**New Industry Being Sought**

Inspection Tour Planned To Obtain Occupants Of Vought Factory

Hartford, March 26.—In a move aimed at bringing new industry into Connecticut to take over the big Chance-Vought Division plant of the United Aircraft Corporation, should that division's operations be transferred to Texas as now contemplated, the State Development Commission said today it had arranged with Chance-Vought officials and the Navy for an inspection tour of the property by a party of industrial realtors and other interested persons on April 7.

The tour will be jointly sponsored by the Bridgeport Chamber of Commerce, the Hotel Stratfield of that city, and the Development Commission, and non-transferable invitations have been issued for a party of 60.

Inspection of the Stratfield plant, famed for its production of "corair" naval fighter planes, will start at 10 a. m., under the guidance of William H. Espey, assistant to the general manager of Chance-Vought and president of the Development Commission, who will convene at the Hotel Stratfield, 141 Junction as guests of the Stratfield Chamber and the State Development Commission. The afternoon will be devoted to a discussion of the best possible future use for the 1,500,000 square foot structure in the event that a vacancy occurs.

William B. Rogers, chairman of the Development Commission, pointed out today that the Stratfield property has not yet been declared surplus by the Navy and consequently is not actively on the market. The inspection tour, he said, is strictly an anticipatory step designed to acquaint realtors with the appointments of the plant in order that they will be able to act rapidly if and when the proposed transfer of operations to Texas materializes.

Included in the inspection party to whom invitations cleared by naval authorities, have been issued will be 41 Connecticut and New York State industrial realtors and brokers.

**Palestine Talk Viewed Futile**

Reaction of Jerusalem Man - in - Street to Truman Truce Plan

Jerusalem, March 25.—(AP)—All talk in America does not seem to be getting us anywhere. That was the reaction of a Jerusalem man-in-the-street to President Truman's plan yesterday for an Arab-Jewish truce in Palestine, which he told the press.

Holy Land Arabs and Jews with official connections spoke to their old claims: For the Arabs, a united independent Palestine, in which Arabs would be the majority; for the Jews, a partitioned Palestine giving them a state of their own.

We want a democratic Arab government with all Palestinians—that includes Jews—given an equal right to rule. "I am a lawyer," said a man in the crowd, "and I am sure that the Arabs will not fight until they are completely destroyed."

Arabs outnumber Jews about two to one in this country. We do not attack and we are not interested in continuing the civil war, but there can be no truce until the Jews are completely destroyed. What Shall Armament, Buy? In the course of our consideration of "A Speech for the President"

We have found that fear to be the most concrete of the elements that the world today is dedicated to the use, or threat of use, of arms as a method of obtaining national security.

We have found that the element of arms is the element which turns problems which could be solved into problems which cannot be solved.

We have found that, if the nations of the world would accept it, the proposal contained in "A Speech for the President"

We have found that this proposal is in itself the key cure for all our troubles. We have found that no method of procedure which does not include this basic treatment can possibly produce a cure.

We have found that this proposal is the equal bargain, equally moved from both appeasement and threat.

We have found that no one can predict how other nations would react to it, but we have also found that there is a possible method, again without appeasement and without threat, for dealing with the question of a possible hold-out nation.

Now we must ask ourselves what America has to lose or gain from a decision to make "A Speech for the President" its own functioning foreign policy.

It is difficult to conceive of any risk or loss involved. Such a foreign policy cannot be labeled appeasement, for it proposes that both we and Russia give up the same identical things.

The armed strength of a nation maintains represents the price that nation is willing to pay for peace and security.

We can pay that price to the god of war, and the bloody cost increasing beyond all expectations, with no assurance that, in the end, we have gained anything beyond the necessity of starting all over again.

We can spend our guns by shooting them off at other human beings. We can expend our manpower by pouring it into the grave. And find, once again, that the god of war is a chronic cheat.

Or we can take the price we are willing to pay for peace and security and expend it on guns for human life for human life, in a better kind of bargain. We can take the gun which would have mangled it and change their materials into something useful and not destructive. We can match one expendable human life against another, and get them both to the other. The question is what we shall get for it. What will we get when we swap in our military production?

Blood and death and then the words of new war? Or peace, signed, sealed, and delivered, paid in full? Which bargain represents the greater risk? The one bargain, unfortunately, we can always have.

of individuals legally permitted, anywhere in the world, to possess and use weapons of war.

Some of our readers have suggested one risk in the policy proposed by "A Speech for the President."

They fear that Russia would accept the proposal. They fear that a Communist would be more effective at spreading itself than a Communist armed.

They say, in effect, that we should not attempt to disarm Russia because then Communism will be stronger and even more successful at taking over other countries.

This view is, first, an internationalist's view of superior national strength on the part of Communism.

It is, second, a refusal to accept the disarmament of Russia during negotiation, but an implied willingness to seek that disarmament through the method of force.

There are no risks. There are no gains from our own willingness to propose such a policy is this:

That this nation shall finally have peace for itself, clean moral standard which will reduce its strength through whatever the future course of actual events may be.

That is certain gain, and of itself is priceless and worth, our every endeavor.

What other gains may be justified in the name of the policy proposed. Whatever other gains may be in it, we leave to the imagination and the logic of our readers. We have no other gains to offer.

We end these discussions as we began them with "A Speech for the President."

We completed the fighting, two and a half years ago, of a World War. The United States fought in that war against the forces of ruthless military aggression, against a ruthless moral degeneration and against a general infringement of the dignity of the individual man.

We fought for liberty among men, for a reign of law and justice. Our military battles were won. But nowhere have the issues we fought for been decided.

Today, it is also believed in quarters that battle tactics can win peace.

We have seen that this belief is not right. Daily the gut between us all and what we seek widens.

It is time for us to seek, by new approaches, that world reign of law and justice and peace which is the inevitable good goal of civilization.

I recommend, therefore, to the American Congress, to the American people, and to the world, the following policies:

1. That the United States and all other nations agree to withdraw all their troops from and abandonment of all military bases and concessions in foreign territories.

It should be obvious that, once the recourse of war among nations is laid aside, these same nations which are today so incapable of constructive relationships with one another will inevitably find progress toward a world improvement of economic and social conditions. We have no way of knowing how fruitful peace can be, unless we try it.

I am sure this is what God wants us to do on earth.
