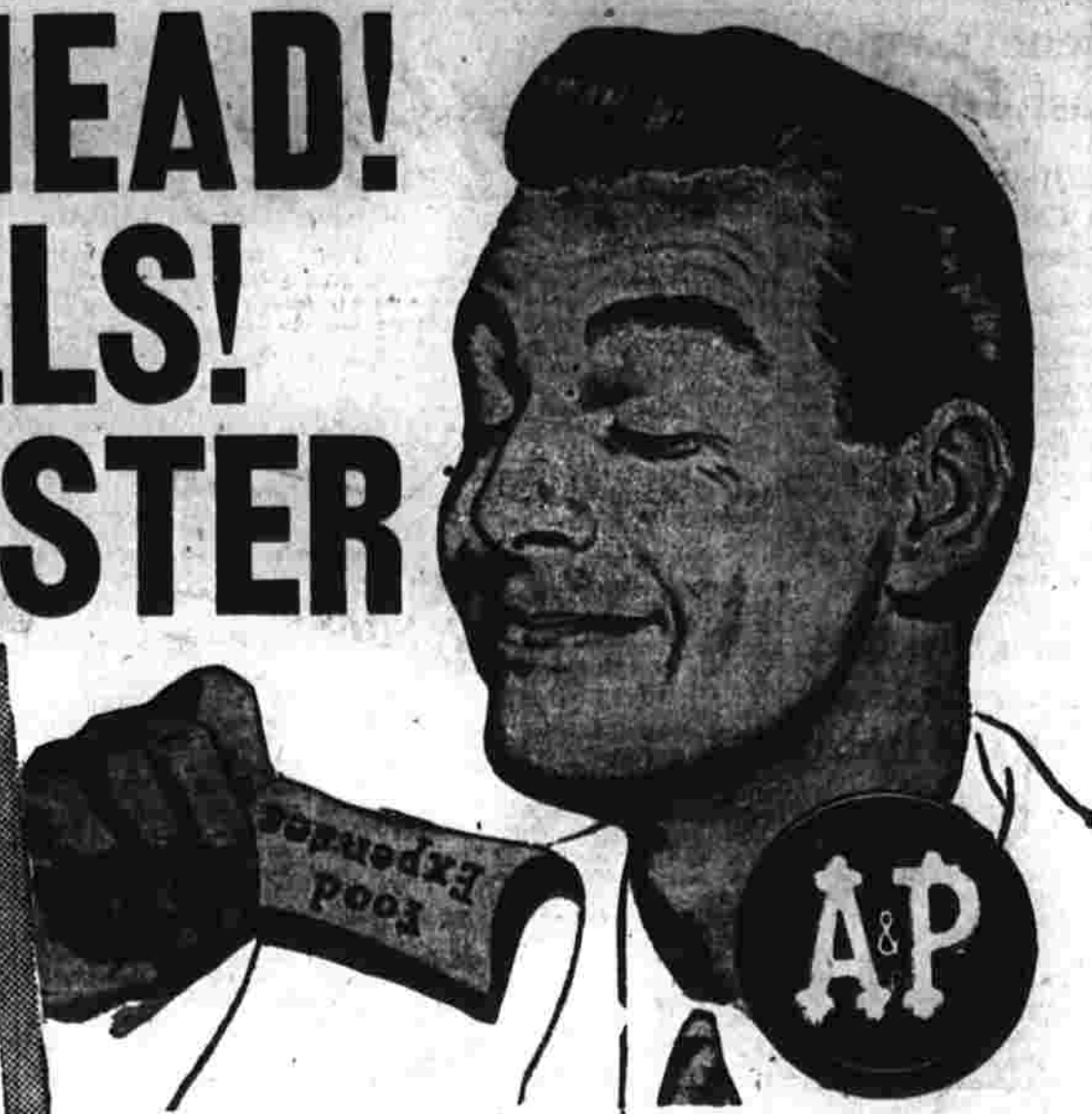

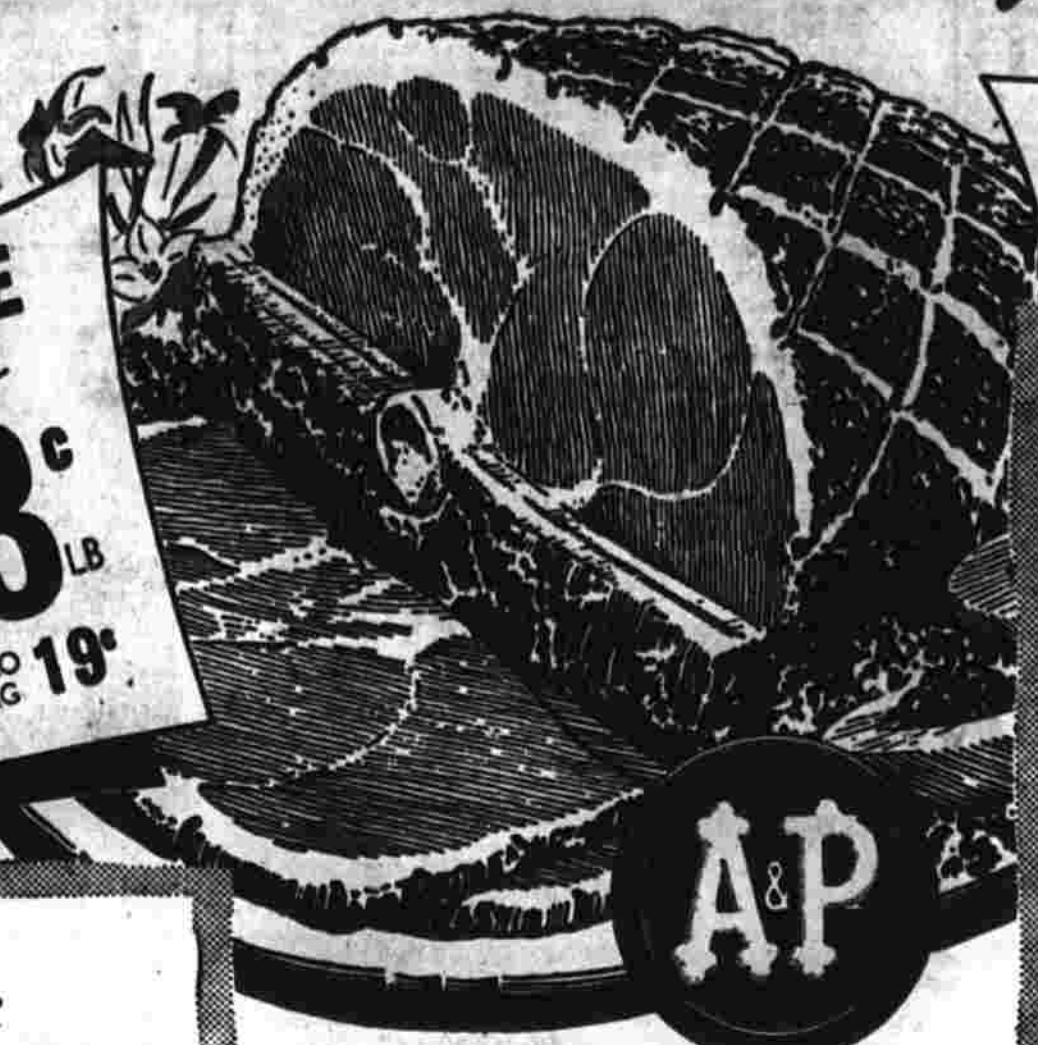

Politics is a hard and ruthless game, which seldom admits of a fair trial. The only way to win is to outguess your opponent. This means that some of the things that are said in the course of a campaign are not meant to be taken seriously. It is the danger that Americans themselves will refuse to consider it, using their own prediction of Russia's answer as their guide. Those who proclaim that Russia would not accept such a proposal must be judged to be using Russia as the convenient excuse for escaping their own decision on the proposal. They make an advance decision for Russia because they shrink from making a decision for themselves. We cannot accept Russia's rejection of something we will not choose ourselves. We submit that the question of whether or not Russia would accept has no controlling importance in our consideration of "A Speech for the President."

The "Speech" And Russia

We have been proposing in "A Speech for the President" an entire new method of solving present world problems. We have been investigating the possibilities that this new method would, by eliminating the fundamental basis of fear among nations, change problems which do not now seem to be solvable into problems which can be solved. The method proposed is new not because no one has thought of it before. It is new because it has never been tried. That is something to keep in mind as we wonder how other nations, and specifically Russia, would react to this proposal if America should make it. We have never made such a proposal. No other nation has ever been called upon to accept or reject such a proposal from us.

