McGrath Raps Plans Now Taking Shape For Religious Census Here

Plans are rapidly taking shape for the community wide religious census to be taken in Manchester on May 22 to 23 under the sponsorship of the Federal Council of Churches of Christ in America.

Portland, Ore., April 8.—(AP)—The Democratic party's national chairman declared last night that he believes Russia wants the fruits of war by use of terrorism in Europe.

In a Jefferson-Jackson centennial speech to a small Oregon audience Senator J. Howard McGrath of Rhode Island said, however, he did not believe a worldwide war is in the near future.

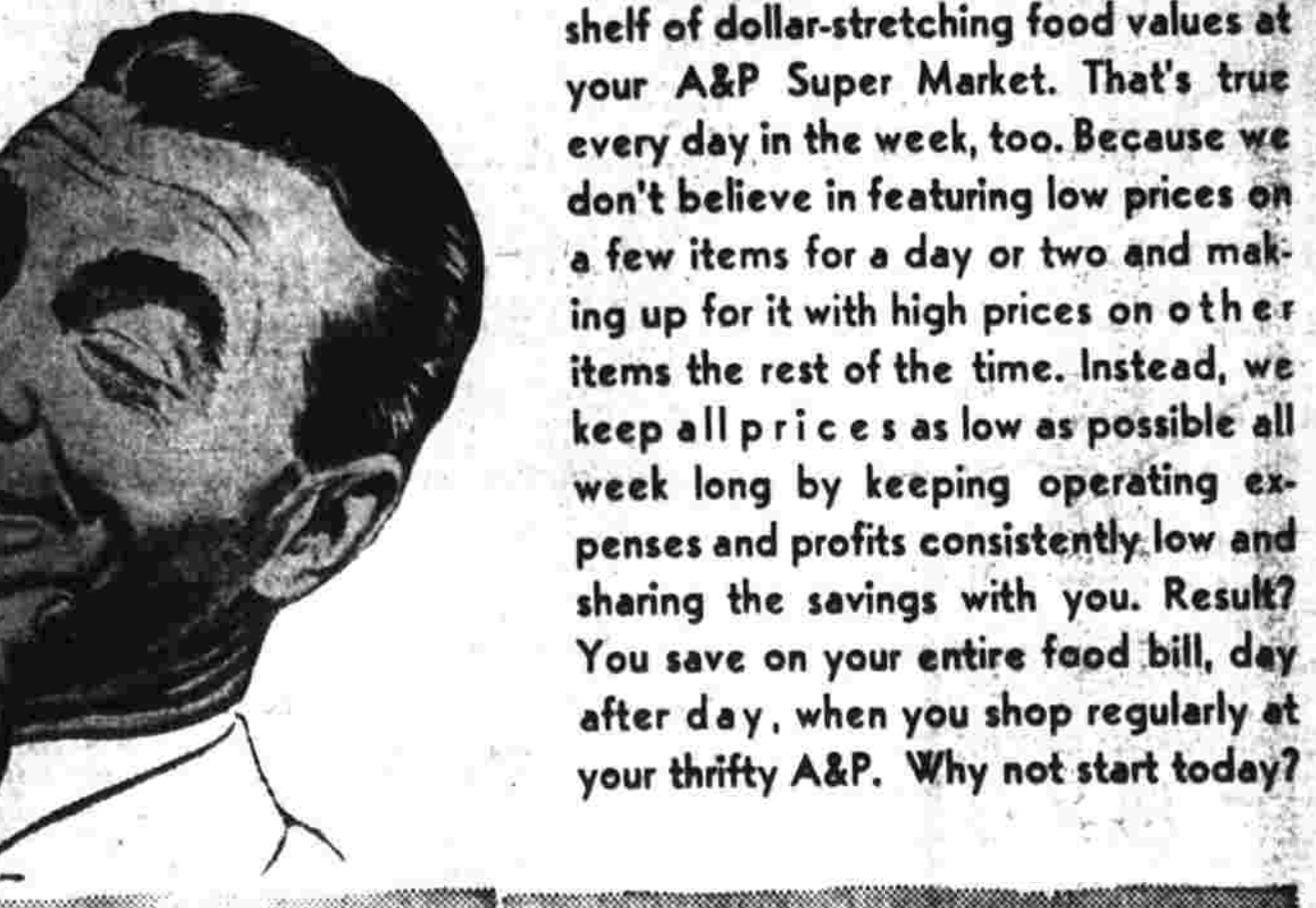
