Auto Exams Are Success

Report 18,670 Voluntary Inspections Made In Past Two Months

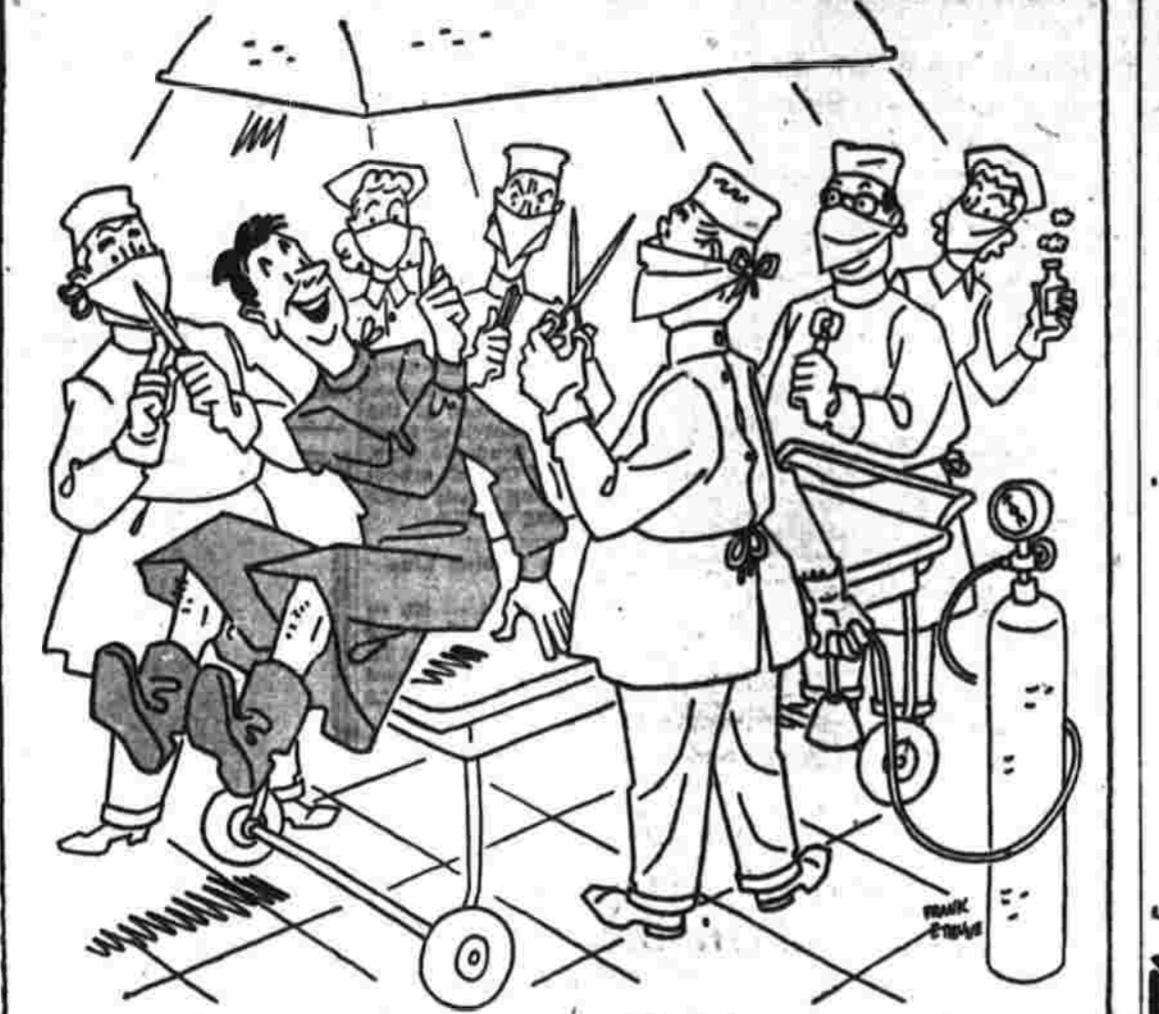
Hartford, May 15.—(Special)—State Motor Vehicle Commissioner Elmer S. Watson today reported that 18,670 automobiles were inspected and approved for safe operation during the initial two months of Connecticut's new voluntary inspection system.

The state official said that 9,309 cars passed inspection without repairs, while 9,361 required repairs to obtain Motor Vehicle Department approval stickers during March and April inspections. Defective headlights were the leading cause for repairs, 5,423 vehicles having this defect, the commissioner explained.

Second, third and fourth causes respectively were faulty brakes on 2,926, defective rear lights on 2,183 and defective steering apparatus on 2,002 cars. Commissioner Watson stated.

Hartford, May 14.—Trinity College will today begin the 125th anniversary of its chartering as Connecticut's second and New England's tenth college with formal academic exercises and a public open house this weekend.

The college is prepared to entertain several thousand guests at the Saturday afternoon Open House. Guided tours of the campus special exhibits, science shows, and continuous moving pictures are among special hospitality features planned for the Open House. (to which the entire state has been invited.)

Sunday morning, the college will mark a century and a quarter of informal cooperation with the Episcopal church at a Whit Sunday morning service in the college chapel at which a memorial window will be dedicated to the late President Thomas B. Ogden, who and coplanes founded Trinity, but in writing one of the most liberal charters of that day, provided that the college should be non-denominational.

Hartford, May 14.—State Finance Commissioner James B. Lowell reports that it cost \$245,088 to collect the \$20,079,610 realized from the 2 per cent sales tax during its nine months of existence. Remaining the cost, Lowell said that salaries accounted for \$171,346, contractual services, \$28,087, supplies and materials, \$35,655, office equipment, \$9,412, and motor vehicles, \$2,123.

Lowell said that the cost was "one of the lowest of any state having a sales tax," and pointed out that some states spend as much as 2.2 per cent of collections for administration costs. The percentage cost here was .76.

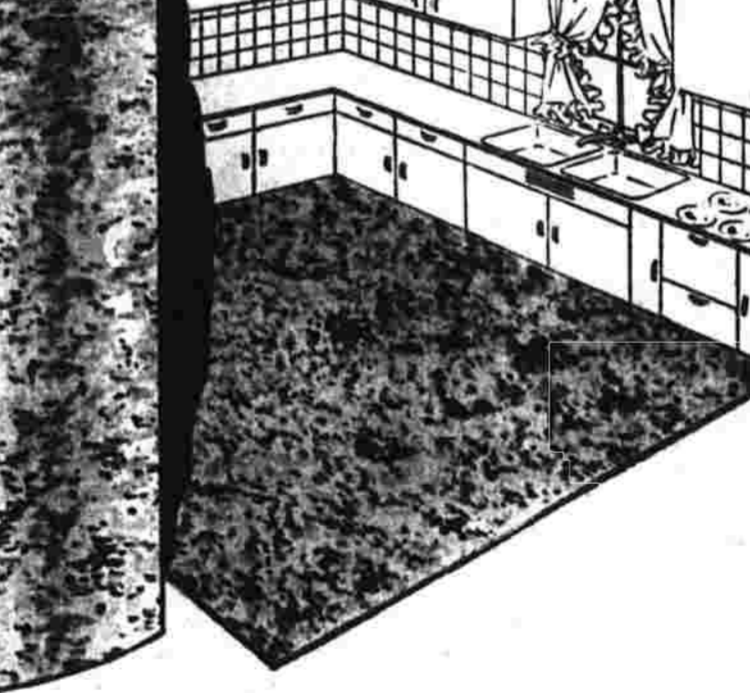