The Doctor Says:

Symptoms Vary, But Pain Is Always Present in Neuritis

By Edwin F. Jordan, M. D., Written for NEA Service

Inflammation of the nerves is called neuritis. Symptoms of neuritis vary a lot but pain and tenderness are almost always present. In long-lasting cases the feeling of sensation may be disturbed and muscular wasting can develop.

The amount of pain produced by neuritis is variable. In some persons pain can be practically intolerable and in others, especially those who are vigorous and healthy, it can be borne without great difficulty.

Cause of neuritis, like its symptoms, is not alike in all cases. Consequently, it is necessary to try to find out the cause in each case. When caused by diabetes, for example, the proper line of attack is to control the diabetes by a suitable diet and insulin if necessary.

Causes of Neuritis

Stingings can produce neuritis. In this disease a virus is probably at fault. The nerve itself is apparently affected and the pain is often extremely severe and may last for a long time. Severe anemia can produce neuritis. Chemical substances, such as arsenic, and many industrial products may produce neuritis. Infections and diseases can also cause nerve pain.

Nerve pain can come from vitamin deficiency, especially the lack of vitamin B. One type of neuritis is common among the victims of chronic alcoholism. Perhaps at least part of the reason for this is that such persons substitute alcohol as a food in place of a properly balanced diet containing enough vitamin B. Whether this is true or not, this type of neuritis can be much improved.
