Teachers Need Seen as Great

Many State Schools Rated as 'Sub Standard,' Educator Says

New Haven, May 27—There is more need for super-teachers in Connecticut than there is for super-highways says the Connecticut Conference for the Advancement of Education.

Edwin C. Miller of Naugatuck High school, reporting for his committee last night at the conference banquet here said Connecticut needs "super teachers" because many schools are rated "sub standard."

Miller said a panel discussion on financing education developed the recommendation that "in view of the increased burden of local taxation and its limitations, state aid be increased by the next session of the General Assembly."

The conference passed resolutions urging:

A five year training program for teachers; graduate scholarship aid for prospective teachers; a minimum salary of \$2,000 and a single salary schedule; a teacher exchange program with opportunities for sabbatical leave and professional work outside the classroom; and the opportunity for

Appeal to Be Heard in Fall

New Haven, May 27—(AP)—The Federal appeal from the United States court conviction for receiving political campaign funds from Internal Revenue Bureau subordinates, will not come up before the second circuit court in New York until late fall, it was reported here today.

U. S. Circuit Judge Charles E. Clark, who granted Kravetz's temporary extension yesterday of one week in which to complete the appeal, said the appellate court will recess for the summer about the second week of June. Resession of the higher court is scheduled to be resumed in October.

Judge Clark issued the temporary emergency delay yesterday, the 40-day deadline for an appeal in the absence in New York of Judge Carroll C. Hines.

Appeal to Be Based on "Error" Robert P. Butler, Kravetz's chief counsel, had asked for an extension to July 28, explaining in his motion that the appeal would be based on "error" both in the trial and on Judge Hines' charge to the jury.
