\$50,000 Fire In Coventry

Hank Keene Home Is Destroyed and Two Firemen Are Injured

Fire of unexplained origin yesterday afternoon destroyed the Hank Keene home on South street, Coventry, with damage estimated by Keene at \$50,000. Only the shed, the building, erected in 1784 and extensively remodeled and restored since, was left. The 12 rooms, Keene and his mother, Mrs. Kate Newcombe said, contained some "antiques" and a newly delivered \$800 piano. The loss was partly covered by insurance.

Fire companies from Coventry, Willimantic, Eggleston, Andover and Bolton were called, but the efforts of all could not save the structure, so much had the fire gained headway.

Two firemen of the South Coventry department, John M. Stone, Jr. and Walter L. Tabor were cut by falling objects.

According to the report of the fire's origin, the blaze started in the kitchen and rapidly engulfed the home. Mrs. Keene had been in the kitchen and had momentarily gone out to welcome visitors Dr. and Mrs. Bernard Sheridan of Manchester, when they saw flames shooting out of the kitchen window.

Over 75 firemen plus neighbors, worked from 4:30 to 8 p. m. to keep the flames from spreading.

Resume Digging For Buried Man

Chelsea, Mass., May 3.—(AP)—With only the victim's wife still believing him alive, more than 100 men resumed digging operations today to reach a laborer entombed beneath Second street.

Efforts to reach Angelo Corvini, 33, buried in a cave-in while he was repairing a water main here last night, were halted temporarily at midnight last night after 27 hours of digging.

The workmen were hampered in their rescue efforts by shifting sand which filled in almost as fast as a huge power shovel could remove dirt. By midnight the cave had dug down only about 18 feet.

Metropolitan District Commissioner Edmund J. Connelley said the cave-in was caused by the shifting of an underground layer of wet sand which created a vacuum.
